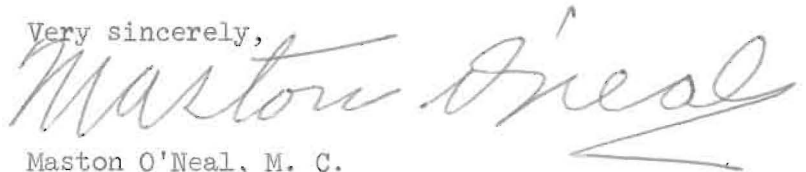
Dear Mr. President-Elect:
