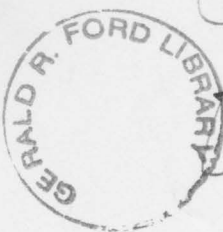

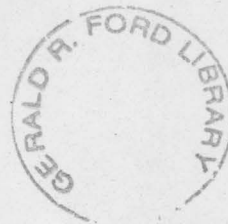
Since the beginning of President Ford's Administration, our office has served as a central coordinating point for Administration activities and programs of special interest to Black Americans, and as the principal liaison between the Administration and the Black community.

In response to your request today, May 14, our office handles more than 50 telephone calls and receives at least 25 pieces of problem-oriented correspondence every day. In addition to the three to five office visitors we receive each day representing City Councils, civic and social groups, our office is in constant communication with the leadership of the major civil rights, business and community groups in America. I think the records will show that visitor traffic to our office is among the highest of any White House office. In the midst of the above mentioned daily activity, our office has conducted more than a dozen Executive Branch meetings and luncheons involving some 500 people, during the period from March 22 - May 13.

Descriptions of the principal objectives of this office, a review of their current status, and recommendations for enhancing their effectiveness are contained herein.

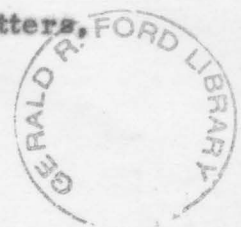

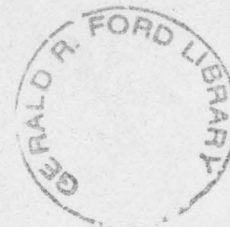
