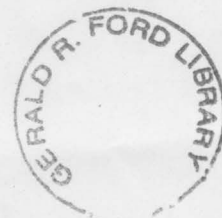
SUBJECT: Proposed Agenda for Tomorrow's Briefing Session

Tomorrow, June 8th, the invitees are to assemble in your office. When all are present, we shall officially convene in conference room 444 (EOB).

I propose that we have guest speakers from 1) HUD (to discuss housing), 2) Labor (to discuss jobs--I would prefer someone from the Manpower Administration and not Art Fletcher or John Wilks), 3) Commerce - OMBE (to discuss business development) and 4) Justice/HEW (to discuss the drug programs).
