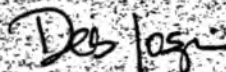
I want to tell you about something really wonderful that we have created to honor the memory of my late husband, Dan Dutko. The eight partners of the Dutko Group Companies and I have established the Dan Dutko Memorial Foundation, Inc., a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization. The Foundation will sponsor the Dan Dutko Fellowship Program – a graduate education program in public policy management. Those of us who knew Dan so well knew that he enjoyed nothing more than mentoring young people as they navigated Washington's sometimes choppy waters. By supporting graduate and post-graduate level students who have demonstrated an interest in gaining a more intimate understanding of, and involvement with, the legislative and political processes, the Dutko Fellowship Program will honor and continue Dan's pursuit of helping others achieve excellence. The Fellowship program will be operated in partnership with the Tufts University College of Citizenship and Public Service.

On November 27, 2000, we are kicking off the Foundation. Our Co-hosts for the event are Kathleen Kennedy Townsend and Jeanne Shaheen, two women who sought Dan's advice early and often, and about whose lives and careers Dan cared deeply. The Dutko Group partners and I would be so honored if you would agree to Chair the Foundation's Advisory Board for the first two years of its start-up phase. We also hope that your schedule will allow you to attend the large evening event on the 27th and then a dinner for the Advisory Board immediately following. If that evening does not work for you, then perhaps you could join the members of the Advisory Board for lunch that day or any other day that works. I will follow up with your staff.

