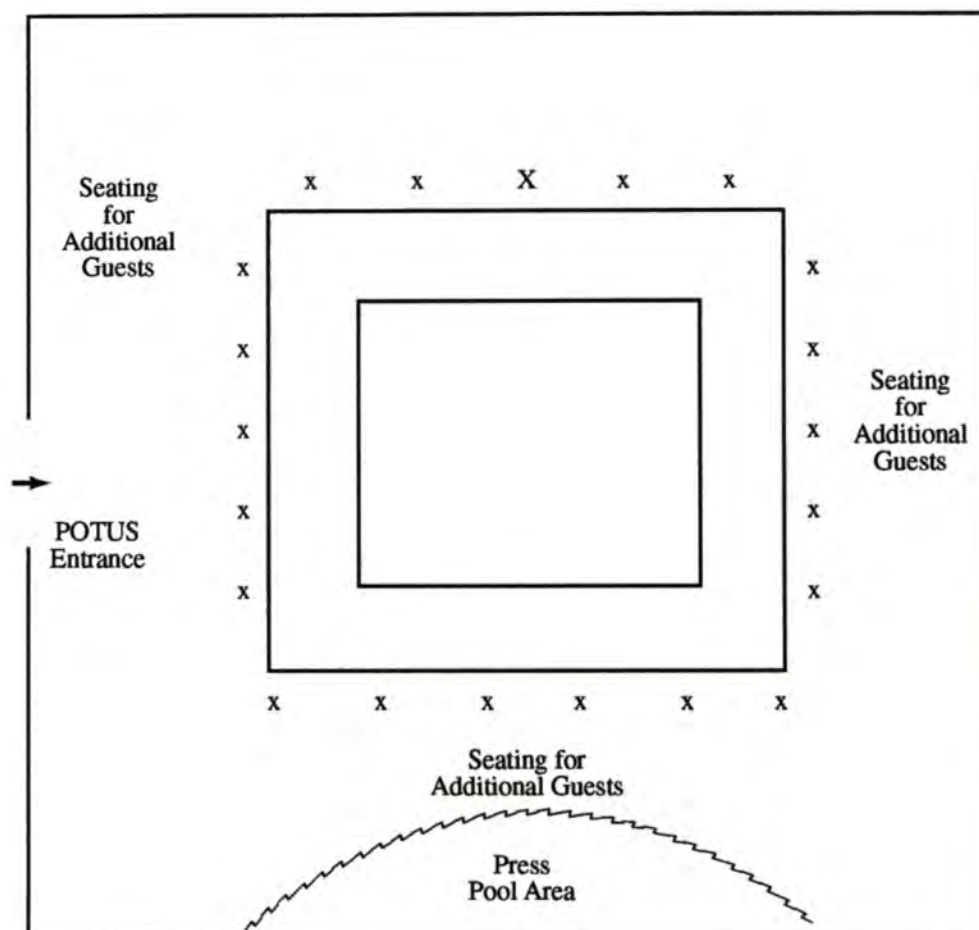

I. PURPOSE

Get acquainted with base reuse community leaders from throughout the San Francisco Bay area, give them an update on the administration's efforts to provide assistance, listen to their concerns, and answer their questions.

The other "top tier" Republicans are Attorney General Gail Norton and Secretary of State Natalie Meyer. Other possible Republicans include Steve Shuck, a real estate developer who lost in the 1990 primary and State Senate President Tom Norton.
