Dear Senator Helms:

Thank you for your letter regarding the Conventional Armed Forces in
Europe (CFE)
Treaty.

I am committed to adapting CFE in a way that produces a sound
agreement. An
adapted treaty should reflect changes in the European security
environment since
Treaty signature in 1990, while fully protecting U.S. and alliance
security
interests.

You have expressed concern that the Administration might make a last-minute push to conclude an adapted CFE Treaty prior to the Washington summit. Let me reassure you about our intentions. At last September's Moscow Summit I set forth the goal of concluding an adapted CFE Treaty by the time of the 1999 OSCE summit, now scheduled for this coming November. In December, at the OSCE meeting of Foreign Ministers in Oslo, all CFE states adopted that goal, including Russia. The Ministers also recognized that if this goal were to be accomplished, Parties would need to try to resolve the key outstanding issues in the first months of this year. I want to emphasize that these are goals, not deadlines.

I also want to underscore that as the negotiations have progressed we have kept the Senate conditions adopted in the Resolution of Ratification to the 1996 Flank Agreement very much in mind and maintained a regular dialogue with your staff on these issues. For example, during our consultations on February 11, we briefed your staff on recent progress by Turkey and Russia in reaching an agreement in principle on the main elements that would apply to the flank area under an adapted treaty. We believe these elements, if complemented with a few additional understandings, could provide a basis for agreement among the thirty CFE states on this important issue in the negotiations and reinforce flank states' sovereignty and independence, particularly the New Independent States.

In parallel with the CFE negotiations, we have actively pursued the issue of Russian force withdrawals from Moldova. In December, with our strong support, all OSCE Foreign Ministers agreed on a number of steps that could facilitate resolution of this issue, including the elaboration within six months of an equipment withdrawal schedule. As part of our expanded threat reduction

assistance initiative, this year we have requested funding from the Congress that could help with the costs related to these withdrawals.

You have also raised concern about how CFE will affect our new NATO allies. NATO has proposed a treaty structure that will ensure the necessary military flexibility for an enlarged alliance. This flexibility cannot and will not be dependent on the availability of "headroom," but on agreement to provisions for temporarily exceeding territorial ceilings that will apply uniformly to all states outside the flank area. We have made clear in the negotiations these temporary deployments will not be used as a substitute for permanent stationing.

Finally, with respect to the ABM Treaty, as I stated in the certification I made under Condition (9) of the resolution of ratification of the CFE Flank Agreement, "I will submit to the Senate for advice and consent to ratification any international agreement...that would add one or more countries as States Parties to the ABM Treaty, or otherwise convert the ABM Treaty from a bilateral treaty to a multilateral treaty." Consistent with this certification, the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on ABM Treaty Succession, which was signed on September 26, 1997, will be provided to the Senate for its advice and consent. While I respect the fact that the MOU will not enter into force without the advice and consent of the Senate, there is no question the ABM Treaty has continued in force following the dissolution of the Soviet Union. If the Senate were to fail to approve the MOU, ambiguity would remain about the extent to which states other than Russia are Parties; however, the ABM Treaty would continue in force.

I look forward to staying in touch with you on these important issues.

^US official defends aid to Russian scientists

MOSCOW (Reuters) - In a research city in central Russia so secret

it appears on no map, nuclear scientists are now working for Intel, designing computer software for the next generation of 3D video games.

Rose Gottemoeller, an assistant U.S. energy secretary, cited

the work on Wednesday as an example of the workings of a program that

came under attack this week in a U.S. congressional report.

The Initiative for Proliferation Prevention (IPP) and its

offshoot,
the Closed Cities Initiative (CSI), are aimed at
helping find new
jobs for 35,000-50,000 of the top scientists in
Russia's million-strong
corps of nuclear workers.
The plan is to keep the scientists
from falling into the
arms of so-called rogue states, who might
bid for their skills
to develop new weapons of mass destruction.

But the General Accounting Office (GAO), an investigative
arm
of Congress, concluded in a report this week that much of
the money
was being wasted, and some of it may have been going
to scientists
who are still developing weapons for Moscow.
Senator Jesse
Helms, head of the Foreign Relations
Committee, issued an angry
attack in the report's wake.
"It is absolutely unacceptable
for the Clinton
administration to donate the U.S. taxpayer's money
to Russian
scientists who spend their time working on poison gas,
biological
agents and new nuclear weapons designs for the
Russian government.
That must stop," Helms' statement said.
But in an interview
Wednesday after she was grilled by
reporters at a news conference
over the charges, Gottemoeller
said critics were focusing too much
on administrative questions,
and not enough on whether the programs
fulfilled their aims.
"I really want to underscore the base-line
conclusion of
the GAO report, and that is that this program has
been
extraordinarily valuable in ensuring that weapons scientists
stay
at home and work in their institutes and are not running
off to
countries that are proliferation concerns," she said.
"It

is an important program and ultimately successful."

Intel,
which has hired scientists at a super-secret weapons
research complex
in the closed city of Sarov to develop computer
software for realistic
three-dimensional graphics and other
applications, is just one satisfied
customer.

"I just tear out my hair when people say this is
not a
successful program, because Intel got started in Sarov thanks
to
the IPP program and now they have got to the point where they
are
ready to move from about 65 (software) programmers to about
200,"

Gottemoeller said.

She said she did not believe any U.S. aid
money was going to
Russian scientists developing new weapons programs,
although
some might have gone to scientists involved in maintaining
the
security and safety of Russia's existing arsenal.

But
she said the Energy Department would implement GAO
recommendations
that it tighten procedures for approving
projects.

The GAO
also accused the Energy Department of spending more
than half of
its budget on U.S. laboratories engaged in
evaluating the Russian
projects.

Gottemoeller said steps were being taken to increase
spending
within Russia.

* Point of this meeting is tell you more about the Executive Order on Implementation of Human Rights Treaties in the United States signed by the

Since then, I have been valiantly holding the outer perimeter of our defenses on this issue, waiting for the State/L cavalry to arrive to reinforce my lonely position. To be informed now -- at this excruciatingly late date -- that (a) State needs to first figure out how this relates to the merger (not due for many moons (oops, weeks) yet to come, and (b) then they can get down to business here is, excuse my primal screaming, "singularly uncomfortable". Is it really the case that at State/L they are not only not at Square One, but that there must be a process/discussions/decisions/whatever to even get to Square One? Is it really possible --leaving aside the NSC request for this analysis - that certain folks on the Hill and in conservative think tanks have been parading John Norton Moore and Doug Feith and other conservative legal illuminaries around for over half a year trumpeting their claim and no one -- not a soul -- within the upper reaches or even middle reaches of the Department of State has said -- say at a staff meeting -- or written down a note to be sent to L -- "hey, what are we saying about this?"