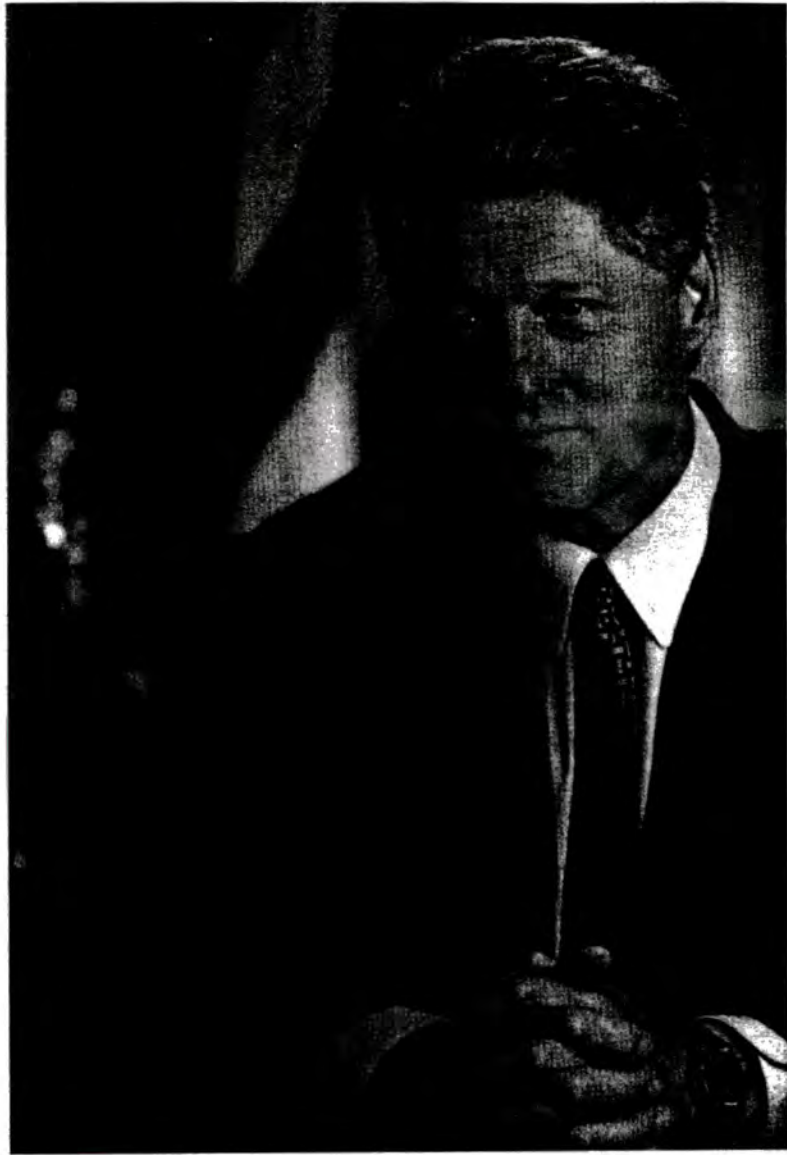

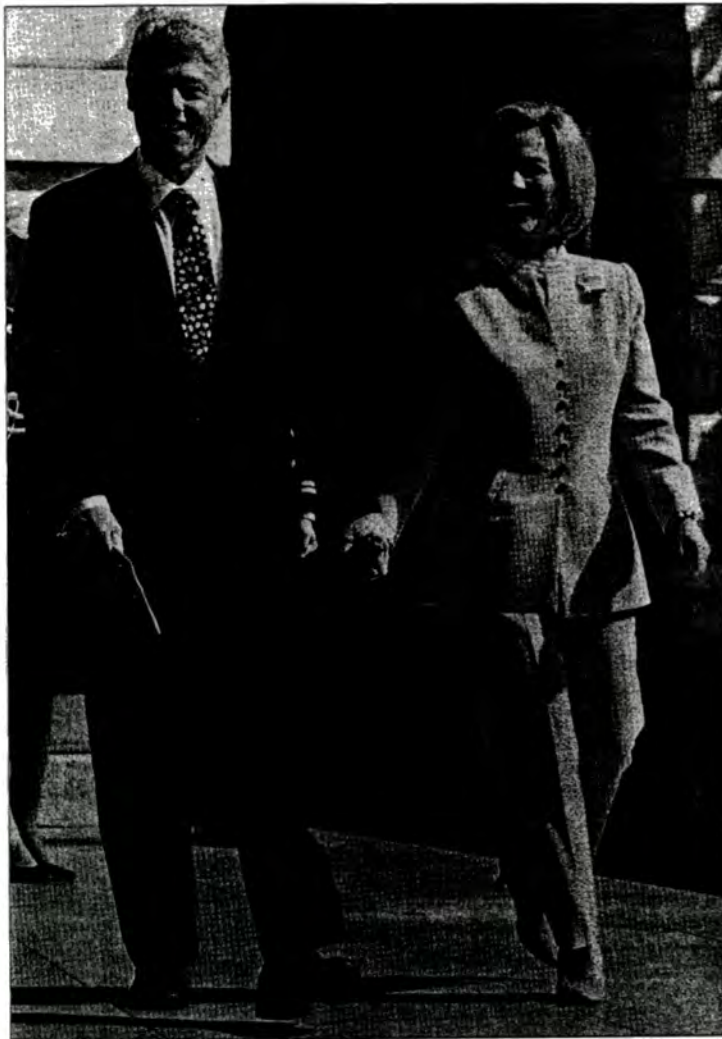

PURPOSE: To return a call from Senator Evan Bayh (D-IN) regarding making child support/fatherhood legislation a high priority for the Administration in the final budget and legislative negotiations.

BACKGROUND:

The Administration strongly supports this legislation and proposed similar initiatives in our budget. It builds on your and the Vice President's longstanding commitment to these issues. We should be careful, however, about committing to it as a "must have in the end game" because this list is growing quite long.

Your FY 2001 budget proposed making changes to the child support system to improve enforcement and allow more support to go directly to families. The budget also proposed investing in programs to help connect low-income fathers and families with employment to assist them to work and support their children.

On September 7th, the House passed the Child Support Distribution Act of 2000 with overwhelming bipartisan support (405-18), under the leadership of Reps. Nancy Johnson (R-CT) and Ben Cardin (D-MD). Similar to your budget proposals, this bill would provide more child support directly to families leaving welfare, simplify and improve child support collection by the states, and promote responsible parenting and increase the financial support parents can provide their children through a fatherhood grant program. \$1.3 billion over five years. When fully implemented, the child support changes will result in over \$1 billion per year in additional child support going to former welfare recipients and families still on welfare.

