SUBJECT: 2000 Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers

- I. ACTION-FORCING EVENT: The fourth annual award of the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers.
- II. BACKGROUND: The Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers was established by Presidential directive February 1, 1996. The award was created to recognize and honor outstanding scientists and engineers at the outset of their independent research careers. The Presidential award recipients are expected to broadly advance science while contributing significantly to the missions of nine departments and agencies, namely the Departments of Agriculture, Commerce, Defense, Energy, Health and Human Services, and Veterans Affairs, the Environmental Protection Agency, National Aeronautics and Space Administration, and National Science Foundation. This award replaces the Presidential Faculty Fellows program, which were nominated solely by the National Science Foundation.

No more than sixty awards, divided amongst the nine departments and agencies, will be given every year. The award nominations are chosen by the agencies and forwarded to the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy. The award recipients will receive substantial research support from their nominating agency over a five-year period.

I am forwarding the award nominees for your review and approval to receive the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers. The requisite name checks on the nominees have been completed.

- III. RECOMMENDATION: Approve the attached 59 nominees for the 2000 Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers.

Request for Approval of Presidential Awards for Federal Energy
Management Success to be awarded on October 20, 2000

Section 306 (a) (2) of Executive Order 13123, *Greening of the Government Through Efficient Energy Management* requires the Deputy Director for Management of OMB to "select outstanding agency energy management team(s), from among candidates nominated by DOE, for a new annual Presidential award for energy efficiency." John Podesta, the Director and I will present the awards at an event in Room 450 on Friday, October 20, 2000. The purpose of this memorandum is to request your approval of the winners.

DISCUSSION

For this first year, OMB worked with the Department of Energy to solicit nominations from agencies for a Presidential energy efficiency team award. Nominations were first submitted in March 2000. A second request was sent in August for additional nominations. Nominations were also received from the Department of Energy's Federal Energy Management Program Director. OMB staff judged the nominations received and made recommendations to me. Each winning team and their participants will receive a Presidential citation.

RECOMMENDATION

As required by the Executive Order, I have selected the following four agency teams to win the 2000 Presidential Awards for Energy Management Success. Attached to this memo is a list of the individual participants for each team.

- **Implementation:** The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Architecture, Engineering and Real Estate Branch conceived and developed the Laboratories for the 21st Century (Labs21) program to implement energy efficient design, construction and operation of public and private sector laboratories.
- **Institutionalization:** The State Department's Energy Committee of the Office of Foreign Buildings Operations has effectively institutionalized energy efficiency strategies and practices into its embassies worldwide.

- **Outreach:** The Department of the Interior partnered with the Department of Energy to launch the Green Energy Parks program. Together, they are making the National Parks a showcase for a sustainable energy future from which other Federal agencies, as well as the more than 260 million visitors to the National Park System, can learn about energy efficiency.
- **Results:** During FY 1999, the US Army Energy Team helped the Army to reduce facility energy usage by 1.4 percent per unit area from FY 1998 levels for energy savings of one trillion BTUs. Actual utility savings were \$31 million, or a four percent reduction from 1998

Dear Mr. President:

It was a pleasure as always to see you at the O'Keefe/Williams fundraiser at the Sewall-Belmont House. Nancy was thrilled have you visit the house, and we were both most honored to be mentioned in your remarks.

I was also pleased to have a few moments to talk to you about the situation in Northern Ireland. Your continued attention to the peace process there, regardless of what else may be competing for your attention, has always been a source of admiration and gratitude for those of use who first advocated your involvement in this issue. We would not have come as far as we have except for your careful and skillful interventions and decisions. We will not move forward this fall without your help.

You asked that I send you a few suggestions about what might be done. They follow:

1. Seek to help end the violence among Loyalist paramilitaries. The brutal violence in the community over the past few months is very dangerous. It has been accompanied by sectarian harassment that could spill over into intercommunity violence very easily. While some have been quick to identify what's going on as merely a turf fight over drug and protection rackets, there is a deeper cause. Loyalist paramilitaries come from the deprived Protestant communities, which have long been the cannon fodder for Ian Paisley's bigoted rhetoric. They have long been sustained in their militancy by assurance of Protestant and British hegemony in Northern Ireland. With that condition being swept away both by economic ascendancy of Catholics and political legitimacy of nationalism enshrined in the Good Friday Agreement, a combination of anger, perceived betrayal, and fear over being left behind lies at the core of these self-destructive outbursts of violence.

