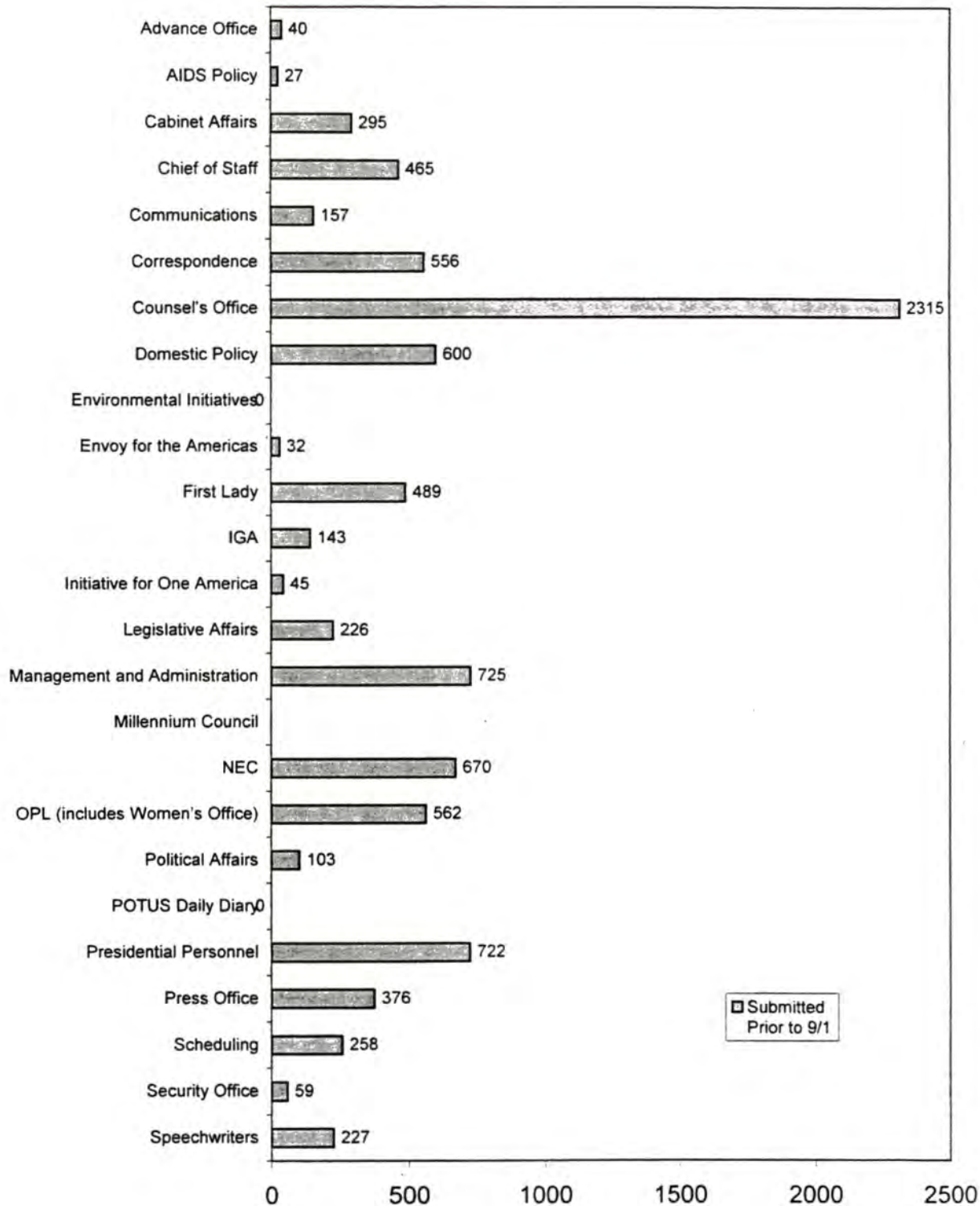

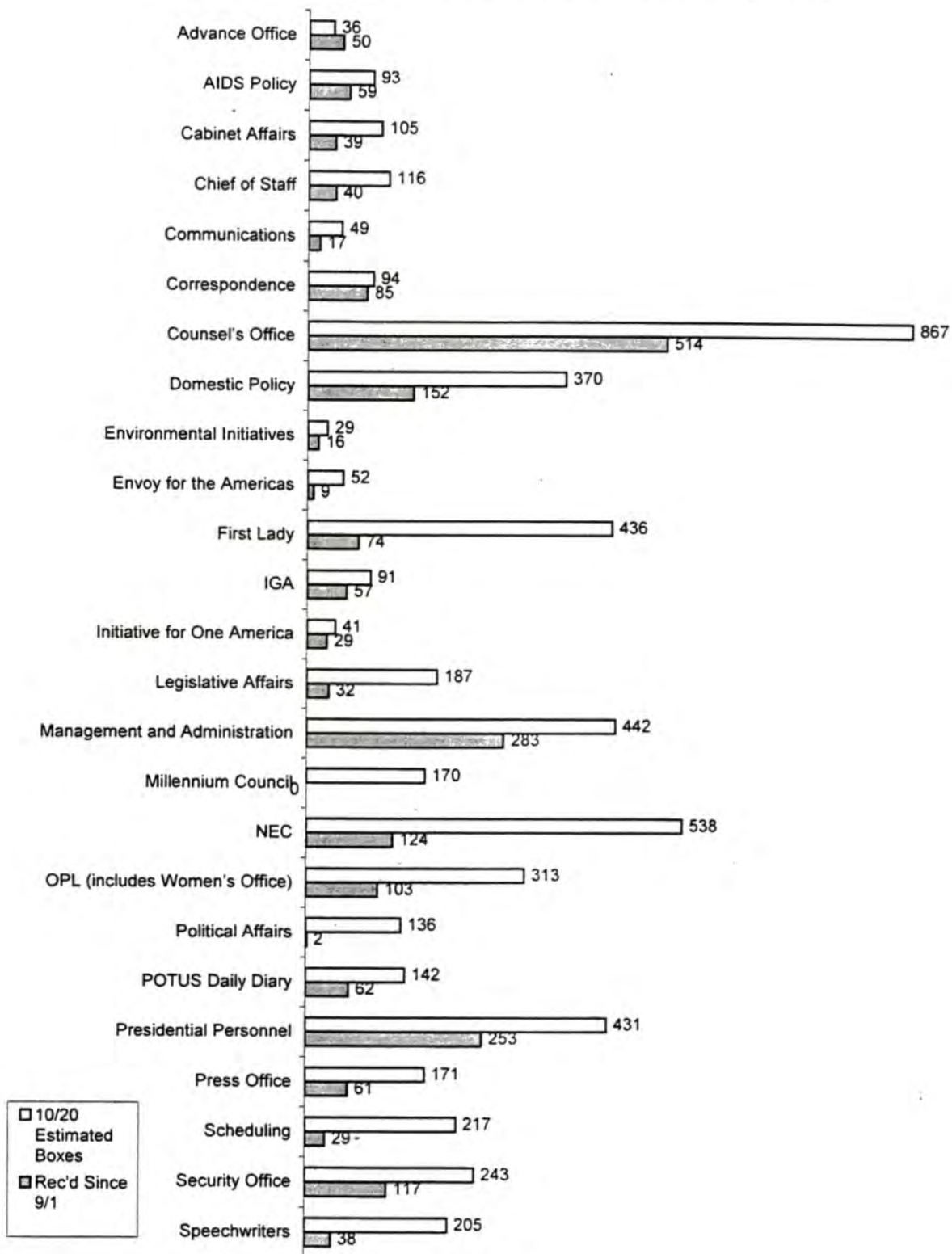
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Boxes of Presidential Records Submitted to ORM Prior to 9/1

