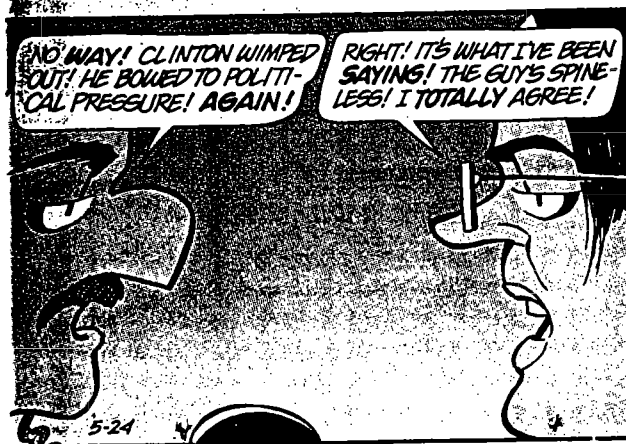

SUBJECT: Request for Documents

We have received a document request for records relating to the matters listed below. Accordingly, please conduct a thorough and complete search of all your records -- **whether in hard copy, computer form or any other form** -- for any of the material described below.

Every employee is responsible for searching his or her own files and records to ensure a comprehensive search. Each office head or Assistant to the President must certify that his or her staff has done a complete and thorough search.

In addition, if you believe that files from your office that have been sent to the Office of Records Management may contain responsive information, please advise us so that we may ensure that all responsive documents have been located.

Please provide all records referring or relating to the following:

1. The consolidated 1994 White House Holiday Card list that was returned to the White House by the DNC, including but not limited to a copy of all versions of the list, in whatever format, all records relating to any effort by the White House to obtain the return of the list, all records relating to the disposition of the list upon its return to the White House, and all records relating to the receipt of the list.
2. Any telecopy, including any telecopy transmittal sheet and any telecopy, sent by Truman Arnold to Sally Paxton in the Office of the White House Counsel between January 25, 1997 and February 14, 1997.
3. Any telecopy, including any telecopy transmittal sheet and any telecopy, sent from the White House Counsel's Office to the Democratic National Committee (DNC) between January 25, 1997 and February 14, 1997 relating to preparation of a statement by Truman Arnold on his use of or access to information at the White House.

4. All communications involving Truman Arnold, the White House or the DNC regarding:
 - a. press reports on or about January 29-31, 1996 of Mr. Arnold's statements made to reporters concerning access by the DNC (including its officers, employees, and agents) to information from the White House; or
 - b. the February 3, 1997 letter from White House Counsel Jack Quinn to the Subcommittee on National Economic Growth, Natural Resources, and Regulatory Affairs regarding the January 29-31 press reports about Mr. Arnold's statements.
5. Any lists that were sent to the White House from the Veteran's Department for the purpose of sending holiday greetings to families of service men and women who are missing in action.

All materials must be provided to Dimitri Nionakis (OEOB 479) or Sally Paxton (OEOB 148) by noon on June 30, 1998. If you have any questions or anticipate difficulty meeting this deadline, please call Dimitri Nionakis at 456-5814 or Sally Paxton at 456-5079.
