Dear President Clinton:

I feel I had the opportunity of a lifetime when Mrs. Sharma and I had the chance to speak with you in Pittsburgh while you were here on behalf of Congressman Klink's Senate campaign. You asked me to send you information in regard to our conversation, and your aide gave me Ms. Lay's address. I thank you in advance for your valued time and assistance in helping our company and our employees to recover from the surge of unfairly traded imports and to continue to serve our customers and our community.

We do need your help. Riverview Steel is the only remaining active steel mill rolling reinforcing bar in the state of Pennsylvania. We have been killed with the overwhelming increase of imported rebar inundating the eastern half of the country over the past two years. Our mill was designed to produce rebar in the smaller diameters and in lengths from 20 - 40 feet. Production and employment had been good for the ten years prior to this influx of imports priced at levels below costs. Unfortunately our only product is in the same size range that these cheap imports have hit the hardest.

Now relief is in sight. We joined other U.S. rebar producers in forming the Rebar Trade Action Coalition and filed dumping petitions against imports. With the ITC's preliminary finding of injury from dumping by eight countries, current arrivals of new bar are thought to have slowed and new bookings appear to be down. If dumping duties are imposed, there is hope for the return of sanity to the rebar marketplace. Dumping relief, however, could come too late for our mill and our employees. We need help now in order to survive and be ready for our customers' construction needs in the spring.

We have been trying to obtain funding to allow us to expand our product line to include items less affected by these import prices and volumes. We hoped that the Emergency Steel Loan Guarantee Program that you supported would help us achieve this change. With the depressed pricing situation and no relief in sight during the filing period, however, we were unable to procure the financing commitment in time to meet the Board's imposed deadline.

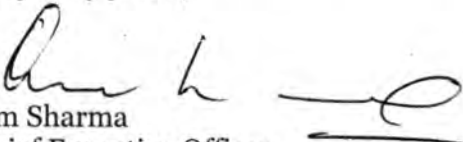
Our mill has been shut down for seven weeks. We have not given up. With the backing of Congressmen Doyle, Klink, Murtha and other members of the Congressional Steel Caucus, we have been seeking a reopening of the Emergency Steel Loan Guarantee application process. To date, loan

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guarantees have been approved for only about half of the total authorized amount. With a simple change to its own regulations, it would seem to me that the Board could allow smaller mills such as ours, that have been devastated by the imports, to have the chance not only to rebound but also to grow and prosper. We, our employees, and the town of Glassport in which we are the second largest employer, are asking you to help us get that chance.

Mr. President, we will appreciate your help in finding the means to an emergency grant/loan allowing us to restart the mill and to restore these good jobs for the working families in Glassport.

Dear Mr. Dittus:

We are writing to ask you to accept an application from LaSalle Bank, who is the lender for Riverview Steel Corporation of Glassport, Pennsylvania, in your selection for the emergency steel guarantee loan program. We understand that the original deadline has passed, but the Department of Commerce has extended the date to August 15, 2000 for current applicants to amend their forms and submit supplementary materials. We are hopeful that during this time you will also accept a new applicant, Riverview Steel.

Although Riverview Steel had completed its application in a timely manner, it had difficulty finding a lender. It is a comparatively small company and did not have access to the same capital as larger companies. Despite these difficulties, Riverview Steel was able to secure a lender by the second week of March. Unfortunately, by this time the deadline for applications had expired.

Before the massive steel dumping of the past two and a half years, Riverview Steel had employed 60 people in the area and was an integral part of the local economy. It is now struggling to stay afloat financially and has had major cutbacks in production as well as in employment. Riverview Steel is the quintessential example of the company for which the Emergency Steel Guarantee Loan Act was created. It would be of great importance to the area for the emergency steel guarantee loan board to include Riverview Steel as an applicant, and we ask it receive your every consideration.

We thank you in advance for your attention to this matter.

