The latest is your reported endorsement of a newly introduced postal reform bill H.R. 15430 which would aid in putting all post office workers under compulsory unionism.

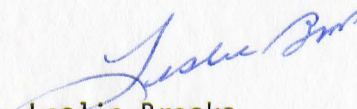
If the ultimate of the loss of freedom to join or not join a union is obtained neither the presidency nor congress elected by the people will have any say so.
