OBITUARY

LEWIS A. SCOTT was a native of Edwards, Miss. He was born September 3, 1905 as the third son of the late Rev. W. A. Scott and Mrs. W. A. Scott who survives him. He died in Atlanta, Ga., January 24, 1972.

He was educated in the public schools of Jackson, Miss. and Johnson City, Tenn. He attended college at Tennessee A. & I. State University at Nashville.

In 1929 about a year after the Atlanta World began as a weekly newspaper in August of 1928, he aided his late brother, W. A. Scott II in establishing the Birmingham World in 1930. Four years later he worked for the Memphis World, but after a few years he returned to the Birmingham paper as circulation manager. He held this position until he came to Atlanta in 1965 on account of illness and lived with a younger brother, E. J. Scott, Sr. until his death.

Immediate survivors: a son, Stanley S. Scott of Washington, D.C.; three daughters, Mrs. Doris Lake of Boliver Tenn., Mrs. Clinora Gary and Mrs. Kay Strayhorn, both of Chicago, Ill.; a mother, Mrs. W. A. Scott Sr., 93; four brothers, C. A. Scott, E. J. Scott Sr., Aurelius S. Scott and Daniel S. Scott; three sisters, Mrs. Vashti S. Ellis, Mrs. Ruth S. Simmons and Mrs. Esther S. Carter of Dayton, Ohio.

I trust you and all members of your families are well and Christmas is an enjoyable season. May the New Year bring you and yours good health, happiness and prosperity.

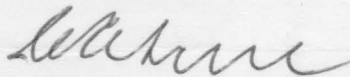
I am optimistic about the future despite the difficulty with the North Vietnamese Communists.