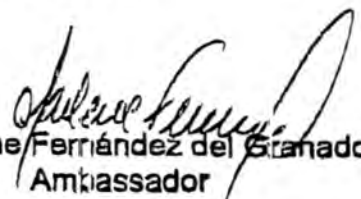
Dear Mr. President:

Really great seeing you last week at The White House and to see Quincy and the others receiving their medals from you and Hillary. You made some great choices. Also, Molly and I were so thrilled to introduce you both to baby Lucas. Enclosed are two photos you may enjoy. Lucas may love these photos the way you value the photo of you and President Kennedy. (*We* certainly do.) Thank you so much. Also, we treasure the framed letter from you and Hillary welcoming Lucas into the world, just as we cherish our friendship.

On another note, I read in *The New York Times* that you are considering a pardon for Michael Milken. I have known Mike since 1984 when he gave one of the earliest grants in support of my research proving, for the first time, that heart disease is reversible by changing diet and lifestyle. He doesn't have heart disease, so his motivations were purely altruistic. In 1996, he made the first grant in support of our study to see if prostate cancer is reversible by changing diet and lifestyle. He has become such an authority in the field that any time someone has been interested in supporting my prostate cancer research, they almost always call Mike first for his assessment.

I have attended his annual CapCURE scientific meetings each year since 1996, and it is truly remarkable what he has accomplished in bringing together the top researchers from all over the world and encouraging them to work collaboratively and inclusively. He has lobbied effectively to increase the budgets for the NIH, NCI, and DOD cancer research efforts and also raised tens of millions of dollars for prostate cancer research in private funds via CapCURE. I do not know of anyone who has done more to advance the field. Also, I have attended his annual education awards to outstanding teachers, which have been quite moving.

Despite his accomplishments and philanthropy, Mike's number-one priority has always been his family. No one asked me to contact you, but I imagine a pardon would mean so much to him and his family—not to exonerate or to excuse what happened in the past, but as a new beginning. It may be helpful in furthering his many humanitarian efforts. To me, the real measure of a man is what he does with his life *after* he's made mistakes—and if ever anyone has embodied redemption, it's Michael Milken. He is an extraordinary human being. "To err is human, to forgive, divine."

Molly joins me in sending our love and best wishes to you and Hillary for a holiday season and a new year filled with love and joy. We hold you dear in our hearts and hope to see you soon.

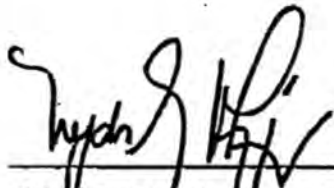
We are writing you once more regarding a human rights issue that should definitely be attended to before you leave office. We are referring to the Buenos Aires Yoga School case in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

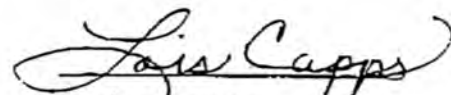
As you know, over 150 letters have been written during your administration, from both Democrats and Republicans in Congress urging the assistance of the U.S. government in helping to resolve the pending judicial case against BAYS. While Secretary of State Madeleine Albright's visit to Argentina earlier this year did result in conversations with some of the new Argentine government officials about BAYS, the case remains unresolved.

The BAYS human rights case may be a precursor to future instability in that society. These problems could easily be exacerbated by the economic difficulties Argentina now faces. We recognize, as you indicated in your September 12th response to an earlier congressional letter, that "Argentina is a valued and respected ally." In fact, it is because of this relationship that we believe President De la Rúa can be positively influenced in this matter.

While you were unable to raise the specific BAYS case with President De la Rúa, when he visited the United States, we believe your personal involvement, at this time could go a long way toward resolving this case during your administration. Consequently, Mr. President, we would ask that you or your designee meet with some representatives from BAYS so that you can hear from them directly about how their case is related to future political and economic stability in Argentina.

Dear Mr. President:

I want to tell you about my friend, Ed Downe, and why I believe a Presidential pardon is warranted.

