I understand that in NY City alone, there are about 800,000 families on welfare.--about 600,000 chiselers.

I am in the employment business, and know whereof I speak. In today's NY Times there are at least 100,000 jobs. This does not take into account, the tens of thousands available for carpenters, brick layers, electricians, mechanics, painters, plasterers, laborers, etc etc etc

I will advertise File Clerks at \$5 dollars per week, messengers (retired) at \$20. mail room clerks at \$5. clerks at \$20. etc etc jobs which any one can fill, without a single taker. The applicants will ask for our card and show it to the unemployment to get their check.

I was recently called before a Referee, because I refused to register an employee, who left, for unemployment benefits. I explained to the referee that the employee was a school teacher and that there scores of jobs available at \$6000 and \$7000. Referee ruled she didn't have to take a job if she didn't want to.

Students and Policemen Battle as Demonstrations Hit 12 Schools in 4 Boroughs

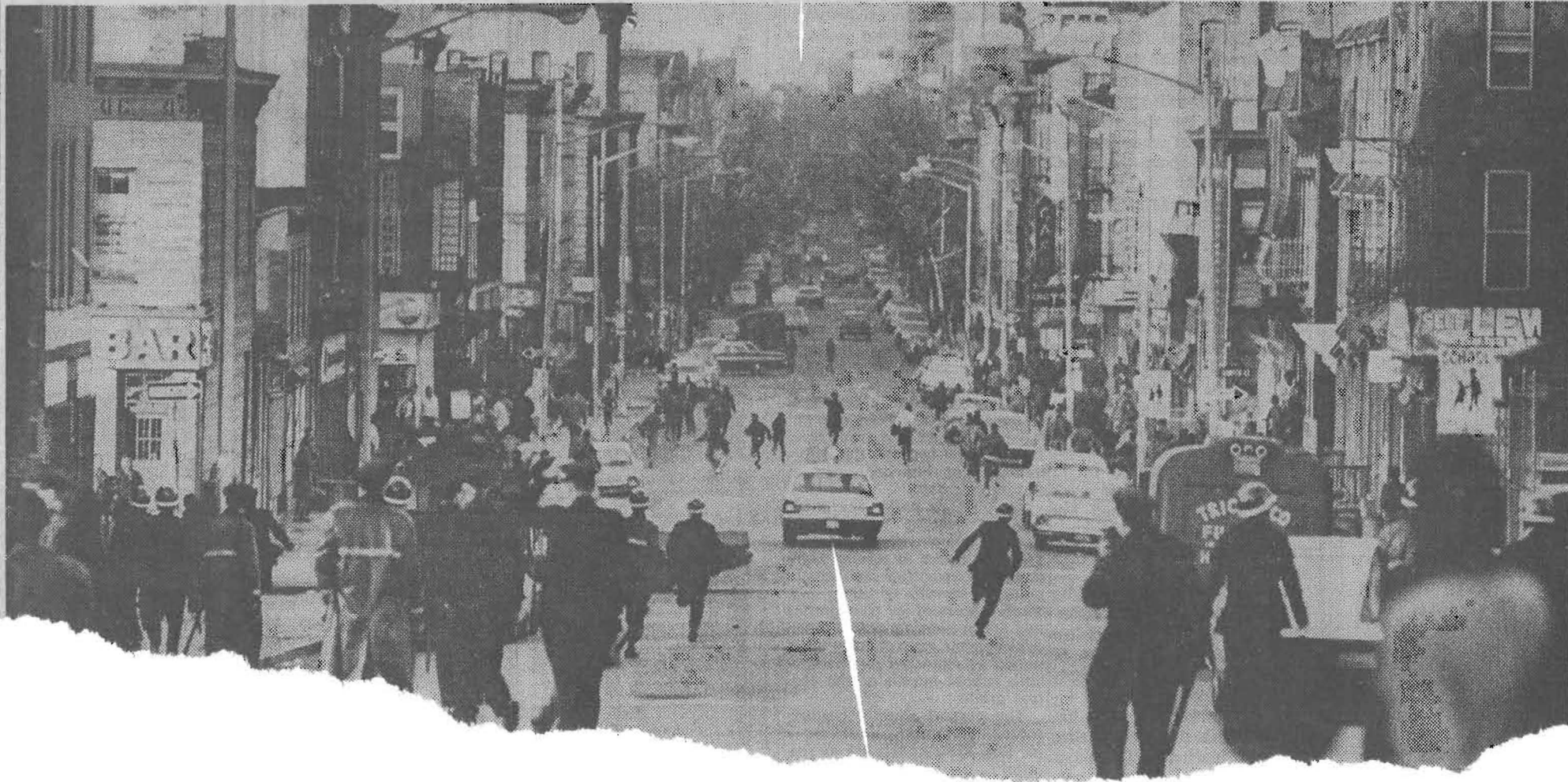

ing high-school students, boys and four girls were arrested for unlawful assembly in the Lower East Side after they were rushing along Hester, Ward, Essex and Delancey streets knocking over people and stealing from stores.