Dear Congressman Doyle and Congressman Klink:

This responds to your letter dated August 1, 2000 on behalf of Riverview Steel Corporation of Glassport, Pennsylvania. We very much appreciate your interest in the Emergency Steel Loan Guarantee Program, and understand your concern with respect to Riverview Steel.

Unfortunately, we cannot accept any new applications at this time. The Board established a February 28, 2000 deadline for receipt of applications under its regulations at 13 CFR Part 400. Unless and until the Board amends Section 400.205(a) of the regulations, no additional applications can be accepted.

The Board approved several of the applications for loan guarantees that were received in accordance with the regulations, and has given the remaining pending applicants until August 15th to submit amendments and additional material. The Board intends to take final action on the pending applications by the end of this fiscal year. Once that has been accomplished, the Board will consider whether a second window should be established for the receipt of applications. We will communicate your request on behalf of Riverview Steel to the members of the Board. If you have any questions, please contact me at 202-219-0584 or Marguerite S. We are writing to urge you to initiate a second round of emergency steel loan guarantee applications. As you are well aware, the steel import crisis, which began in 1998, has had devastating effects on steel producers and steel workers around the country.

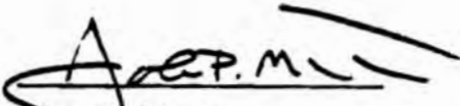
In 1998, more than 40 million tons of steel were imported into the U.S. Many of these imports came from producers in countries that were experiencing financial crises and whose governments subsidized their steel production, allowing them to sell at below cost-of-production prices.

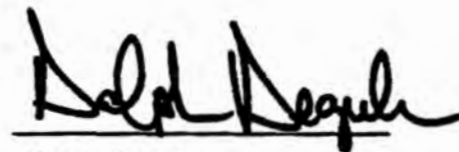
Created in response to these adverse developments, the loan guarantee program provides assistance to American companies that were having difficulty securing financing in the private market. These loan guarantees are necessary to allow affected steel companies to continue to make the needed capital investments to keep them competitive in the world market and to protect American steelworker jobs.

The Emergency Steel Loan Guarantee Act of 1999 states that the "aggregate amount of loans guaranteed and outstanding at any one time under [Section 101(f)(2)] may not exceed \$1,000,000,000." It is our understanding that the Commerce Department has received applications totaling \$901 million to date. Since there remains nearly \$100 million of authorized guarantees and since imports levels have remained above historic levels in 1999 and 2000, we believe that it makes sound economic sense to have a second round of applications and make available the full authorized amount of loan guarantees to those companies that meet the criteria of the law.

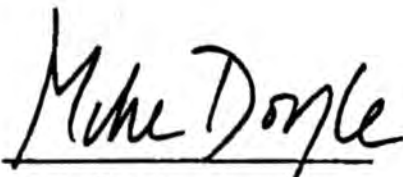
The loan guarantees will offer significant rewards in terms of recovered jobs and resurrected local economies, and these loans are necessary to bridge the gap between now and when fair trade is restored in the marketplace. We thank you for your consideration in this important matter.

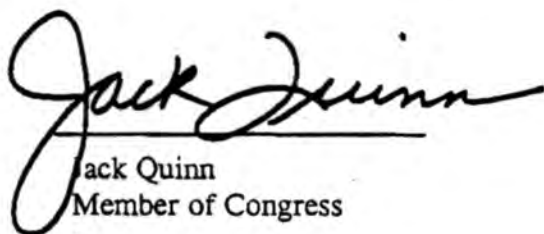

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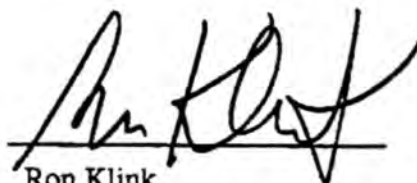

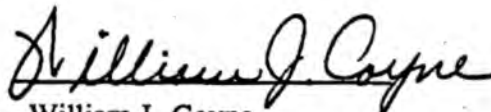

Re: Request for Additional Application Period

Dear Mr. Dittus:

Riverview Steel Corporation respectfully requests that the Emergency Steel Guarantee Loan Board open an additional application period this year for loans to small steel companies under the Emergency Steel Loan Guarantee Act of 1999.