In the Senate, there were two bipartisan bills addressing child support (Kohl/Snowe) and fatherhood (Bayh/Domenici). On October 11th, Senator Snowe (R-ME) introduced a bill that essentially pre-conferences the House and Senate bills by adding two fatherhood pieces from Senator Bayh's bill -- block grants to states and media campaign funding -- to the child support provisions and competitive fatherhood grants in the House bill. We are working hard to make sure majority members of the Senate Finance Committee are comfortable with the bill and to broker an agreement among key parties. While Senator Roth (R-DE) has expressed support for the policy changes, he so far been unwilling to support the bill and the Republican leadership has been unwilling to move it without his support. While those negotiations continue, Rep. Nancy Johnson (R-CT), is planning on having the House taking up the Senate bill under suspension so that the Senate could pass that bill by unanimous consent and send it straight to you for signature.

You have highlighted the importance of congressional action on child support and responsible fatherhood initiatives on a number of occasions, including your Father's Day radio address, in a statement on passage of the House bill in which you urged the Senate to take action, and most recently at your welfare to work/transportation event last Saturday in Denver.

TALKING POINTS:

- I applaud your efforts on behalf of responsible fatherhood. You have clearly taken the lead in Congress to ensure that more fathers are able to honor their responsibilities.
- I proposed a similar program, "Fathers Work/Families Win" in my FY2000 budget. I believe it is important that we get this done and build on a long-standing commitment to strengthen the role of fathers in their children's lives.

- The leadership of Rep. Nancy Johnson in the House is important to passage of the fatherhood provisions. I think the strategy of passing the informally conferenced bill in the House first is a sound one.
- I understand that Senator Roth (R-DE) has not yet agreed to support the legislation. I am willing to make a call to Senator Lott if we decide that this would help the bill move in the Senate after House passage.
- I support this legislation. I think the best strategy is to move a House passed version of your new child support/fatherhood bill through the Senate. [If we cannot, we need to look at every possible vehicle. I would be happy to support the inclusion of this in another bill. However, I can not make a commitment because at this point it is difficult to determine which bills will move.]

Dear President Clinton:

I write to request your assistance on an important matter regarding Michigan Indian tribes. I support an amendment to the Michigan Indian Land Claims Settlement Act (Settlement Act). The amendment would treat the judgment funds of three tribes the same as judgment funds distributed under the Indian Tribal Judgment Funds Act or Distribution Act (Distribution Act), 25 U.S.C. section 1401 et seq.

In 1997, Congress passed the Settlement Act to provide for the distribution of funds for several judgments awarded in the 1970s by the Indian Claims Commission to various Michigan Indian tribes. The judgments were based upon inadequate compensation paid to the tribes for cessions of land by treaties. Under the Distribution Act, the Department of Interior is required to prepare and submit to Congress a plan for the use or distribution of the judgment funds. The Treasury Department held the judgment funds for more than 25 years because the Department of Interior never prepared the distribution plans.

I introduced the Settlement Act to provide for the fair and equitable division of the judgment funds by providing an opportunity for the tribes to develop plans for the use and distribution of the judgment funds. The Settlement Act codifies the distribution plans of three tribes—Bay Mills Indian Community, Sault Ste. Marie Tribe of Chippewa Indians of Michigan, and Grand Traverse Band of Ottawa and Chippewa Indian of Michigan.

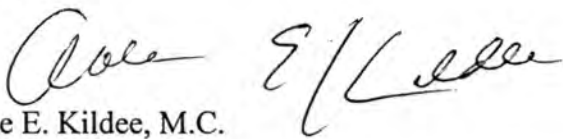
Under the Distribution Act, distribution plans prepared by Department of Interior and submitted to Congress are not subject to Federal and State income taxes. However, because Congress approved the distribution plans in the Settlement Act without the Department of Interior's involvement, the Internal Revenue Service claims that the judgment funds are subject to Federal and State income taxes.

I strongly urge your Administration to support language in a bill to correct this situation before Congress adjourns so that the three Michigan Indian tribes will be treated the same as other tribes whose distribution plans were approved under the Distribution Act.

For your convenience, I am including the proposed amendment. I would appreciate your assistance on this matter.

The Michigan Indian Lands Claims Settlement Act, Pub.L. 105-143, 111 Stat. 2652, is amended by adding a Section 113 as follows:

SEC. 113. TAX EXEMPTION. None of the funds distributed per capita under the provisions of the Michigan Indian Land Claims Settlement Act shall be subject to Federal or State income taxes.

