Middle-Income Taxpayer Revolt Seen by Barr

WASHINGTON — Middle income taxpayers are likely to revolt unless the income tax system is reformed, Secretary of the Treasury Barr told Congress today.

"Our income-tax system needs major reforms now, as a matter of importance and urgency," Barr told the Senate-House Economic Committee.

OBSERVING that the system depends on the voluntary filing of reports by taxpayers, Barr said confidence in the fairness of the tax laws is essential. He continued:

"We face now the possibility of a taxpayer revolt if we do not soon make major reforms . . . the revolt will come not from the poor but from the tens of millions of middle-class families and individuals with incomes of \$7,000 to \$20,000, whose tax payments now generally are based on the full ordinary rates and who pay over half of our individual income taxes."

In 1967, Barr said, 155 tax returns on incomes above \$200,000, including 21 with income above \$1 million, resulted in no tax payments.

"People are concerned and indeed angered about high-income recipients who pay little or no federal income

tax," Barr continued.

HE DID NOT go into specifics about provisions the treasury wants changes. It has prepared recommendations, but has not yet made them public.

The recommendations will be given to Secretary-designate David Kennedy and "upon request, to the Congress," Barr said, adding:

"I believe public confidence in our income-tax system is threatened and that tax reform should be a top priority subject for the new administration and the 91st Congress."

Strikes Criticized

Postmaster General-designate Winton M. Blount said federal workers should engage in "true collective bargaining" with the government but should not be permitted to strike.

"I agree that public employes should not be allowed to strike," he replied to a question by Senator Hartke, Indiana Democrat, at a Senate committee hearing on his nomination.

Asked whether he feels employes should go to Congress seeking pay raises, Blount said he favors the collective bargaining approach but did not go into the subject in detail.
