SUBJECT:

Election Night Data System

The purpose of our election night reporting system will be to collect data upon which interpretative judgments will be made regarding the returns. It is not our intention to compete with the networks in calling the election or in providing comprehensive election returns. However, in this regard, I have made arrangements to be in direct contact with ABC and CBS which should provide early information on the network returns.

We will be collecting the following types of data:

1. Turnout estimates. These will be made at approximately 1:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M. EST. They will necessarily have to rely on the judgment of local election officials as we checked about 100 counties and found only two or three that could provide previous turnout data by time of day.
2. State returns and county data on important counties in major SMSA's. (The List of Counties is shown in Attachment A.)
3. Precinct data from selected precincts for important demographic characteristics. [A partial list of precincts (85%) is shown in Attachment B):

- B. Working youth
- C. Ethnicity
 - Irish
 - Polish
 - Italian
- D. Jewish
- E. Spanish-Americans
- F. Union Members (Including UAW)
- G. WASP (Midwest Upper Middle and Yankee)

5. News wire services (Special political and regular wires).
6. Opinion leader comments solicited by Bob Finch and Herb Klein.

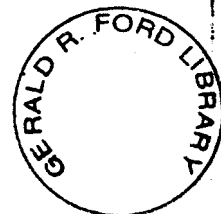

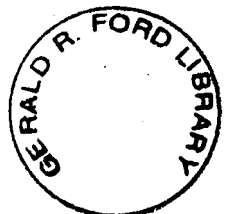

ATTACHMENT C

DATA FLOW

State - Counties - Precincts

(10 Persons Required)

1. Output Device from Shoreham

Two persons tear off the computer sheets and hand to transcription desk organized by state.

2. Transcription Desk

The states will be organized into six groups which will be the responsibility of six separate transcribers. Each transcriber will match the computer sheets with past voting data sheets and copy the computer output on to the past voting sheet. The completed sheets will then move to the xerox, filing and delivery desk.

3. Xerox - File - Delivery Desk

Ten persons will be responsible to receive the completed data sheets, to xerox three copies, file one copy with the master file and then deliver a copy to the analysts and a copy to the inquiry desk.

Opinion Leaders

(5 Secretaries Needed)

1. A pool of five secretaries will receive dictated opinion leader reports, type the reports and deliver to xerox desk.
2. Forms will be xeroxed, filed, and delivered as with state data.

News Wires

(3 Persons Required)

1. UPI political wire will be completely xeroxed and delivered to Teeter, analysts, and inquiry desk.
2. Forms from regular news wire will be completed as necessary and sent to xerox desk.
3. Xerox - File - Deliver.

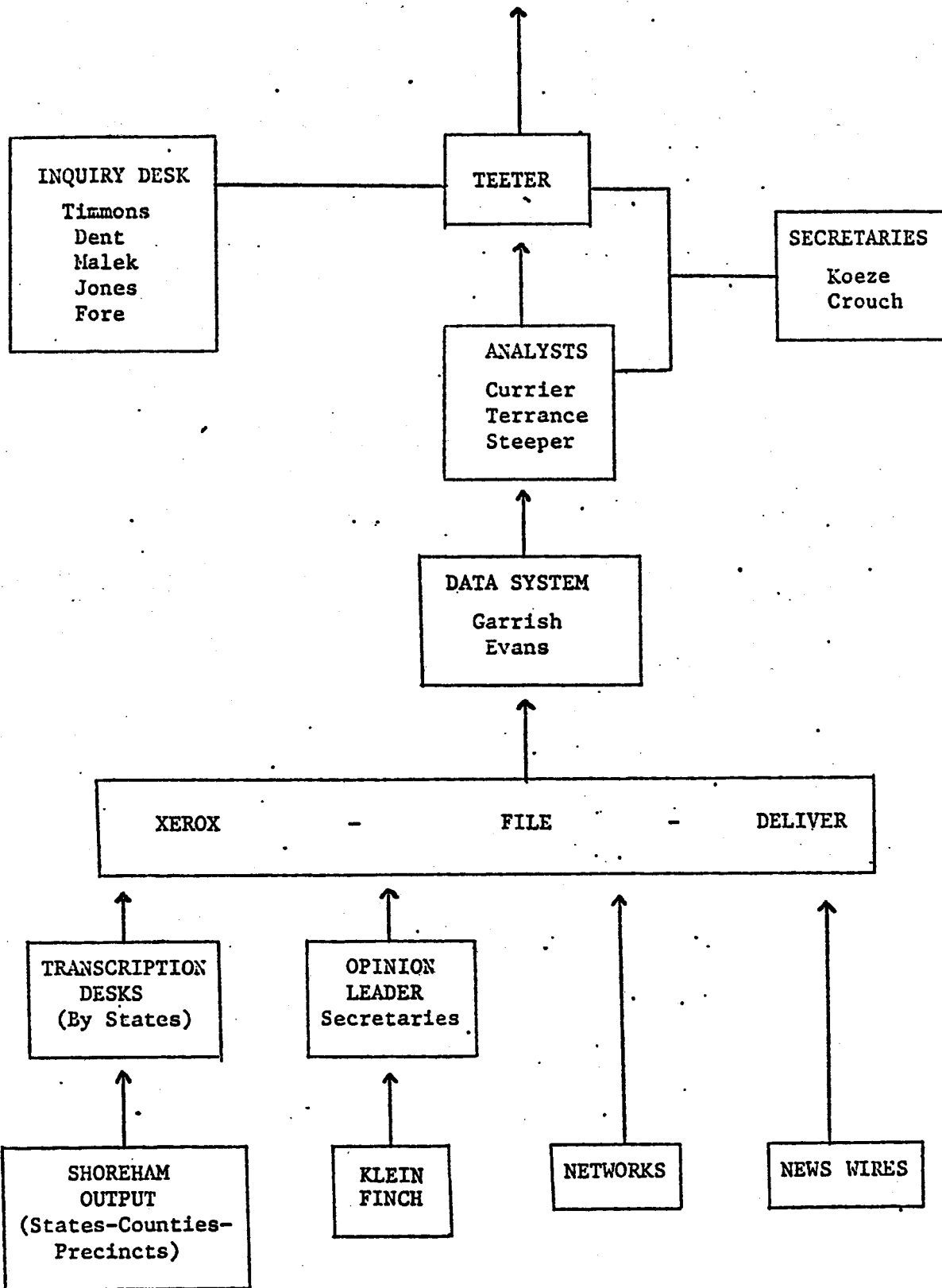

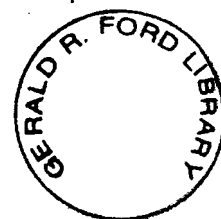