The political leaders of the Loyalist communities are brave and impressive men who have taken their own significant risks for peace over the last six years. When I went to Northern Ireland in 1993 promoting a special role for the Clinton Administration in the peace process, my group was approached secretly for a private meeting with leaders of the Loyalist political parties. My colleagues and I have maintained close relationships with these parties and individuals ever since. I believe it would be very helpful to reach

out to them now and to explore ways that intervention by you or your representative could facilitate the attempts at negotiating an end to the current violence. It may be that certain Protestant religious leaders in the United States could play a role in this process. The key recommendation is that you communicate directly or through emissaries that you are concerned about the suffering of these deprived Protestant communities. The message should be clear that you do not view this just as a criminal problem, as Peter Mandelson has been prone to describe it, but part of the peace process deserving of high level, informed attention.

2. Implementation of the Patten Commission Report. I'm sure you are fully up to date on the conflict between the Irish government, SDLP, and Sinn Fein, on the one hand, and the British government, on the other, regarding the need to implement the Patten Commission Report. Without getting lost in the details, the bottom line is that this aspect of the peace process has already been compromised, first by sending it to a Commission rather than resolving it in the Good Friday Agreement, and then by the judicious compromises proposed by that Commission. Success does not depend on #10 Downing Street artfully spinning the virtues of further compromises. Success will arrive when the Irish government, SDLP, and Sinn Fein all call for nationalists to join the new police force and to participate in cross-community policing that takes it out of sectarian or national identity politics. On this issue, there is a nationalist veto, like it or not. But there are certainly grounds to be accepting of the nationalist position, given that Patten is a wholly reasonable set of proposals.

Sinn Fein has recently signaled that their greatest concerns are not about the symbols which are so contentious with Unionists, but with the substance of community control and accountability of the new policing service. I doubt that this is an opening to assuage the Unionists on the symbols, given the Sinn Fein position on flying the Union Jack, but it certainly means that the British government cannot hide behind the Unionist concerns when what is really at stake is the loss of power by security and intelligence services operating out of Whitehall and the Northern Ireland office.

"Fully implemented Patten" has to be the U.S. position. This has bipartisan support in the Congress, and it is transparently right on the merits. Getting there has two obstacles. One is the agenda of the security agencies in the British government. On that one, you need to encourage Tony Blair to face them down on the grounds that all that has been accomplished thus far in Northern Ireland could easily be washed away by failing to create an accountable cross-community policing service. The Unionists' objections are more difficult. Tony Blair should certainly hear that it will not do to turn this again into a "no guns, no police reform" stalemate. The decommissioning process, such as it is, has been institutionalized and cannot once again be introduced as a poison pill for further progress. It is especially insidious for Unionist leaders like Jeffrey Donaldson to express such umbrage over the continued possession of arms by the IRA, while he remains so silent about the persistent use of arms by Loyalist paramilitaries.

Still, there remains the challenge of preventing a UUP walkout in the face of full implementation. We'd be a lot better off if Mandelson had done the deed once and for

all, cleanly, last spring, and not engaged in the foolish tit for tat between Trimble and Mallon, leaving both of them politically exposed and convinced that there was a better bargain to be struck. But we are where we are. My prescription:

- a) Back the British off all their unnecessary weasel words retaining centralized control. They'll just have to trust the political leaders of Northern Ireland.
- b) Winnow the non-negotiable demands of the nationalist side down to the core using the Irish government to get there.
- c) Use your good offices to cause some selected confidence building measures to occur unsolicited and unconditionally, from the Republicans. There are recent hints from Gerry Kelly that this is on offer.
- d) Put a full court press on David Trimble to grasp the opportunity to move further in light of the positive events and keep the peace process moving by accepting, however reluctantly and with whatever protestations, the acceptable version of "fully implementing Patten."

If you agree with this strategy, it must be carefully managed. Step a is clearly between you and Blair. Step b is between you and the Irish government. On Step c, you can get an assist from the Irish government, but it involves your asking the Republicans to take some new risks for peace, but not outside the ambit of what they have already done or agreed to do at some point in the future (e.g., a new round of inspections).

3. Your Trip to Ireland Can Play a Key Role. The peace process has always needed deadlines to move past obstacles. Your trip, if early enough (i.e., late November or early December) can be such a deadline on policing. Without a deadline, the British will be sorely tempted to let the issue slide unresolved through the spring election, as Major did with initiatives to restore the IRA ceasefire in 1996-97.

