- Transit** Due to the difficulty and expense of parking, we recommend carpooling, or taking a taxi or public transit. The Auditorium is directly on the California Street cable car line, and the other cable car lines stop two blocks away. Muni bus lines that take you within a block or two are the 1 and 27 (the 19 and 30 also stop within several blocks). You can connect from BART's Embarcadero Station to the Muni 1 line.
- Access** There is disability access to the building immediately to the right of the main stairway. All floors of the building are accessible by elevator and there are seating areas set aside for those with wheelchairs. A van will help people with limited mobility get to and from the Fairmont for lunch. Sign language interpreters will be provided throughout the conference.
- Report** An approximately 200-page report of the Summit's agenda, findings and recommendations will be given to you when you check in at the Auditorium. We are sorry, but we cannot distribute copies in advance.
- Security** There will be extensive security at the Summit. Time has been set aside for public comment, but *absolutely no disruptions or disrespect to the speakers will be tolerated.*
