SUBJECT: CLEAN AIR ACT AMENDMENTS --
ERC DISCUSSION

At this morning's meeting of the EPB/ERC, Russ Train gave a long summary of the status of Clean Air Act Amendments on the Hill (but no new information). Frank Zarb and several others responded with expressions of concern about:

- The substance of the bill that might reach the President's desk.
- An alleged absence of responsibility for pulling together Administration position and coordinating Administration attempts to "reduce the wreckage."

Secretary Richardson indicated that a sub-group of the ERC should get together consisting at least of FEA, EPA, Interior and OMB. John Hill pointed out that Bill Gorog was coordinating some of the Administration efforts, including preparation of responses to some questions on auto emission standards for Congressman Dingell.

There did not appear to be any clear signal as to who was going to coordinate the effort. No one mentioned the Domestic Council.

RECOMMENDATION

That you talk with Frank Zarb on the matter if you wish to have Domestic Council staff play a major role in the effort.