Riverview Steel Corporation operates a steel mill in Glassport, Pennsylvania, approximately 15 miles south of Pittsburgh. We roll billets into various sizes of reinforcing bars for the construction industry. We have 59 employees. Our hourly manufacturing employees are members of the United Steelworkers of America Local 14693, and we recently concluded a five-year Collective Bargaining Agreement with them.

Obtaining a guarantee under the Loan Guarantee Act is crucial to the future of our company. Riverview's strategic business plan, designed to increase our competitiveness, provides for improvements to our rolling mill and reheat furnace. Both improvements are critical and necessary in order for us to compete with foreign pricing today – the birthreason for the legislation. These capital improvements will enable us to increase the reheat furnace capacity, enhance our cooling bed capabilities, increase the capacity of our barge loading facilities, and automate our rebar bundling equipment. It will allow us to diversify our product mix to include merchant bars and rebar in longer, 60-foot lengths.

Riverview Steel cannot implement this plan without assistance under the Loan Guarantee Act. Despite numerous attempts, Riverview has been unable to obtain financing, and thus turned to the Loan Guarantee program. Unfortunately, Riverview was unable to find a lender to partner with until after the February 28, 2000 application deadline, despite working diligently to do so. After the loan application deadline, Riverview did find a lender and immediately informed the Board of our interest in

applying for a loan. Thus, although Riverview meets all of the criteria to qualify under the program, and is in great need of such funding, it is presently barred from submitting its application.

Given the continuing harmful impact that imports are having on Riverview, and the fact that the Board has not received or approved applications for the full amount of authorized loan guarantees, we request that the Board accept additional applications from qualified steel companies who were unable to meet the earlier deadline. In particular, we believe that the Board should allow a second application window for small steel companies, such as Riverview, that have a demonstrated need for a loan guarantee and are seeking loans for relatively small amounts.

To date we understand that the Board has approved only four applications totaling \$365 million in loan guarantees and yet the law allows for the total amount of loans guaranteed to \$1 billion. Therefore, hundreds of millions of dollars should still be available under the Loan Guarantee program.

Certainly, another application window would benefit not only us but also others which the Loan Guarantee Act was designed to assist. The present rebar market is a good example of this. The import crisis which prompted Congress to pass the Loan Guarantee Act is still hurting Riverview and many other steel companies. The dramatic surge of unfairly traded rebar imports into the United States led Riverview to join a coalition of U.S. rebar producers, the Rebar Trade Action Coalition. The Coalition filed antidumping petitions against twelve countries on June 28, 2000 and just this week received a favorable ITC ruling against eight of these countries. There is no doubt that these dumped imports have killed us, and now Riverview is fighting along with others to protect its market from this unfair import competition. We need the government's help, not just in enforcing the trade laws, but also in working with us to fulfill the intent of the Loan Guarantee program.

Finally, the Loan Guarantee Act does not prohibit the Board from instituting an additional application period. Congress did not specify a deadline for applications or require the Board to set such a deadline. Instead, the Board exercised its discretion in establishing the February 28, 2000 deadline in its regulations. We request that the Board amend its regulations to allow additional applications.

Accordingly, we respectfully request that if loan guarantee funds are available following the processing of the first group of applications, the Board immediately institute an additional application period for small steel companies like us that could not find a lender before the initial deadline. Such an extension would not disadvantage any

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steel companies that met the earlier deadline, but would simply ensure that small steel companies with a demonstrated need for the funds will have the opportunity to apply.

Dear President Clinton,

I am writing you to tell you about a tremendous success in the American health care system, and in American labor-management relations. This event is so important and so unusual that I would like to ask you to write a letter and send it to each of the more than 250 individual union officials and management representatives who made it happen. Secretary of Labor Herman is providing certificates of appreciation for all bargaining participants. A letter from you would, however, provide the special recognition that the effort and the results deserve, and would be treasured by the participants.