The day's demonstrations were led as an effort by the 12-year-old Citywide Student Committee to shut down high schools. The committee operated out of offices lent by the African-American Teachers Association.

Leaflets circulated by student pickets, the group demanded an end to the 45-minute extra school sessions. The sessions were aimed at making up for time lost during three recent citywide teacher strikes.

The leaflets also demanded representation in all policy-making in the school system, and community control of



their quarry on the heads and kicking them.

Several policemen picked up rocks and threw them back into the student ranks. One mustached policeman picked up a lead pipe that had been thrown and brandished it along with his nightstick while he chased a youth.

One running youth was pushed by a policeman and tripped, and another policeman clubbed him on the head, drawing blood. The youth yelled at the policeman, who pushed him again and then kicked him, and the youth ran away.

At Christopher Columbus High School, 925 Astor Avenue, the Bronx, Edward R. Kolvezon, the principal, estimated that 250 of 4,700 students demonstrated outside.

Eggs were flung at Mr. Kolvezon and his assistant principal, Nathan Shafran, as they stood on the front steps to talk to the demonstrators. During the picketing a small fire was set in front of the school, and some youths tossed books and class schedules into the flames.

A Police Headquarters tally last night showed 10 arrests in the Ocean Hill-Brownsville area, four at Wingate High, five at George Washington High School in Manhattan and one each in Midwood High School in Brooklyn and St.

New Interior Secretary Has Feuded With Eskimos

WASHINGTON — Several senators, both Republicans and Democrats, are taking a close look at the man whom Robert O. Anderson, head of Atlantic-Richfield Oil, recommended to Richard Nixon as secretary of the interior. The closer they look, the more they conclude that Nixon picked a lulu.

Gov. Walter Hickel is not only a close pal of the big oil companies who will be in a position to be generous with his pals, but he is no pal of the Eskimos and Indians. Yet as secretary of the interior he will handle the affairs of all the Indians of the United States and indirectly influence the lives of the Eskimos.

In this connection, the most interesting incident in Governor Hickel's career is his crackdown last summer on an Eskimo fishing cooperative at Kuskokwim, where he used state police and state officials to try to prevent an Eskimo co-op from selling its salmon catch to a Japanese freezer ship.

The full story of what happened is difficult to believe. It shows, however, that the governor resorted to the high-handed methods of Mafia hijackers. His men tried to board the ship, until the Japanese captain refused to be intimidated. They then buzzed the ship with a plane. Again the ship refused to be scared away.

Governor Hickel then claimed that the ship was entering Alaskan waters without authority. The State Department, however, ruled otherwise. It stated that the ship had been cleared by the American consul in Kobe, had been inspected by U.S. Customs, Health, Immigration, and the Department of Agri-

culture, and was entitled to pick up Alaskan fish.

Gov. Hickel also claimed publicly the ship was violating the North Pacific Fishing Treaty. Again the State Department said no.

The story of Hickel's shocking behavior dates back to 1967 when Alaskan Eskimos, who had been netting around \$500 a year from their salmon catch, organized a cooperative with the encouragement of Sargent Shriver's Office of Economic Opportunity. They were aided also by the Alaska State Community Action Agency and the Alaska Legal Services, which works for OEO.

FIRST, they built a small cold storage plant at Bethel, where their fish could be stored to be marketed at higher prices later instead of selling immediately at the whim of Seattle buyers. The latter have taken advantage of Eskimo fishermen by buying salmon at around 15 cents a pound with no extra price paid for roe.

Toward the end of the fishing season, furthermore, the Seattle buyers move on to other areas, and the Eskimo fishermen are left with no market at all. They must dry their catch and eat it themselves during the winter.

However, the cold storage plant at Bethel, built by the Kuskokwim co-op, mysteriously burned down. So this year the Eskimos, with the help of Alaska Legal Services, signed a joint contract with Mitsubishi International and Kyokuyo Hoge Ltd.

The contract provided for buying the entire salmon catch of the Kuskokwim Eskimos at a price of 33 cents a pound for dressed king sal-

mon and 23 cents for dressed silver salmon. This was double the price previously paid by Seattle middlemen. In addition, salmon eggs were to be purchased for 40 cents a pound.

But when the Akitsu Maru arrived to pick up the salmon catch last June, Governor Hickel reacted as if he were faced with another Pearl Harbor. Completely ignoring the fact that his own Anchorage Natural Gas Company sells liquid gas to Tokyo, he seemed to think it was against the law for Eskimo fishermen to sell fish to Japan.

In Washington, officials encourage the sale of Northwest lumber to Japan, plus several million bushels of American wheat. It all helps the American balance of payments. So does the sale of Alaskan salmon to Japan.

