The Secretary of the Treasury and Mrs. Anderson will be in Montreal the night before and will be escorted by Canadian authorities and will be taken to the Royal Tent to meet the Queen just prior to the arrival of the Secretary of the Army's aircraft. The American Ambassador to Canada and Mrs. Wigglesworth will also be brought out in advance.

9:45 A.M.

Her Majesty the Queen, the Duke of Edinburgh, the Canadian Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker arrive at RCAF Station, St. Hubert's

9:50 A.M.

The Secretary of the Army's aircraft arrives at St. Hubert's

On arrival, the personnel from the plane will be escorted to the Royal Tent where they will be introduced to Her Majesty, the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker. After this introduction, they will be escorted to their seats for the arrival ceremonies.

10:05 A.M.

The Columbine arrives at St. Hubert's.

As the Columbine wheels touch the ground, a 21-gun salute will be fired in honor of the President. The President and Mrs. Eisenhower will come down the ramp alone and will be met at the bottom of the ramp by the Queen, the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker.

After the President and Mrs. Eisenhower have been greeted by the Queen and her party, the other members of the President's party on board the Columbine will come down the ramp in order listed above and will be presented by the President to the Queen.

They, in turn, will go down the short receiving line and will be greeted by the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker. They will then be escorted to their seats, and the President and Mrs. Eisenhower, the Queen, the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker will go to the dais.

On their arrival at the dais the Guard of Honor band will play the Star Spangled Banner, and the President will then inspect the Honor Guard, returning at the conclusion of the inspection to the dais.

10:20 A.M.

The President and Mrs. Eisenhower and the Queen and the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker, following the President's return to the dais will then enter the Royal Tent, and the other guests will leave their seats and enter automobiles for the six-mile trip to the Seaway dedication site. Car numbers will be supplied later.

All guests will leave St. Hubert's airport in advance of the Queen and the President. The trip will take approximately twenty minutes.

10:30 A.M.

The President and Mrs. Eisenhower, the Queen and the Prince, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker leave St. Hubert's.

In this motorcade the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker will be in the first car, Mrs. Eisenhower and the Prince in the second car, the President and the Queen in the third car.

The President's car will be followed by the Secret Service car. The Secret Service car will be followed by staff cars carrying members of the President's staff and the Queen's staff.

- 10:50 A.M. The President's and the Queen's party arrives at St. Lambert Lock.
- 11:00 A.M. Formal opening ceremony of the St. Lawrence Seaway.
- Short speeches by United States and Canada heads of the Seaway, followed by brief remarks by the President and the Queen.
- 11:20 A.M. Similar to the procedure followed at St. Hubert's Airport, the honor guests going on board the Britannia will leave the site first and be taken to the Britannia a half a mile away where they will immediately board the yacht. (This is different than the usual protocol, but it is necessary because of the crowded conditions.)

12:45 P.M. Leave St. Lambert Lock - Proceed through channel

3:15 P.M. Enter Lake St. Louis - Naval review in Lake

4:40 P.M. Enter Beauharnois Lock

5:00 P.M. The President and Mrs. Eisenhower, the Prime Minister and Mrs. Diefenbaker and the Presidential party will disembark from the Britannia. Those returning with the President on the Presidential aircraft will be helicoptered from Beauharnois Lock to St. Hubert's airfield.
