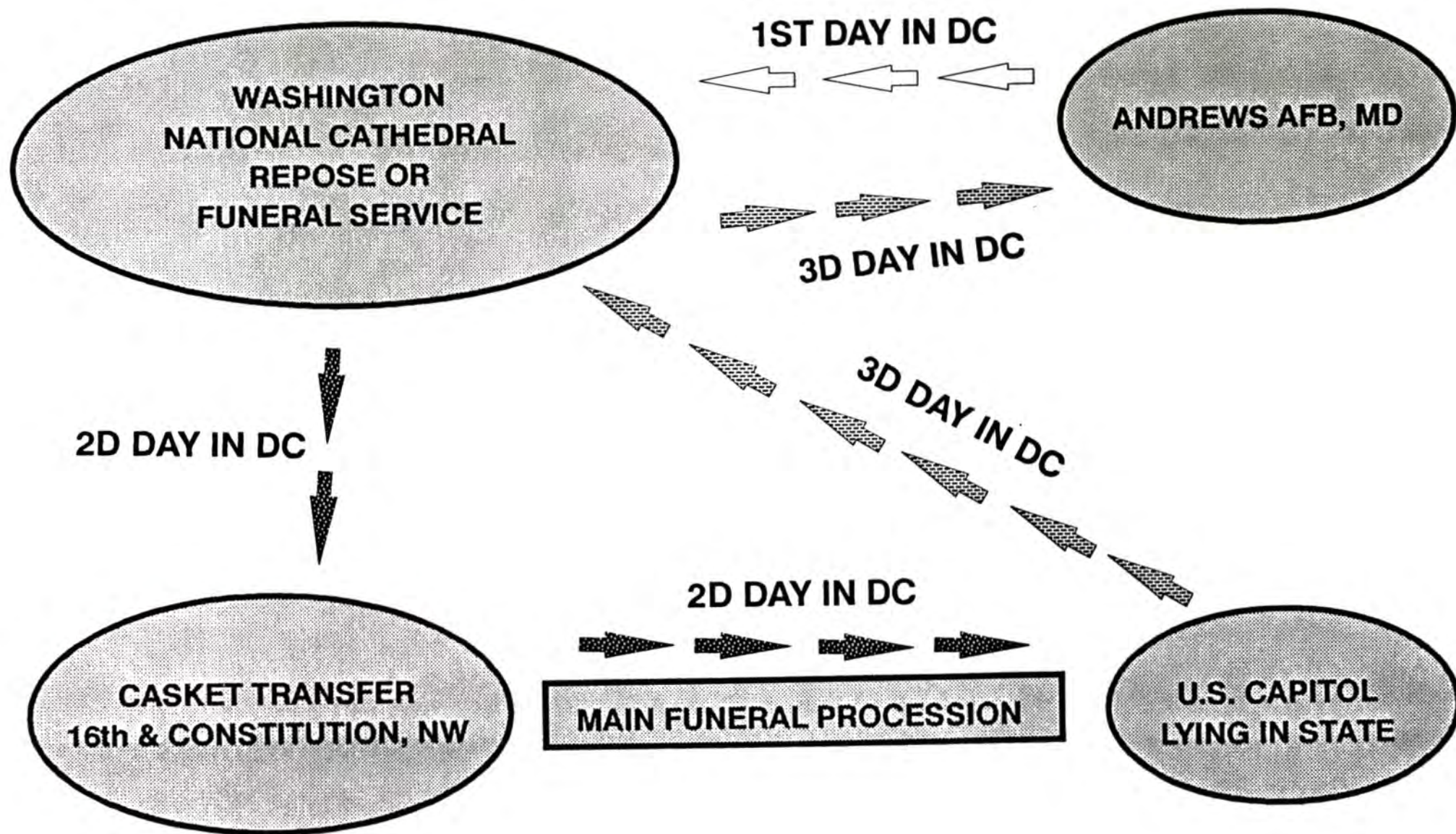

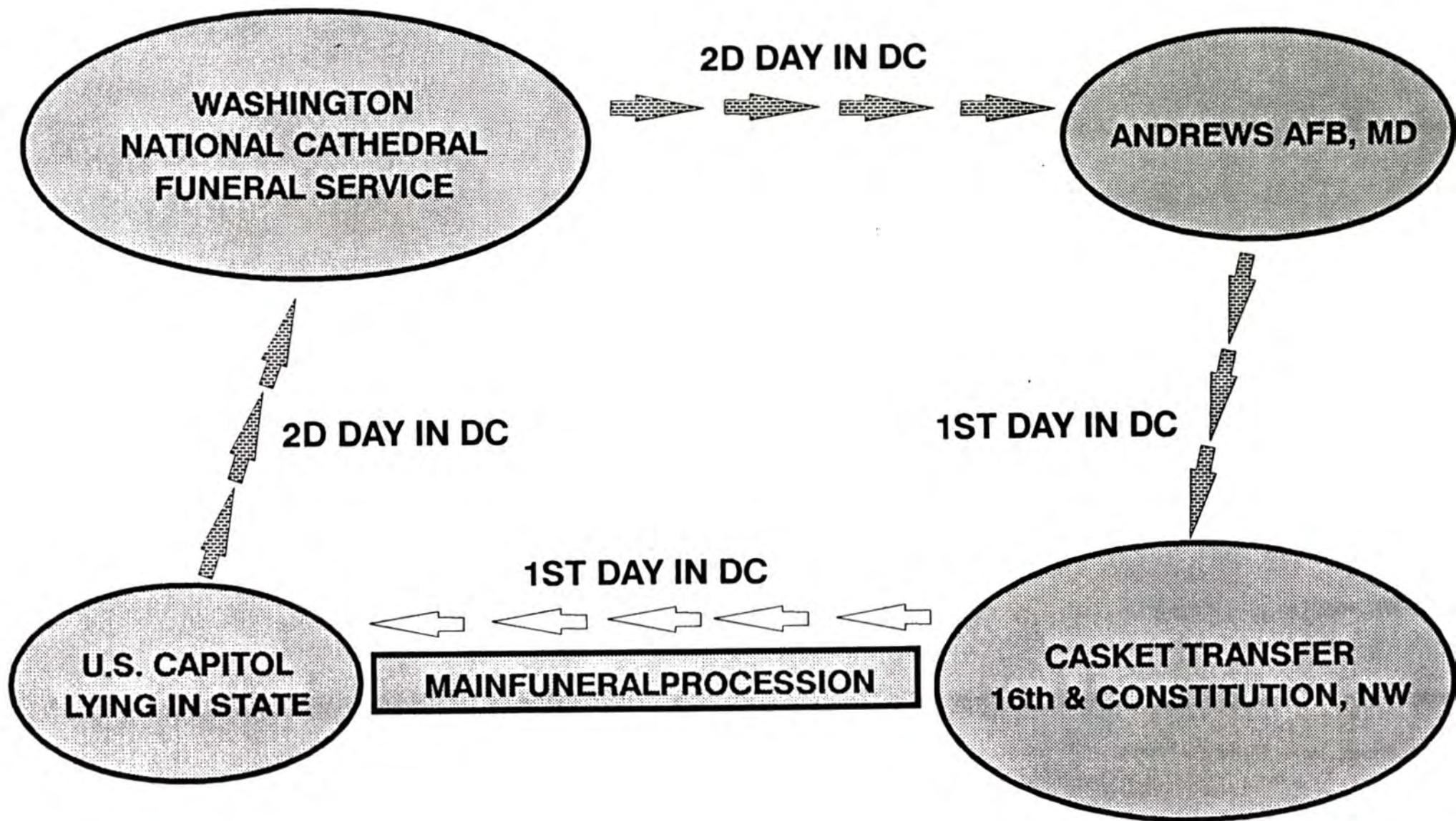


SEQUENCE 1 STATE FUNERAL FORMER PRESIDENT



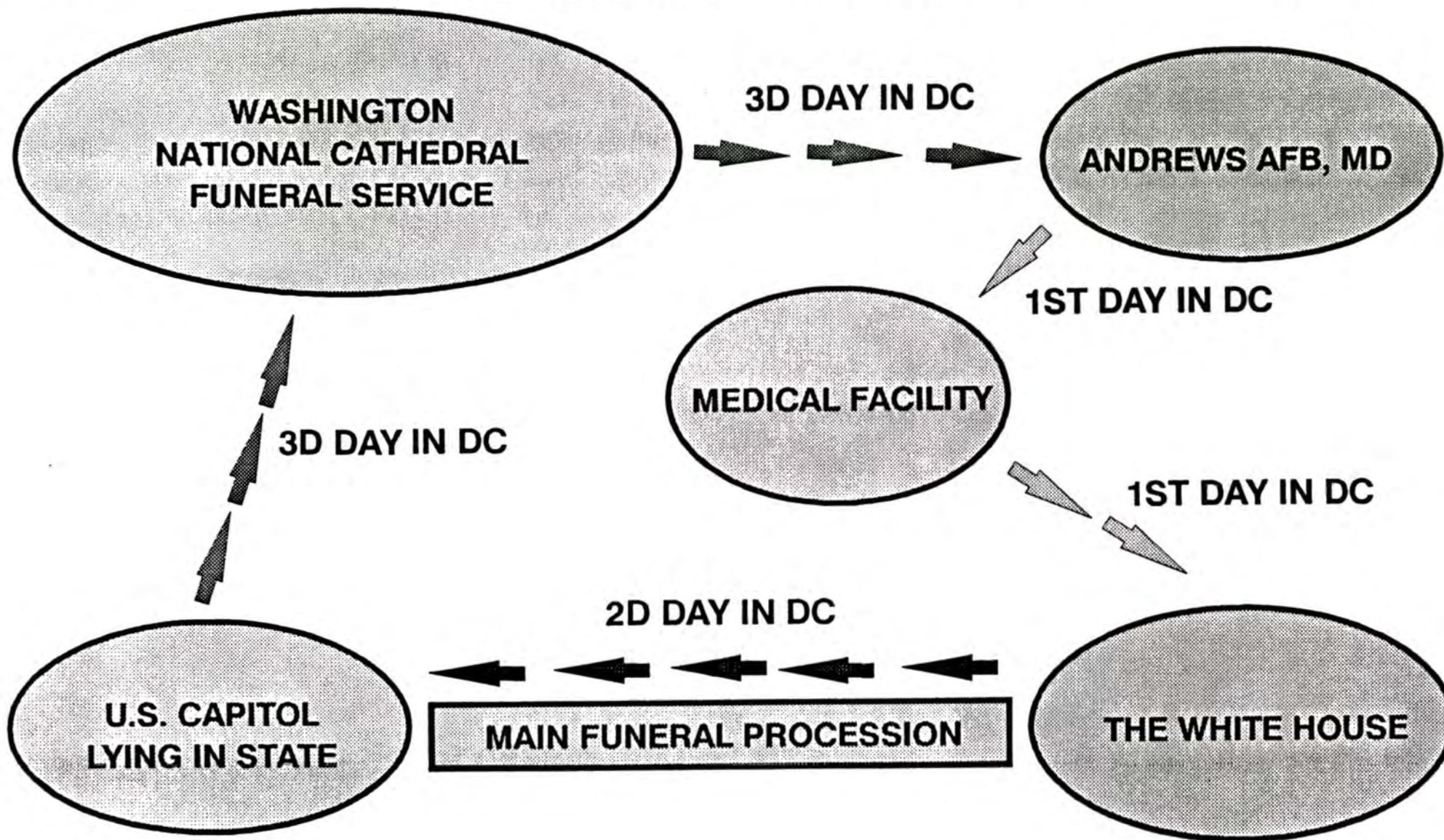

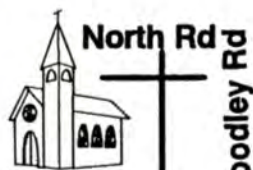


**Primary Route

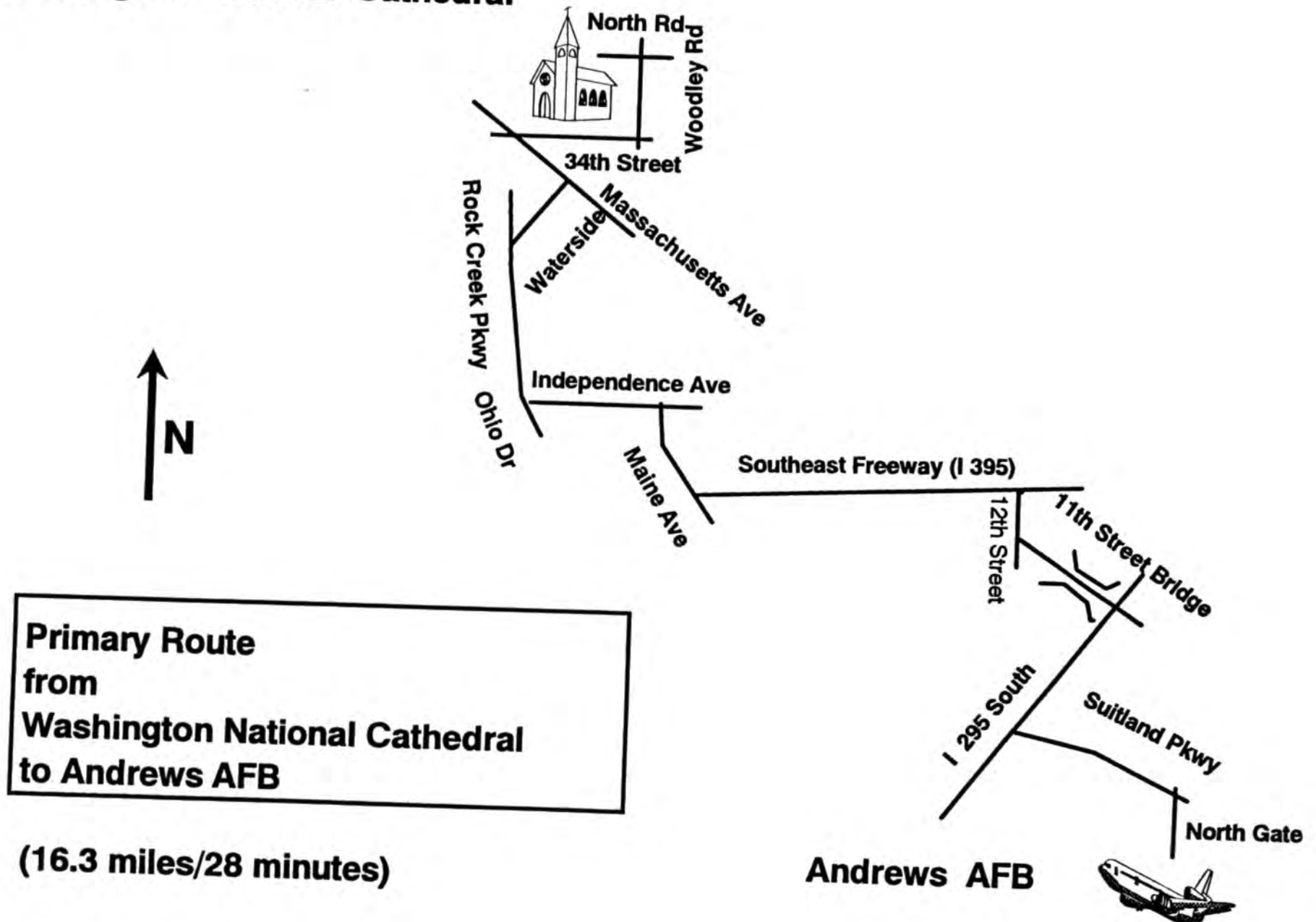

SUBJECT: Contingency Plan for the Death of
Former President Johnson

Pending a final approval by the Johnson family of the ceremonies to be held on the occasion of the death of former President Johnson, the Military District of Washington, which will have the overall responsibility for the ceremonial aspects of the funeral in the District of Columbia, and the Office of Protocol are proceeding on the assumption that the funeral will follow in general the arrangements made at the time of the death of General Eisenhower. Therefore, there will undoubtedly be a number of last minute revisions which we will have to incorporate in the enclosed contingency plan just as soon as we learn the wishes of the Johnson family about the funeral arrangements in Washington and the internment ceremonies elsewhere.

The draft telegrams, notes, and statements included herewith should be reviewed and recleared at the time of President Johnson's death.

You may wish to make copies of this plan available to the Principals and to the White House.

(Prepared by S/S-O on March 5, 1970)

A. Concept

The overall responsibility for the Johnson funeral arrangements lies with the Military District of Washington for those ceremonies which are scheduled to be held in the District of Columbia. The Department's Office of Protocol will have the primary responsibility for the foreign affairs aspects of the funeral in Washington and will work in close conjunction with the Military District of Washington.