I have known Ed Downe for over 20 years. We speak almost everyday. He is a very fine person who, through his generosity and kindness, has helped people when there seemed to be no hope.

Ed made a mistake a number of years ago, for which he has accepted full responsibility. He plead guilty and was sentenced to 3000 hours of community service. Over the years, Ed has expressed to me, his family and friends his deep remorse for his actions.

Ed's community service consisted of teaching mostly minority students at the Brooklyn campus of Long Island University in New York City. Ed's community service obligation was met several years ago; yet, because he found the experience so rewarding, Ed has continued to teach and assist students as a volunteer.

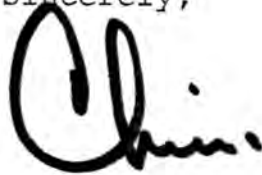
Ed Downe has received his share of public recognition for his charity and personal support of various causes. There is ample evidence that Ed Downe is a good citizen. But, Mr. President, Ed is an even better person. He has made a difference in the lives of people few people ever know about. There are the disadvantaged students that Ed not only taught, but with whom he has personally stayed in touch over the years and financially assisted, when they were in financial trouble. Young artists who would not have been able to continue without Ed's support. The family who lost their father that Ed brings together each and every year for a memorial service. The young man who needed help with the National Guard.

Mr. President, the examples of Ed's private goodness is extensive, but they all share one thing in common -- they were all done quietly to help people -- average people in need. It is these quiet, unseen, unknown gestures of human decency that Ed has made over the years that make him so special and the case for a Presidential pardon so worthy.

Dear Mr. President:

The purpose of this letter is to commend and congratulate you on the extraordinary way in which you have performed the most difficult job in the world. There is no doubt that historians many years from now will say you came into office at a critical juncture and literally saved the nation just as President Abraham Lincoln in his own way saved the Union.

The nature of the threat, of course, was different, but just as real and just as divisive. The crisis that you helped us confront and conquer was the looming national debt. Interest on the national debt was the third largest expenditure of government and it was growing at an alarming rate. Left unchecked the mounting weight of debt would have reduced America to a debtor nation and before long into a second or third-rate power.

Despite all that was written in the press prior to your taking office, I do not believe that most people understand how perilous our position was in the world. It was generally conceded that it was impossible for us to produce a budget surplus, much less pay down and eventually pay off the national debt. With your vision and leadership, the impossible was and is being accomplished in style.

In this short note, I am highlighting only one of your accomplishments. I believe it is particularly important to your legacy that two things be done. First, produce a document that sets forth your accomplishments and proposals that were put forward but not approved by the Congress. This needs to be done by the people closest to events now rather than leaving it to historians to try to piece things together later. It is also important that your staff benchmark where we were, where we are now, and where we would be if your policies were to continue. We need to lay down a standard against which the performance of future administrations can be judged. Second, it is important for you to do a farewell speech that gives us your vision for the future. I have in mind something like President Dwight Eisenhower's "military industrial complex" speech or President George Washington's farewell to his troops or his final speech to Congress. The whole world will be watching. They need to hear from you. Such a speech will serve to define you and your Presidency and act like an exclamation point at the end of a sentence.

In closing, I want to thank you not only for your service to the nation, but for all your many kindnesses to me personally. You know you have my very great respect and admiration. If ever I can be of assistance to you in any way, please do not hesitate to call upon me.

