The San Antonio Police Officers' Association with its' 1100 members, stand ready to oppose any candidate now or in the future who would see fit to raise the tax burden on us.

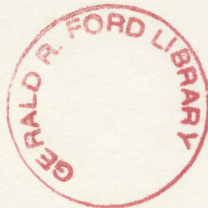
Again, we beg you to reconsider this sir-tax increase, an assist the front line of defense, "The Police Officer".