Your 1995 trip forced through the "two-track" move on decommissioning and brought George Mitchell to the fore as the mediator. Your trip in 1998 pushed Adams over the line on "war is over" type talk. Mitchell's deadline made the Good Friday Agreement happen. The list goes on. A diplomatic push to have your trip preceded by successful resolution of the Patten impasse would be a solid bet.

4. I can help you with these items. For the last seven years, I have been working on this process informally behind the scenes. That has usually been a very helpful role for me to play. Occasionally, it has come at significant personal, political and economic cost, but it has been well worth the contribution to your extraordinary leadership on these issues. However, now that the policy has been so successfully institutionalized at NSC and at the State Department, people like me are looked on as outsiders who shouldn't be meddling. I hope that you don't share that view.

In addition, your White House is now short on "Ireland hands" and stretched by the Middle East crisis. In any case, with respect to the Loyalist paramilitaries and Sinn Fein in particular, I believe I could be very helpful in learning what kinds of things are possible. For instance, how could American help be used to help stem the Loyalist conflict? What is the range of confidence building, measures Republicans would contemplate in response to assurance of a White House push for the "full implementation of Patten"? I don't think you have a better conduit for getting accurate answers to these questions, and I would be pleased to play that role if you would like me to.

I would be pleased to talk to you by phone or in person if you would like to follow up on any of these suggestions.

Mr.N.Chandrababu Naidu on October 2nd, 2000 for the inauguration of Greenstar.**

I am extremely happy to participate in today's event for making available the rich cultural heritage of Parvatapur village over the Internet by Greenstar India

It is very appropriate that this function is taking place to coincide with Mahatma Gandhi's birthday.

Mahatma Gandhi always believed that since India lived largely in the villages the economic and social development of villages was important for achieving true freedom

Gandhiji always practised what he preached. He himself decided to settle in a village. He chose Segaon situated near Wardha. The village had a population of 600 and lacked amenities like a pucca road, a shop or a post office. Eventually Segaon came to be known as a village of welfare.

I am therefor happy that Greenstar has decided to mark Mahatma Gandhi's birthday by integrating one of the villages of the state with a larger global village.

The Internet is a great equaliser. It can allow even a remote village to reach out to the world.

I think that that the approach adopted by Greenstar for bringing solar power, education, community health, satellite communications and electronic commerce services to rural villages is the only way to bridge a digital divide.

The internet is seeing a rapid growth within our country. We now have about 3.5 million Indians having access to the Net.

I am sure that with increasing connectivity more and more Indians will begin to have access to the enormous reservoir of knowledge and information over the Internet.

We are in the process of using satellite communications for providing information access to the villages.

We hope to use the existing Ku band facilities on INSAT 3B and on MEASAT 1 and 2 satellites for providing services like distance learning, telemedicine, e-government and ecommerce to citizens of the state.

The internet as it exists today is largely oriented towards the English language and western culture. There is every need therefore to ensure that different cultures and different languages also find a place over the Internet.

I am sure that the efforts of Greenstar in trying to capture India's art and culture, music, legends, literature and history will help a better understanding and appreciation of India's rich past.

The infrastructure that will be set up by Greenstar will also help in villagers participating in the new economy. I am convinced that network connectivity can add substantially to incomes of farmers and artisans residing in the villages.

I am happy that Greenstar is focusing on clean energy. There is every need to exploit solar power for meeting the energy needs in our country. Too much dependence on thermal power is not only expensive but is also a threat to the environment.

I believe that the future will see more and more decentralised and local power generation.

I am therefore keen to see that the efforts of Greenstar succeed. Greenstar is one of the few companies focused primarily on bringing the benefits of information technology to rural areas.

I take this opportunity to convey my best wishes for the success of the endeavours of Greenstar in connecting villages using innovative solutions.

I would particularly like to compliment Dr. Charles F. Gay for his commitment to the

cause of making technology available for the development of rural communities. As a former Director of the Department of Energy's National Renewable Energy Laboratory he brings rich experience to the field.

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to give you an update on the ongoing negotiations to include sections of the Conservation and Reinvestment Act(CARA), specifically coastal and wildlife, as part of the Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations Bill. During our recent visit together at the White House you suggested the need to address the coastal and wildlife sections that were not adequately covered in the Interior Appropriations Bill.