The death of former President Johnson and the subsequent funeral ceremonies could place a significant burden on the Department's resources for several days. While the level of activity is not expected to approach that experienced during the Eisenhower funeral, we should be prepared for the possibility that a substantial number of foreign delegates and other foreign dignitaries will come to the US to attend the funeral. It would be prudent, therefore, to follow the procedures which were established at the time of the Kennedy and Eisenhower funerals when special task forces were established in the Operations Center to coordinate the flow of information relating to foreign participation in the ceremonies and to assist the Principals and the Chief of Protocol in making the appropriate arrangements for these participants.

B. Scenario

1. Alerts

When S/S-O has received a confirmed report of President Johnson's death, the Watch should alert the Department officers specified in Tab A.

2. Telegram Readdressal

A request for the readdressal of incoming and outgoing telegrams on this subject (Tab B) should be tubed by the Watch to OC/T.

3. Circular Telegram Reporting Death

An immediate circular telegram (Tab C) reporting the death and arrangements for the 30-day mourning period will be dispatched by S/S or (during non-working hours) by S/S-O

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after telephone clearances by S/S, S/CPR and the White House. This telegram should be sent promptly and, if feasible, within an hour after receipt of the death report.

4. Circular Telegram on Funeral Arrangements

An immediate circular telegram (Tab D) on the funeral arrangements should be dispatched by S/S after clearance by S/CPR and the White House. If the death report is received during non-working hours, S/S-O should consult by telephone with the Senior S/S Duty Officer and with the S/CPR Duty Officer in order to fill in the blanks and to prepare the telegram for final telephonic clearance with the White House and dispatch to the field as rapidly as possible.

5. Special Notifications on Behalf of the Family

At the request of the Johnson family the Department will transmit cables inviting to the Washington ceremonies a number of world leaders and foreign friends of the former President. These telegrams will be transmitted by S/CPR as soon as possible after the death report is received.

6. Establishment of the Task Force

A task force will be promptly set up in the Operations Center Map Room to coordinate the receipt, processing and distribution of all information relating to foreign participation in the funeral ceremonies.

(NOTE: S/S-S will be responsible for handling all messages of condolence.)

Under the guidance of the Executive Secretary, the S/S-O Director will manage the Task Force which will include representatives of S/CPR, the five regional bureaus, O, SY, IO, P, VO and USIA. The regional bureaus will provide needed secretarial assistance.

a) As necessary, the task force will work around the clock for the duration of the funeral ceremonies.

b) Upon initiation of operations, the task force will inform the White House Situation Room, NMCC, USIA and CIA Operations Centers, and all interested Department bureaus and offices of the scope of its activities, phone numbers, etc.

10. Diplomatic Notes

S/CPR will dispatch notes (Tab H) to the Chiefs of Mission and representatives on the Council of the OAS informing them of the funeral arrangements.

11. Role of the Principals

There will likely be some demands on the time of the Principal Officers of the Department as a result of the Johnson ceremonies.

a) Arrivals and Departures. The Office of the Chief of Protocol (assisted by representatives of the regional bureaus and in some cases military officers provided by the JCS) will have primary responsibility for meeting and seeing off foreign delegates and dignitaries. In the case of particularly high-ranking delegates, it might be appropriate for one of the Department's Principals to perform this role.

b) Bilateral Meetings. While we would not wish to encourage requests by foreign delegates and dignitaries for meetings with high-level US officials, a certain number of meetings might materialize. Therefore, the Secretary and the other Principals should be prepared to participate in such meetings, as appropriate.

c) Protocol Assignments. Supported by the special task force in S/S-O, the Office of the Chief of Protocol will play the central role in directing the participation of foreign delegates and other foreign dignitaries in the funeral ceremonies, including the memorial service in Washington to which the Diplomatic Corps (Mission Chiefs) may be expected to be invited.