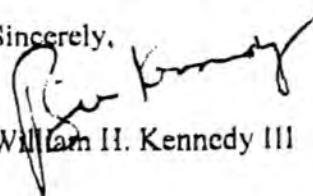

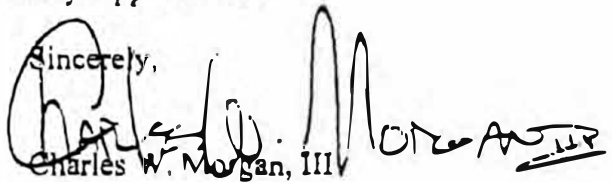

HIS OBJECT A GENTLER L.A., A COUNCILMAN BUYS UP AK-47s

As opponents of gun control often point out, guns don't kill people—people do. But the right weapon can make killing easy. When Patrick Edward Purdy walked into a Stockton, Calif., schoolyard last month, he was carrying his own personal doomsday machine, a Chinese-made semiautomatic AK-47 rifle capable of firing about 40 rounds a minute. In four minutes, with all the terrible efficiency that the AK-47 is designed to promote, he had killed five children and wounded 29 others and one teacher.

Created by the Soviets and copied by the Chinese, the AK-47 is a favorite of communist guerrillas. It is also popular among gun enthusiasts from Beirut to L.A. Since 1985, 88,000 AK-47s and 102,000 Israeli-made Uzis have been imported into the U.S. Many are in the hands of collectors; others belong to those with less innocent motives. To Los Angeles City Councilman Nate Holden, the AK-47 is, pure and simple, an instrument of terror. "There were 257 gang-related homicides in L.A. last year," says Holden. "Many of them were drive-by shootings with high-powered automatic weapons. I thought, 'Hey, let's see what I can do to get some of these guns off the street.'"

Spurred to action by the shootings in Stockton, Holden, who is running for mayor of Los Angeles this year, announced an unusual cash-for-guns offer. Drawing upon \$50,000 in campaign funds, Holden promised to pay up to \$300 for each AK-47 or Uzi surrendered to the L.A. police.

After one week the police had collected 65 assault rifles and Holden had received more than his money's worth in campaign publicity. But on the streets of L.A., at least one AK-47 owner vowed never to part with his weapon. "You want to give up your gun, go ahead," said an inner-city gang member. "Just don't be stupid enough to try and take mine. If I can't get an AK-47, I'll get an Uzi. No Uzi? There's lots and lots of shotguns." □

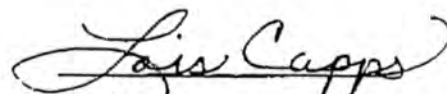

While Secretary of State Madeleine Albright's visit to Argentina earlier this year did result in conversations with some of the new Argentine government officials about BAYS, the case remains unresolved.

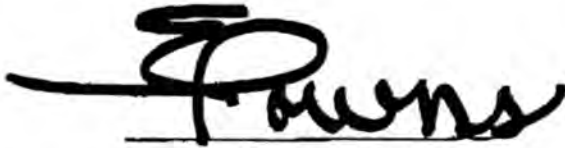
The BAYS human rights case may be a precursor to future instability in that society. These problems could easily be exacerbated by the economic difficulties Argentina now faces. We recognize, as you indicated in your September 12th response to an earlier congressional letter, that "Argentina is a valued and respected ally." In fact, it is because of this relationship that we believe President De la Rúa can be positively influenced in this matter.

While you were unable to raise the specific BAYS case with President De la Rúa, when he visited the United States, we believe your personal involvement, at this time could go a long way toward resolving this case during your administration. Consequently, Mr. President, we would ask that you or your designee meet with some representatives from BAYS so that you can hear from them directly about how their case is related to future political and economic stability in Argentina.

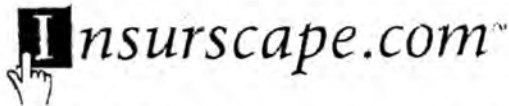
Dear Mr. President:

I am writing for your help. Enclosed you will find information pertinent to this situation. I will be as brief as possible. Time is of the essence and help is needed immensely.

I am 25 and have lived in Ventura, California all of my life. I am the son of a single parent now retired schoolteacher. 3 years ago, I made a mistake. I have now been accused of and pleaded guilty to the crime of Title 18 USC 656, 2(b): Misapplication of Bank funds, Causing an Act to Be Done, Class B Felonies. This is NOT something I am proud of.