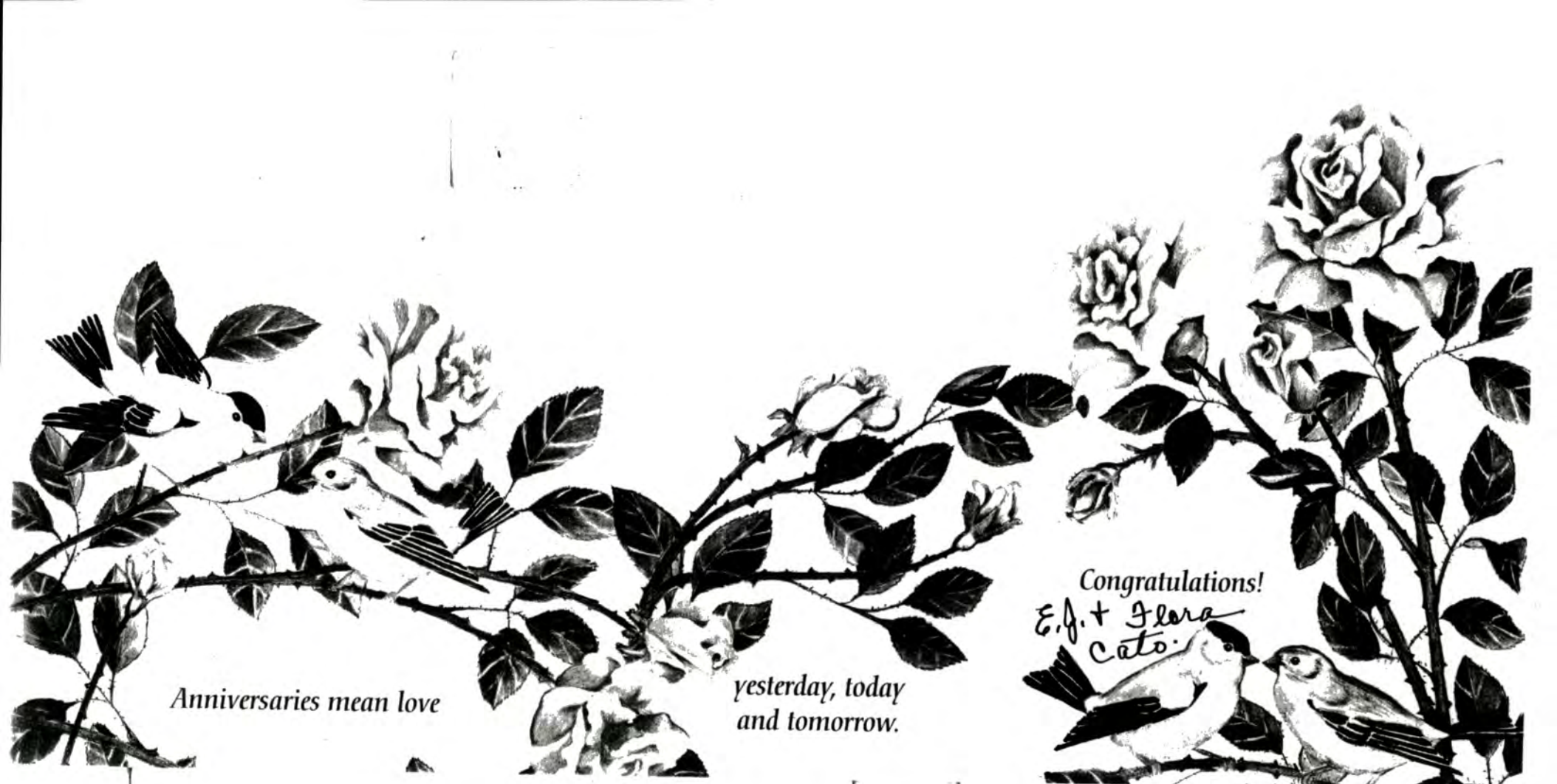

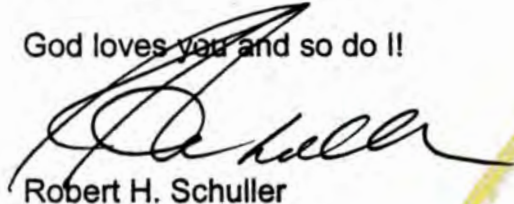