You should neither encourage nor discourage other governments sending special delegations, as opposed to designating their resident ambassador as their representative at any of the Washington ceremonies noted above. If special representatives are designated, however, and we assume there will be such representatives coming from a number of foreign states, we will need soonest from you the following information:

- A. Names and titles of official delegation.
- B. Arrival times and means of transportation.
- C. Housing for delegation. (We assume that at least Chief of delegation will stay at respective embassy residence. If this is not the case, we assume local embassies will make arrangements.)

8. Department will also want to be informed at earliest time if there are indications that meetings with US officials will be requested by members of special delegations. We do not wish to encourage such requests.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

To President Johnson, the "American Dream" was not a catch phrase -- it was a reality of his own life. He believed in America -- in what America could mean to all of its citizens and what America could mean to the world. In the service of that faith, he gave himself completely.

In over thirty years of public life, he knew times of triumph and times of despair -- he knew controversy and adulation. Yet, no matter what the mood of the moment, at the center of his public life -- and at the center of his spirit -- was an unshakable conviction in the essential rightness of the American experience.

As I said at the dedication of the Lyndon B. Johnson Library, he was a "partisan of principle." He was a dynamic leader, a unique personality and a man of great ability and unshakable courage.

Twenty-eight days ago, America lost one of its greatest Presidents, Harry S. Truman, a man whose stature has grown enormously as we have gained more perspective on his achievements.

It is particularly heartbreaking that even as our flags fly at half-staff in President Truman's memory, another of our leaders has fallen. Yet just as their names are linked in death, I believe that America will come to understand that they are also joined in greatness.

In this sad hour, as we mourn the loss of two great leaders, all Americans realize more than ever their debt to those who have gone before, and their obligation to carry on the work which they advanced with such devotion.

In my Inaugural Address just two days ago I spoke of how my thoughts went back to those who stood in that place before me and of the dreams they had for America. No man had greater dreams for America than Lyndon Johnson. Even as we mourn his death, we are grateful for his life, which did so much to make those dreams into realities. And we know that as long as this Nation lives, so will his dreams and his accomplishments.

ON THE DEATH OF LYNDON B. JOHNSON,
FORMER PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

I am profoundly saddened by the death this evening of former President Lyndon B. Johnson.

The country, indeed the world, has lost one of the great leaders of contemporary history; a man of the people, a man of extraordinary vision; a man of action, and a man who reflected and gave substance to the pulse of our generation. He devoted a lifetime of service to the ideals of a greater society.

We who knew him will treasure separate memories of the man. Mine will be his success in achieving passage of the landmark civil rights bill of 1957, the first such legislation in almost a century and the harbinger of what was still to come during his Presidency.

We must all be particularly saddened in light of our current negotiations that he did not live to see peace restored to Indochina.

On frequent occasions during the last four years I had the privilege and enjoyed the satisfaction of discussing many matters of current international interest with him. He unfailingly gave his patriotic support to the goals of this nation. The world will be the less without him.

Mrs. Rogers, those who served him in the Department of State, and I extend our heartfelt condolences to Mrs. Johnson and her family.

ANNOUNCING THE DEATH OF LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

TO THE PEOPLE OF THE UNITED STATES:

It is my sad duty to announce officially the death of Lyndon Baines Johnson, the thirty-sixth President of the United States, on January 22, 1973.

President Johnson served his country for more than thirty years as Congressman, Senator, Vice President and President. Yet it can be said of Lyndon Johnson that he served his country all his life, for his was a complete and wholehearted love of our Nation. From his early days as a teacher, to his last days as a distinguished elder statesman, he did his best to make the promise and the wonder of America become as real in the lives of all his countrymen as it was in his own.

He once said that he was a free man, an American, a United States Senator, and a Democrat, in that order. He was also a great patriot.

Although he will no longer walk among us, Lyndon Johnson's influence on our times, which often seemed so much larger than life, cannot be stolen from us by death. Not only the things that he did, but also the spirit with which he did them, will be remembered long after time heals our sorrow at his leaving.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICHARD NIXON, President of the United States of America, in tribute to the memory of President Johnson, and as an expression of public sorrow, do hereby direct that the flag of the United States be displayed at half-staff at the White House and on all buildings, grounds, and Naval vessels of the United States for a period of thirty days from the day of his death. I also direct that for the same length of time the representatives of the United States in foreign countries shall make similar arrangements for the display of the flag at half-staff over their Embassies, Legations, and other facilities abroad, including all military facilities and stations.