In September 1998 I quit Home Savings of America. Two days after I left it was discovered. I met with the FBI in December of 1998 and gave a statement admitting my crime. I was told then that the U.S. Attorney would be getting the case in February of 1999. I hired an attorney with a loan from my Great Uncle. The attorney and I waited. We waited until August 1999, and nothing. I then changed attorneys and continued to wait. My former attorney wanted more money than I had. I had not worked in now 1 year. I could not work who would hire me? My life was upside down. I collected unemployment from May of 1999 until it ran out in December of that year.

Once in awhile I would hear from my attorney, but as always nothing had happened, until February 2000. The U.S. Attorney had a plea agreement she wanted me to sign. When I was showed that agreement, it was not acceptable. It gave away any and all rights I had left. I did not feel comfortable doing such a thing. My attorney told me that the U.S. Attorney would get back to us soon. I had done nothing for 2 years at that point and wanted to own up to my actions. During this time, from September 1998 to May 1999, my family was VERY supportive. I was lucky enough to have my mother's home to live in as she was moving to Thailand to teach. If not for that I would be on the streets, so to speak. Not until August 2000, did the U.S. Attorney finally get back to us with an agreement that was acceptable. I originally had offered to do a pre-indictment plea (I never thought I would have to do anything like that in my life). I was sentenced in November 2000, with a remand date of January 5, 2001. The time has flown by. Many times I have started this letter, many times I have not finished it. Ashamed of my actions and having to write the President of The United States of America, for help. How low can one be made to feel? You are the only person who can help me now. I was sentenced to 20 months, 6 month in a "Boot Camp" style program with a strong recommendation from Honorable Terry J. Hatter, Jr., Chief United States District Judge. He was as fair and just as he could be. I knew that I would be in for at least 6 months and then out on supervised release. Nancy O'Connor was the U.S. Probation Officer assigned to my case. She too was very fair and just. Matter of fact, for a situation as bad as mine, I have met only the fairest and

We pay semi-monthly on the 15th and last day of the month.

You will accrue sick leave at the rate of 1.88 hours per pay period (6 days per year) and vacation leave at the rate of 3.13 hours per pay period (10 days per year). Earned sick leave and vacation may be used after the completions of your 90-day probationary period. You are also eligible for holidays and personal days as stipulated in our employee handbook. You will be eligible for benefits coverage (medical, dental, life, long-term disability) effective March 1, 2001.

All employees serve a 90-day probationary period and are required to sign an "At-Will-Relationship Agreement" with ISA, LLC/ *Insurscape.com*TM upon their employment.

SUBJ: North Korea Trip

Dear Mr. President:

As you know, for some years I have had a keen interest in North Korea and have traveled there more than virtually any U.S. civilian. After my most recent trips, which occurred shortly before I joined the White House staff, I provided my observations to Sandy.

I know you are contemplating making a Presidential visit to North Korea prior to leaving office. Mr. President, I would consider it an extraordinarily high honor to be able to accompany you on your visit to Pyongyang.

As a senior officer of a major corporation, as the former vice chairman of AmeriCares, and as a current board member of The Center for Democracy, it seems that I would make a logical member of the delegation accompanying you.

Also, I recommend that your visit include a small number of U.S. business and humanitarian representatives. To the extent that I can be of service in organizing the involvement of U.S. business interests or specific humanitarian activity coincident with your visit to Pyongyang, just let me know.

You may recall that on one of my visits to Pyongyang you asked me to pass along a message to North Korean leader Kim Jong Il indicating your continued willingness to work toward common ground. As I reported, on that trip I met with the head of the Americas Branch of the DPRK's Foreign Ministry in Pyongyang and I passed along your message.

North Korea is one of the few remaining truly dark spots on the globe. It is certainly appropriate that opening sincere dialogue with Pyongyang would be a major foreign policy accomplishment. As a former member of your White House staff, I would consider it a special honor to be able to return once again to North Korea with you.
