TO PERMIT AN ADJUSTMENT IN THE DIRECT GRADUATE MEDICAL
EDUCATION (GME) PER RESIDENT PAYMENT TO GEORGETOWN UNIVERSITY
HOSPITAL (HOSPITAL) WHICH PROVIDES TERTIARY CARE AND OTHER
ESSENTIAL SERVICES TO WASHINGTON AREA RESIDENTS.

(a) IN GENERAL Section 1886 (h)(2)(F) (42 U.S.C. 1395ww(h)(2)(F)) is
amended—

(1) Insert an "(i)" in the first subparagraph of this section:

(2) By adding a new paragraph (ii) the following new clause:

"(ii) In the case of Georgetown University Hospital (or a successor
entity) located in the District of Columbia, the per resident
payment shall be \$ 92,000; said payment shall be first effective
for fiscal Year 2001, and adjusted annually thereafter in
accordance with Section (h)(2)(D)(i) of this subsection.

● **Comments:** Dear Mary, thanks for the prompt response. The issues which I want to speak briefly with the President are five in which the Administration has been strong, but which I have grave concerns for.

- increasing the Social Services Block Grant to \$2.3 billion for FY 2001;
- restoring Medicaid and food stamp and benefits to legal immigrants; (The Medicaid items would allow states to get federal matching funds for Medicaid expenditures for immigrant children and pregnant women who are otherwise eligible.)
- expanding the Earned Income Credit for low-income families with more than two children;
- approving the House-passed fatherhood and child support enforcement provisions; and
- increasing the minimum wage by \$1 over 2 years.

I would like to speak to the President about these soon. I am here in the office until about noon today. Then in Maine for talks tonight and tomorrow morning. Back tomorrow afternoon and in town through early Wednesday afternoon. The number I gave you (703-548-5163) is my office private line and voice mail which no one else answers. My home number is 202-546-1958. My executive assistant's name is Delores Dawson and is reachable at 703-549-1390 ext. 125; she has been apprised of this matter. I can call in from Maine or wherever as needed. Thanks so much.

As I sit here waiting for a visit by Brady Anderson, I am reminded again that a presidency is measured in small ways as well as large. In your case, there's no doubt that it opened a window on the world of politics and government that many of us in Arkansas never would have seen.

With that Arkansas context firmly in mind, I thought I'd make a request for the future. Come late January, you'll have some free time, though I know the demands on even former presidents can be large. I assume some of that time will be spent in Arkansas.

The Arkansas Times would like to sit down with you and talk about your presidency, particularly in terms of its meaning for Arkansas, and about your future and the future of the presidential library. I know presidential interviews are rarely given, particularly, I suppose, in the immediate aftermath. But I wanted to be on record asking for the opportunity. And I hope, when the time has come to talk one-on-one with media back home, that you'll have the Arkansas Times at the top of your list.