Within the last few weeks, Senator Stevens, the Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, Senators Gregg and Hollings, the Chairman and Ranking Member of the Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations Subcommittee, Senate Majority Leader Lott and the Chairman of the Senate Energy Committee, Senator Murkowski, as well as most of the White House agreed to a Coastal Impact Assistance provision within the overall Coastal Section. This agreement on Coastal Impact Assistance would apply to the seven producing states including my state of Louisiana. The agreement covered authorizing language, funding for Fiscal Year 2001, a formula to distribute the funding and uses of the funding. Yesterday the House Conferees, led by the Ranking Member of the House Appropriations Committee, Congressman Obey, offered a counterproposal on the coastal section. Unfortunately, for several reasons, this counteroffer is unacceptable.

As this session of Congress will be wrapping up in a matter of days it is imperative that the Senate agreement on Coastal Impact Assistance be included as part of the Commerce, Justice, State Appropriations bill. Any assistance you can offer on these negotiations would be much appreciated.

Dear President Clinton,

In all the years since I have known you, I have chosen not to write to you personally except as Mrs. Chevy Chase or by signing a form letter. But when Mark Winstein called me and began to explain the future outlook of forest protection, I decided that I must use any influence I might have to convince you to listen to what Mark and other environmental leaders have to say. I hope that you can find the time to commit to these ideas.

I truly believe that in following this plan you will only elevate your legacy of leadership. Through all the ups and downs of your Presidency, I have never wavered in my loyal (and I believe true) belief in your tremendous ability to lead. Here is an area that needs your skillful guidance and I present to you the dedicated individuals who can provide educated and thoughtful advice along the way.

Much of the rest of this letter was actually composed by Mark - with a few little tweaks added here and there by me.

Thank you for your leadership on the environment and for considering meeting with the nation's leaders for a forest protection and Conservation Biology plan.

In your Earth Day statement in Time Magazine, you noted that the earth is facing an ecological crisis that left unsolved could result in the extinction of half of all species by the end of this century. It took courage to state this fact under your by-line. You have shown by your actions that you are willing to take the steps necessary to address this issue at the global level.

On forests, you have led the discussion for protecting core areas of biodiversity. The fire protection and forest restoration program, which you have been working with Congress on, will transform the economies of communities near national forests by providing well-paying jobs that are not dependent on timber sales. This will be a huge step forward!

But, as in 1995, Republican policymakers are leading a secret push to gut environmental laws, using recent fires as the re-herring excuse. You could be faced with even more challenging political dilemmas than in 1995. It's important to note, polls show that the

vast majority of voters, Democrat and Republican, want far greater protection for the national forests than exist today.

After November 7th, the political landscape of the United States will have shifted. This can be an opportunity for you to put in place a complete Conservation Biology plan for our federal forests that will set a new worldwide standard and be appreciated by our children's grandchildren.

The pace of protection will accelerate for forests globally, as others, inspired by your leadership, reach beyond their current self-imposed limits. Dr. Edward O. Wilson has offered to assist in drafting your speech to commemorate the completion of this plan. In the meeting, you would have the opportunity to discuss with the world's most eminent scientists what last steps would be needed to complete a scientific Conservation Biology plan for our federal forests. In addition, the nation's foremost forest protection leaders can provide snapshots of how federal policies are implemented out on the ground. Finally, business, opinion and Congressional leaders who share your commitment will attend, ready to listen to your ideas and give support to your actions.

A list of invitees who support Conservation Biology and protecting America's forests is attached. We could certainly add many more names to this list, as well as bump a few off - including my adorable/silly husband. You know he'd only come if he could hang out with you and tell *that* joke. His serious side is limited to good jazz, the political landscape and a few other specific areas of interest. As much as he loves trees and forests, I can't say that he has done much studying on these subjects.

