Regarding the word "promptly" ... we now have a letter from Jesse Helms to the President requesting his views on yet another legal brief holding that the ABM Treaty is no longer in force (done by Doug Feith and George Miron). Moreover, Gaffney and others continue to pound us on the issue, noting it (i.e., the fact the ABM Treaty is no longer in force) as yet another reason why Senators should vote in favor of the Cochran NMD bill next week. Meanwhile, yours truly and his immediate superior are out on the hustings on the ABM debate, unarmed

to defend the Administration's position on this vital point (other than to say, "our lawyers say it isn't so," which has always been comforting to me but doesn't necessarily go down well at the Heritage Foundation and CATO). In short, we really need State to produce points that we can use to "push back" on why we believe the ABM Treaty is still in force today. Can you please check to find out what, exactly, Matheson's definition of the phrase "promptly" is, and see if it can coincide with "early next week."

#2: Caroline: I don't want to be in a "shoot the messenger" mode here (especially since the messenger has only recently joined our distinguished legal brain trust) but..... (why is there always a "but"?). but the original Heritage Foundation study claiming "no treaty exists" was issued (with some fanfare in certain media), like last summer, and we asked State/L to pull together an impeccable rebuttal argument at that time (months before we even knew Congress was going to slip the merger bill into the final Congressional legislative flurry in October). Lo, many moons ago (actually many months ago) I was quoted -- on the record -- as saying that "inter-agency lawyers find the Heritage Foundation's line of argument singularly unimpressive" and have told others, on background, that it "makes

the Sofaer reinterpretation seem brilliantly reasoned by comparison." Since then, I have been valiantly holding the outer perimeter of our defenses on this issue, waiting for the State/L cavalry to arrive to reinforce my lonely position. To be informed now -- at this excruciatingly late date -- that (a) State needs to first figure out how this relates to the merger (not due for many moons (oops, weeks) yet to come, and (b) then they can get down to business here is, excuse my primal screaming, "singularly uncomfortable". Is it really the case that at State/L they are not only not at Square One, but that there must be a process/discussions/decisions/whatever to even get to Square One? Is it really possible --leaving aside the NSC request for this analysis - that certain folks on the Hill and in conservative think tanks have been parading John Norton Moore and Doug Feith and other conservative legal illuminaries around for over half a year trumpeting their claim and no one -- not a soul -- within the upper reaches or even middle reaches of the Department of State has said -- say at a staff meeting -- or written down a note to be sent to L -- "hey, what are we saying about this?"

ago, we also provided State/L, via the recently departed Newell, with a copy of the infamous Heritage Foundation brief that makes the case that the ABM Treaty died with the dissolution of the USSR. State/L was tasked with putting together a legal rebuttal, which, to my knowledge, we have yet to see. In short, sooner rather than later, we are going to need to be able to say more than just "we disagree" when confronted by the Heritage Foundation brief (i.e., a legal rebuttal of our own), so that we can push back and try and keep this idea from taking "root" with a majority of Republicans

Purpose

To respond to a letter from Senator Helms and 28 other senators about Executive Order 13107 relating to the implementation of human rights treaties.

#### Background

On Human Rights Day, you signed an Executive Order that reaffirms our commitment to the implementation of our human rights treaty obligations and enhances our ability to ensure that such obligations are carried out. Senator Helms and 28 others wrote to inform you that they have received a "deluge" of phone calls from citizens expressing concern that it is the intent of this Order is to circumvent the Senate's role in the ratification process. (We have received a significant amount of positive response to the Order as well.) The Senators ask you to confirm several points relating to the Order and to provide a list of the human rights treaties covered by the Order.

Your response confirms each of the points raised by the letter. It reassures the Senators that the EO does not authorize the circumvention of the Senate's role in the ratification process.

It is my understanding that changes of this type could be made either with the Senate's advice and consent or by some other recognized constitutional method, such as legislation enacted by the Congress as whole.

I hope this information allays any concerns that you or your constituents may have about this Order. Please let me know if you need further clarification on these or other points.

Thank you for your letter supporting the APEC sectoral initiative on forest products, and expressing concern about Japan's position throughout the APEC negotiations on this issue.

As you may be aware, the meeting in Malaysia last November resulted in agreement to send a proposal for tariff cuts in all of the eight sectors under consideration, including forest products, to the World Trade Organization (WTO) with the aim of concluding an agreement in 1999. This initiative will allow us to broaden participation beyond the APEC economies and to bind and enforce tariffs in the WTO. While there are many obstacles to achieving this objective, we will be pushing hard to achieve it. We will also continue to work hard to pare down excessive requests for product reservations in forest products, as well as other sectors, in the new context?? of the WTO negotiations. (what does new context mean? new WTO negotiations?)

While the position taken by Japan throughout the sectoral liberalization exercise was very disappointing, we will press them hard this year to live up to the obligation they, along with other participating APEC economies, undertook in November to work constructively to conclude an agreement encompassing all eight sectors in 1999. I plan to discuss this issue with Prime Minister Obuchi when he visits here in May.

We fully share the American forest and paper industry's objective of improved access to Asian markets and appreciate very much your interest in, and support

for, our efforts to advance that objective through sectoral liberalization. We look forward to a continued close working relationship with you and the forest products industry as this initiative moves forward.
