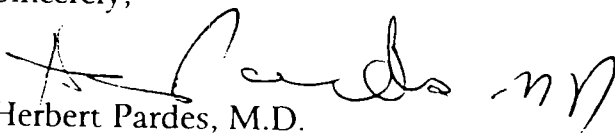
Dear President Clinton,