The governor, however, seemed to consider himself above the law.

When the captain of the Akitsu Maru refused to be intimidated by Hickel's 10-man task force of state officials, the governor called Mitsubishi officials into a secret conference in Juneau.

"We asked that representatives of the Eskimo co-op sit in on the conference," said William Jacobs of the Alaska Legal Services. "But we were refused. It was a star chamber proceeding."

"I personally talked to the governor for 15 minutes by telephone. He refused to listen to any arguments. He seemed intent on protecting the Seattle middlemen."

"After representatives of Mitsubishi and the Japanese co-op had sat with the governor for three hours," said Jacobs, "they came out and handed us a note that they were

not going to buy any more fish. We have sued the Japanese for breach of contract, but it will take a long time to iron this out in the courts. Meanwhile, the Eskimo fishermen, who thought they had a contract to sell all their season's catch, are now left with a lot of spoiled fish on their hands. They flew several plane loads to Anchorage, but 4,000 pounds spoiled before they could get it frozen."

The Eskimos of Kuskokwim will now have to go back on federal and state relief to last out the winter. Had they gone through with their plan to sell their total catch to the Japanese, they would have made about \$2,000 a year per fisherman.

During the same week Governor Hickel was bulldozing the Eskimos, the House Appropriations Committee in Washington voted \$1 million to aid Alaska native fishermen. Of this, \$683,000 was for "welfare assistance to Alaskan natives affected by a tragic drop in the catch of fish" last summer. As secretary of the interior, Hickel will be in charge of distributing these funds to the fishermen he intimidated last summer.

Mr. Nixon's Good Fortune

Dear Editor:

Mr. Nixon has the extraordinary good fortune to follow one of the most disastrous administrations in American history. If Mr. Nixon is not exactly the soul of candor, his record is not a continuous thread of deceit as is that of Lyndon Johnson. If he ends his Presidency with a halo for uprightness and competence, he will owe it to his predecessor.

On the death of Mr. Kennedy, L.B.J. presided over the strongest, richest and one of the most idealistic nations in the world. Whereas at the Bay of Pigs Kennedy ruefully admitted his mistake and thereafter enjoyed an unprecedented popularity, Mr. Johnson's false pride kept him from correcting the great mistake of military intervention in an Asian war; his insistence that he has always been right, and history will enshrine him among the great, has kept up to the present time.

Mr. Nixon is indeed fortunate. The record he makes need not be perfect — it cannot help but shine by comparison.

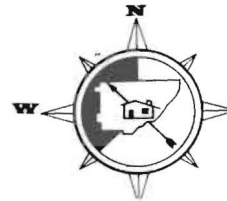
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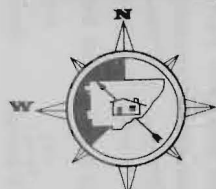

The N.W. Detroit Council was very active on behalf of residents. Under the leadership of chairman Henry Dodge, the Evergreen-Vassar and six Mile-Southfield homeowners were spared displacement by proposed City Public Housing units. Rosedale residents were spared Apartment re-zoning in the Florence-Evergreen corner. The pool issue for Stoepel Park was also resolved in the favor of adjacent property owners.

TAXES have hit Detroiters very hard. Homeowners have not recovered from the state "equalization assessment" yet. Motorists have been paying a higher gasoline tax, up to 11¢ per gallon, plus state sales tax. In two weeks, when Passenger car License Plates go on sale for 1969, fees go UP about 60%.

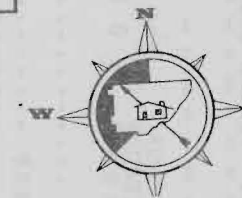

Dear Dick:

We are relieved that you made it this time. The country could not have stood eight years of Humphrey; or even four years. I am not sure it has stood the years of Roosevelt, Truman, Kennedy and Johnson.

We have believed, and shall continue to believe, that the Kennedy people stole the 1960 election from you. This time we were apprehensive down to the last count; the big-city Democrats are an unscrupulous lot, and they seem to be more imaginative than Republicans.

So you will become President on 20 January. I could say a lot and probably shall, but it can all be summed up in two words: be President. The government has a monopoly of force; if the people who would wreck the country or change its form radically or violently compel you to use it, use it. Don't hide behind an appropriation; money, or another law, generally is not the answer. Don't pay blackmail in any form, internally or externally. Blackmail leads to more blackmail, as we have demonstrated over and over and over. You can't buy friends and keep them bought, domestically or internationally. The Goodtime Charlie school of diplomacy or of government does not work.

From the earliest days when we knew you as a young Congressman and later when you were a Senator, we have considered you bright, with a well organized mind. Left to yourself, you generally had the right answers. We think you will do all right as President if you do not take advice from the wrong sources, of which there will be plenty. Do always what you believe to be right, and you will not go astray.

We wish you well.