I hereby order that suitable honors be rendered by units of the Armed Forces under orders of the Secretary of Defense on the day of the funeral.

I do further appoint January 25, 1973 to be a National Day of Mourning throughout the United States. I recommend that the people assemble on that day in their respective places of worship, there to pay homage to the memory of President Johnson. I invite the people of the world who share our grief to join us in this solemn observance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this twenty-third day of January in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred seventy-three and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred ninety-seventh.

TO THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES:

It is my sad duty to inform you officially of the death of Lyndon Baines Johnson, the thirty-sixth President of the United States.

His loss is especially poignant for all of us who knew him and worked with him in the House and Senate. It was there that he first became a legend and there that he began to influence our destiny as a great Nation.

Yet Lyndon Johnson's legacy extends far beyond his years in the Congress. He was a man of fierce devotion and love. He was devoted to his family. He was devoted to the cause of freedom and equality for his fellow man. And as President, he was devoted in a very special way to the land he loved.

The whole story of the Johnson years in the White House remains to be told, and history has yet to make its judgment. But millions of Americans will always remember a bitter day in November, 1963, when so many of our people doubted the very future of this Republic, when so many were stunned at the very idea that an American Chief of State could be assassinated in this age, and so many abroad were fearful about the future course of the American democracy. And Lyndon Johnson rose above the doubt and the fear to hold this Nation on course until we rediscovered our faith in ourselves.

If he had done no more, his place in history would have been assured. But he did much more, and his role then was not a high-water mark but a hallmark. For it was his noble and difficult destiny to lead America through a long, dark night of necessity at home and abroad. He had the courage to do what many of his contemporaries condemned him for, but what will surely win warm praise in the history books of tomorrow.

EXECUTIVE ORDER

PROVIDING FOR THE CLOSING OF GOVERNMENT
DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES ON THURSDAY, JANUARY 25, 1973

By virtue of the authority vested in me as President of the United States, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1. All executive departments, independent establishments, and other governmental agencies, including their field services, shall be closed on Thursday, January 25, 1973 as a mark of respect for Lyndon Baines Johnson, the thirty-ninth President of the United States. That day shall be considered as falling within the scope of 5 U.S.C. 6103 (b), and of all statutes so far as they relate to the compensation and leave of employees of the United States.

Section 2. The second sentence of Section 1 of this order shall not apply to those offices and installations, or parts thereof, in the Department of State, the Department of Defense, or other departments, independent establishments, and governmental agencies which the heads thereof determine should remain open for reasons of national security or defense or other public reasons.

- C. BIOGRAPHIC DATA.

WE ASSUME RESPECTIVE EMBASSIES IN WASHINGTON WILL PROVIDE HOUSING AND TRANSPORTATION FOR DELEGATIONS.

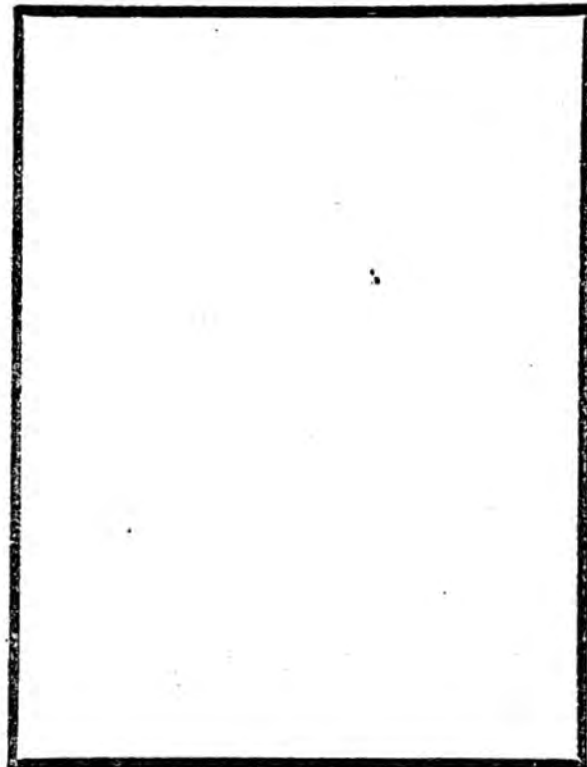
