They arrived at the main entrance of the National Gallery of Art on Constitution Avenue between 10:00 and 10:15 am.

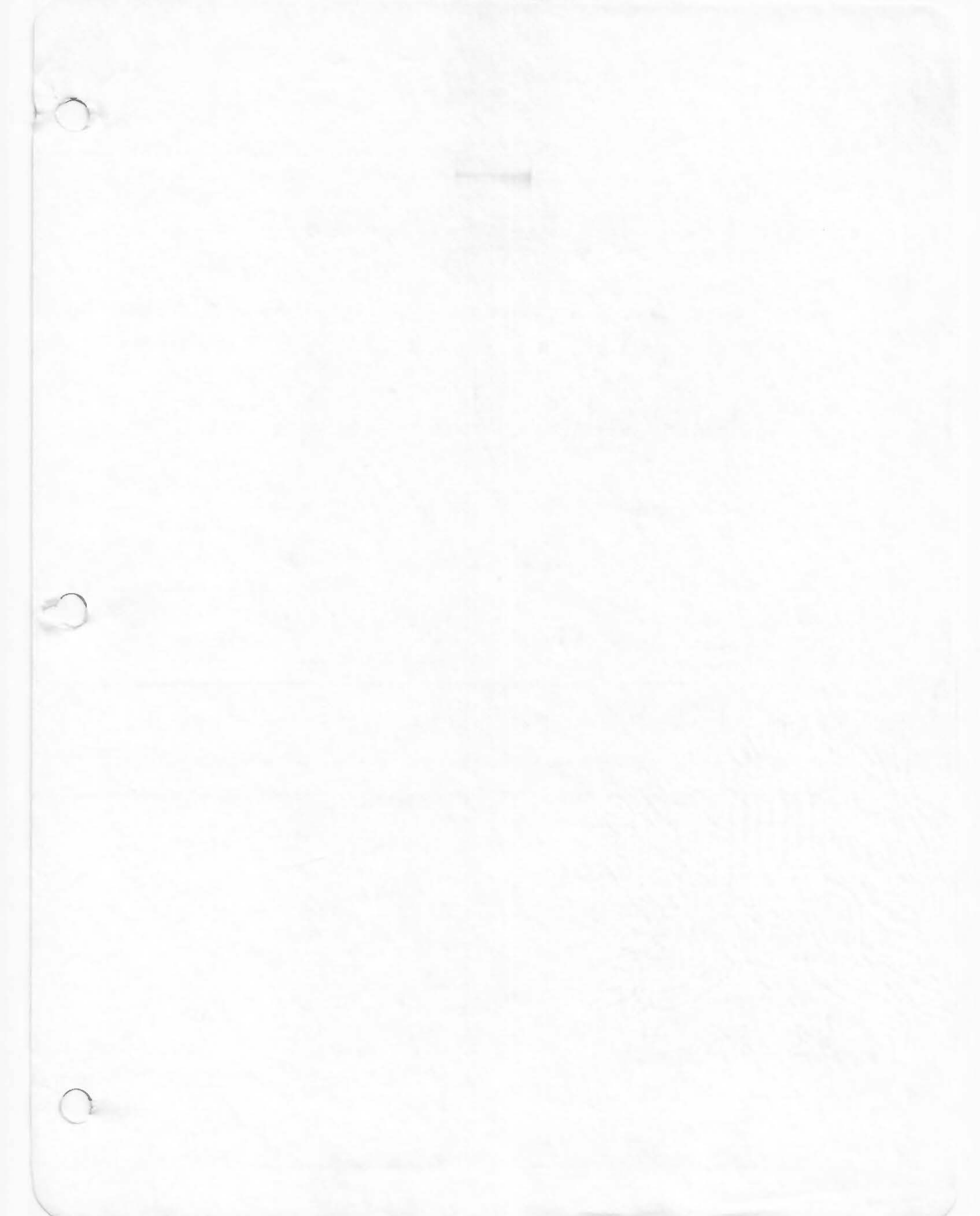