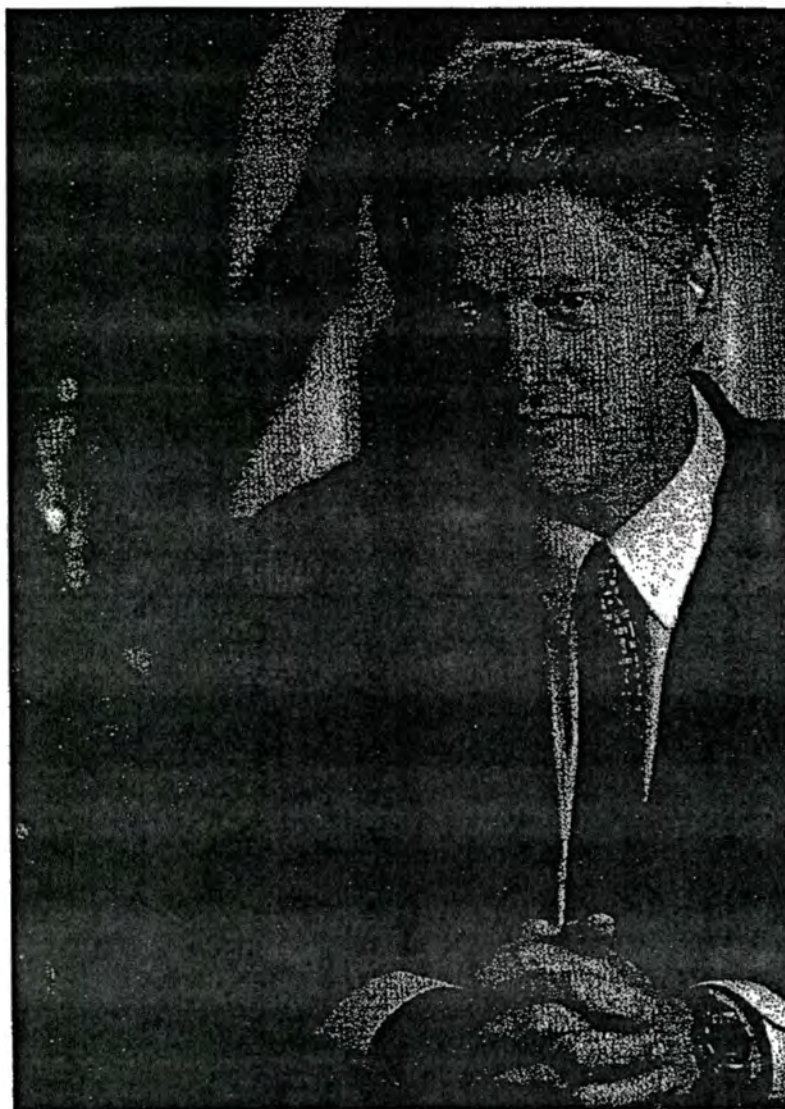

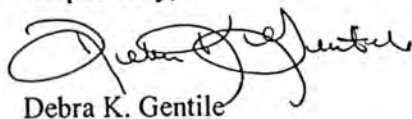

We Need a Miracle

We are sending you the following information for consideration. Pastor Dino Gentile; of the Los Angeles, CA area needs a miracle. He was arrested, charged, convicted and sentenced to 41 years in federal prison for bank robbery. The sad part of this story is that he should have been acquitted of this crime. Dino accepted him like any new convert, praying for him at the altar, fellowship, ect. He showed much interest in the church and even assisted in building a new teen center for the youth. Stephen seemed to have it all together. He said that he had spent 4 years in the Marines and had saved his money. He was willing to help in just about anything from the tape ministry; to giving of finances anytime the church had a need.

Pastor Dino and the new convert Stephen was on a evangelistic trip last summer through Florida when, alias Stephen, turned out to be the notorious bank robber Jeffrey Durham and was listed as "America's Most Wanted." Stephen (Jeffrey) asked Dino if he could drive him to pick up some money and told his Pastor a phony story of where and from whom. He then put a gun to Dino's head, put a bomb up his back, under a flack jacket, and told him if he did not go along with a bank robbery he would kill him, his wife and daughters. We don't know what we would have done in this situation. But Dino did what he thought he had to do, that is to protect his family. Durham had pretended to be an ATF agent on a surveillance operation and was assigned a stakeout in Florida when he was asked about the FBI jacket he was packing.

Durham robbed the bank. Pastor Dino did not come near the bank in Pensacola FL. There was \$140,000 found on Durham, his physical evidence was all over the bank, his fingerprints were all over the place and hair samples were found inside the facemask that he had used. Dino only knew that a crime was committed but was fearful to go to the authorities because of the death threat to his wife and girls. The FBI arrested Dino and charged him with the crime. 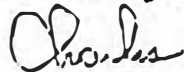

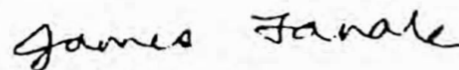