To summarize, Kaiser Permanente and its 26 local unions affiliated with the AFL-CIO recently successfully concluded perhaps the largest, most complex, collaborative bargaining effort in U.S. history. Moreover, the innovative agreement that was created should begin to transform the delivery of health care for people receiving care from Kaiser Permanente, and will be a model for other health care organizations.

Kaiser Permanente has been in operation for more than 55 years as a not-for-profit integrated health care provider serving 8.1 members in 11 states and the District of Columbia. In 1997, Kaiser Permanente and 26 local union affiliates of the AFL-CIO, with consulting support from and facilitation provided by me and my firm, signed a national labor-management partnership agreement with the joint goals of enhancing the quality of health care and service provided by the HMO, and improving the work lives of its employees. The unions represent about two-thirds of Kaiser Permanente's 90,000 plus employees, making it the largest unionized health care provider in the U.S.

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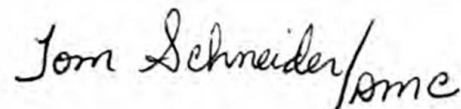
Under the guidance of my firm, in the spring of this year, Kaiser Permanente and 25 of the 26 partner union locals launched a voluntary, national collective bargaining process based on issues of mutual concern. Both my firm, Restructuring Associates Inc., and some FMCS mediators served actively as interest-based negotiation process trainers and facilitators for the bargaining process. The effort resulted in the successful negotiation of 33 separate contracts without labor strife or strike threats. Also unique was the highly participatory nature of the process involving more than 250 union staff, Kaiser Permanente union employees, and management representatives from throughout the organization. Bargaining concluded in September with a national agreement that has been ratified by members of all participating unions with an aggregate of over 90 percent affirmative votes.

The national agreement was announced at a news briefing in Washington, D.C. on September 26. Among those addressing the media were Ed Montgomery, Deputy Secretary, Department of Labor, speaking on behalf of Secretary Herman, Richard Barnes, Director of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service, John Sweeney, President of the AFL-CIO, David Lawrence, MD, Chairman and CEO, Kaiser Foundation Health Plan, and three Kaiser Permanente union employees who participated in the bargaining effort, among others.

I realize that the request for these letters is on short notice, but I would greatly appreciate your sending the letters. I believe that the events described here merit the special recognition that a letter from you would convey. Thank you for your attention and assistance.

My prayers are with you in your efforts in the Middle East. Please give my best to Hillary. She is doing a great job, and trending extremely well!

House Passes Bill to Exempt Navy from Employment Discrimination Laws

Washington, October 6, 2000. The U.S. House of Representatives has passed a measure to exempt the U.S. Navy from compliance with the major Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) regulations. These regulations

—
29 C.F.R. 1614 and EEOC MD-110 – implement Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended.

This measure is hidden in the Department of Defense authorization bill for FY2001 (H.R. 4205; SECTION 1106 -see attached analysis. It provides for the creation of a so-called "Pilot Program" to establish a Navy program for handling employment discrimination complaints that would take the place of existing EEOC procedures. There are several aspects of the Pilot Program that would deny complainants the rights they now have under the existing EEOC procedure.

** Though the Pilot Program is voluntary for discrimination complainants, there will be heavy pressure for all complainants to use it. Those who do will be required to sign an agreement waiving their rights to remain anonymous, to request an EEOC hearing before an Administrative Judge, and to opt out of the Pilot Program.

** In the Pilot Program, Navy officials will control all of the evidence and other materials of the complaints. If the Navy finds against a complainant and the complainant appeals the decision to the EEOC, the file is quite likely to be heavily biased in favor of the Navy.

** Under the Pilot Program, EEOC can not reverse a final agency decision of the Navy on the basis that the agency did not comply with regulatory requirements of the EEOC and 29 C.F.R. 1614. Under existing procedures, EEOC has regulatory authority over the Navy in two circumstances: (1) EEOC can rule on the merits of the case, and (2) EEOC can investigate federal agencies with systemic patterns of discrimination under 29 C.F.R. 1614 and EEOC directives and for failure to comply with the

EEOC

process. This negates the principle on which EEOC is based: it is an independent enforcement agency established to provide fair and objective decisions.

