SUBJECT: Policy on Consultative "T-Force" Help from Major
"Foreign Policy" Councils -- The Atlantic Council

The enclosed letter is typical of a variety of recent calls, letters, or conferences from various "Policy" groups. They have learned that there are agencies working in domestic affairs, but not to their benefit, in foreign affairs.

I have indicated that we utilized a variety of means for keeping abreast of foreign affairs, and that should be done personally, or through the Secretary of State when he is appointed, to take advantage of their offer for help, if an appropriate person would be interested in them.

Because of the importance of some of these groups, professionally and publicly, I am wondering whether you might wish to consider involving any of them in formal and/or informal reports to be available to you and the Secretary. Cultivating this wider base will be essential to developing support for policies you will wish to initiate in Washington. Since I have professional contact with many of these groups, I would be pleased to do anything you might wish to initiate.