** In 1998 alone, there were 1,447 employment discrimination complaints filed against the U.S. Navy, distinguishing the agency as one of the worst offenders in the entire federal government. If the Navy is able to get this legislation passed, other agencies with bad records of employment discrimination will be encouraged to seek exemption from established employment discrimination laws and their implementing regulations.

H.R. 4205 has already passed the House, but did the Members of House know that this measure was hidden in this huge appropriations measure? Do they really understand what they voted for?

The Navy has long sought to exempt itself from the EEOC regulations – and from the law itself. Unless the U.S. Senate deletes this provision from the FY2001 Defense appropriation, Congress will have approved the Navy's pattern and practice of rampant employment discrimination, a major setback for the quest of minority employees to be free from official discrimination by their government.

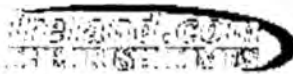

There would also be a knock on effect on the existing Police Authority, which makes way formally for the new Policing Board in March.

The Alliance leader, Mr Sean Neeson, and the Liberal Democrats are adding to pressure on Mr Mandelson to make further concessions on the powers of the new Policing Board, particularly in relation to financial control. However, informed sources say the Lib Dems will do nothing to endanger Mr Mandelson's Bill.

Despite his suggestion in a Daily Telegraph article last week that he intended to do so, British and Irish sources confirmed that the First Minister, Mr David Trimble, has not reopened the issue of the retention of the RUC name. However, Mr Mallon is believed to be under pressure not to press for an amendment - similar to that withdrawn by Mr Mandelson on July 11th - defining all the "operational purposes" of the newly-titled Police Service of Northern Ireland. Tensions between Mr Mallon and Dublin on this issue are believed to be rooted in the suspicion that, during the May 5th Hillsborough negotiations, the Taoiseach, Mr Ahern, "gave the nod" to the unionist amendment, subsequently accepted by Mr Mandelson, incorporating the RUC in the so-called title deeds of the new service.

There are reports that Mr Ahern is urging the SDLP and Sinn Féin to accept the present Bill, with further modest modifications, on the promise of a review of the overall implementation of the Patten proposals within a year. Such a review would revisit the vexed question of the continuing powers of the British Secretary of State in relation to those of the Policing Board. In that context there is speculation that Mr Mandelson might shortly spell out his thinking on a possible timetable for the devolution of limited police powers to the Northern Ireland Assembly.

However, in line with Patten, all "national security" issues will remain reserved to Westminster, and British sources say there is no question of the Secretary of State's powers being ceded to a combination of the Policing Board, the Police Ombudsman and the Oversight Commissioner.

The macroeconomic effects of IT on development are harder to assess, but one study found that each 10 percent increase in telephone lines per worker was associated with a 1.4 percent increase in per capita income. 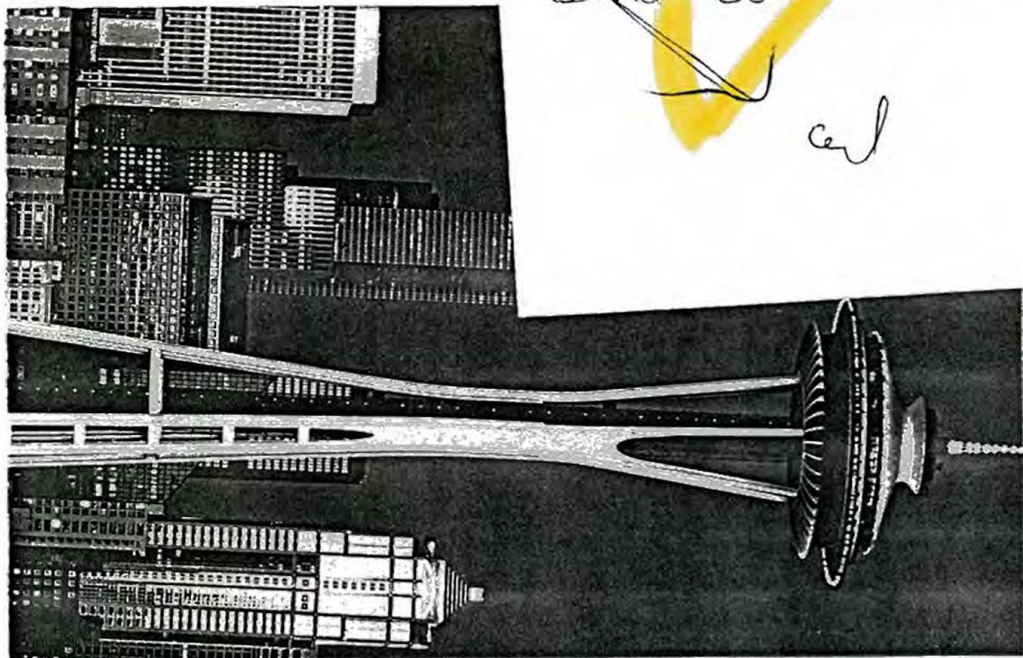

Changing of Guard at Washington Monthly

The question has long been served on the canapé trays circulating in Washington cocktail parties and journalistic confabulations: when will Charles Peters, founder of The Washington Monthly and neoliberal godfather to legions of journalists, retire from his position as editor in chief — and grandfatherly but cranky mentor?

Mr. Peters, who founded the magazine in 1969 and has edited it since, is stepping down in January. The new editor will be Paul D. Glastris, a speechwriter in the Clinton White House and a former correspondent and editor for U.S. News & World Report, Mr. Peters said. He added that time alone, not ideological fatigue, had forced his hand.

"I am going to be 74 years old in December, and as much as you hate to face it, you have to make sensible provisions for an institution you love," he said.

The Washington Monthly has been considered a proving ground for a certain type of political minded and ambitious young journalist. When he founded the magazine, Mr. Peters, who had just finished seven years in the Peace Corps, instituted a program that called for young writers to work for positively puny wages. Their reward: the chance to write for a political magazine with a small circulation (now about 21,000) but considerable influence.

"We basically invited them in and then killed them for two years for absolutely no money," Mr. Peters said. Alumni include Taylor Branch, the Pulitzer Prize-winning author; James Fallows; Michael Kinsley; Gregg Easterbrook of The New Republic; Suzannah Lessard of The New Yorker; Jonathan Alter and Jon Meacham of Newsweek; and several reporters for The New York Times.

The annual salary is still \$12,000, Mr. Peters said, a level it has hovered at for about a decade. "We started out with regular salaries but quickly realized that The Monthly would never be able to survive," Mr. Peters said. "So I decided to apply the Peace Corps principle."

Nicholas Lemann, a writer for The New Yorker and an alumnus, is also involved in the post-Peters Washington Monthly. He has overseen the magazine's application to the Internal Revenue Service to transform itself into a nonprofit organization; if it was successful, Mr. Lemann would act as chairman of a board of directors while continuing to write for The

New Yorker. Mr. Lemann said that once the new status was in place, he would approach foundations for grants. (Currently, Mr. Peters owns the controlling stock in The Washington Monthly; other investors include the billionaire Warren E. Buffett and Senator John D. Rockefeller IV, Democrat of West Virginia.)

Mr. Glastris, who is 41, said he had no plan to change the magazine. "I call The Monthly solution-oriented journalism," Mr. Glastris said. "Reporters are relentless seekers-out of problems. And they will turn over every stone and shake down every source to find out what the next problem is. But the spirit of The Monthly has always been to use those same talents to seek out potential solutions. And I sort of think it is pretty darn good as it is."

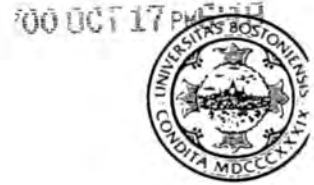
