4:00 p. m.

Dress: Business Suits for the men . . . Afternoon dresses for the ladies

Arrival of the Wedding Party:

2:00 p. m. The eight groomsmen, Ed, Howard, Mazie, Amy, and Beth will arrive through the Northwest Gate and will proceed to the North Portico.

Groomsmen, Ed, and Howard will proceed to the Ladies Mezzanine where they will dress for the wedding.

Bridesmaids will proceed to the 2nd floor (Lincoln Bedroom) where they will dress for the wedding.

3:00 p. m. Dr. Latch will arrive at the North Portico and will proceed to the Roosevelt Room in the West Wing.

3:00 p. m. Mr. and Mrs. Cox will arrive at the North Portico and will proceed to the Map Room.

When Howard and Ed are dressed, they will proceed to the Cabinet Room in the West Wing.

Arrival of Guests:

3:15 p. m. Guests will begin to arrive at the East Gate. They will be directed to the East Wing landing where they will surrender their admit cards just before entering the East Garden.

NOTE: Pew cards will be given to those who are to receive them when they surrender their admit cards.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of the arrival of guests at the East Gate. There will be no interviewing of guests.

Guests will assemble in the East Garden before proceeding to the Rose Garden. The U.S. Air Force String Ensemble will be playing.

3:30 p.m.

Guests proceed from the East Garden to the Rose Garden via the driveway. All guests will be seated from the two outside aisles. Guests with pew cards will present them to Social Aides for their reserved seating.

NOTE: Rows 1-8 will be reserved on the bride's side and rows 1-4 will be reserved on the groom's side. There will be an additional 10 seats reserved for the press.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of guests coming along the driveway to the Rose Garden. There will be pool press coverage of guests being seated in the Rose Garden.

3:45 p.m.

Dr. Latch, Ed, and Howard proceed to Oval Office.

Groomsmen assemble in the Library on the ground floor.

Bridesmaids assemble in the Green Room.

3:54 p.m.

Mrs. Nixon is escorted to the Map Room.

Processional of the Bridal Party:

3:55 p.m.

Mr. and Mrs. Cox are escorted from the Diplomatic Reception Room to their seats in the Rose Garden by a social aide.

3:56 p.m.

Mrs. Nixon is escorted from the Diplomatic Reception Room to her seat in the Rose Garden by a social aide.

As soon as Mrs. Nixon is seated, Dr. Latch, Ed, and Howard proceed from the west wing along the collonnade and enter the Rose Garden. They take their places on the lower level of the platform.

Groomsmen proceed in pairs (six steps apart) from the Diplomatic Reception Room to the Rose Garden.

Bridesmaids proceed from the Blue Room door to the South Portico Balcony and down the east steps along the driveway to the Rose Garden.

Tricia and the President proceed from the Blue Room door to the South Portico Balcony and down the east steps along the driveway to the Rose Garden.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of the procession of the bridal party from the South Portico Balcony to the entrance of the Rose Garden. There will be press pool coverage of the procession of the bridal party from the entrance of the Rose Garden to the foot of the altar.

4:08 p. m. Ceremony begins in Rose Garden with Dr. Latch officiating.

PRESS PLAN: There will be no press coverage of the ceremony except a small pool of reporters who will be seated among the guests.

4:20 p. m. Ceremony concludes. NOTE: The US Army Strings will play.

Recessional of the Bridal Party:

4:21 p. m. Bridal party will depart the Rose Garden in the following order: Tricia and Ed, 4 bridesmaids escorted by 4 groomsmen, remainder of groomsmen, Dr. Latch, the President and Mrs. Nixon, Mr. and Mrs. Cox.

The bridal party will proceed along the driveway to the South Portico and up the East steps and in the Green Room door.

PRESS PLAN: There will be pool coverage of the recessional from the foot of the altar to the entrance of the Rose Garden. There will be full press coverage of the bridal party from the Rose Garden to the South Portico Balcony.

4:25 p. m. Immediately after the wedding party has departed from the Rose Garden, social aides will escort VIP guests from the Rose Garden to the Library. Other guests will be directed to the ground floor of the Residence or the East Garden to wait while official photographs are taken.

NOTE: VIP guests include: Mrs. Dwight Eisenhower, the Vice President and Mrs. Agnew, the Cabinet and their wives, Dean of the Diplomatic Corps and Mrs. Sevilla-Sacasa, Mayor and Mrs. Washington, Dr. Billy Graham and Ethel Waters.

The bridal party will proceed through the Blue Room and into the Red Room. Tricia and Ed will go to the 2nd floor for approximately 10 minutes. The Bridesmaids will go to the 3rd floor.

4:30 p. m.

Official photograph session of the bridal party begins in the Blue Room. The Red Room will be used as a holding room for members of the bridal party not involved in the photo of the moment.

PRESS PLAN: There will be TV, photographer, and reporter pool coverage of the photo session.

Receiving Line:

5:15 p. m.

At the conclusion of the photo session , the receiving line will begin. The line will be formed in the south end of the Blue Room in the following order: The President and Mrs. Nixon, Tricia and Ed, Mr. and Mrs. Cox. There will be an introducing aide and two whispering aides.

VIP guests will be first through the line, followed by the Johnson girls and Mrs. Longworth.

PRESS PLAN: There will be photo pool coverage of the first 15 minutes of the receiving line. There will be reporter pool coverage of the entire receiving line.

6:45 p. m.

Receiving line concludes.

Reception in the East Room:

Social aides will have the wedding party gathered in the East Room awaiting the arrival of Tricia and Ed.

Tricia, Ed, the President and Mrs. Nixon, and Mrs. and Mr. Cox proceed from the Blue Room through the Green room, into the Grand Hall and through the center doors into the East Room.

Tricia and Ed dance the bridal dance.

The President cuts in on Ed and dances with Tricia.

The entire bridal party dances.

PRESS PLAN: There will be photo and reporter pool coverage of the bridal dance.

Cake Cutting:

When Tricia and Ed decide to leave the reception, Tricia will go upstairs for a few minutes (by elevator).

Tricia and Ed will then proceed to the Main Foyer where the wedding cake will be positioned in front of the mirror.

They will cut the cake.

Following the cake cutting, Tricia and Ed will proceed up the Grand Staircase half way. Tricia will throw her bouquet out into the Main Foyer from this location.

PRESS PLAN: There will be photo and reporter pool coverage of the cake-cutting and throwing of the bouquet.

Departure of Tricia and Ed:

After the throwing of the bouquet, Tricia and Ed will return to Main Foyer. They will depart the White House from the North Portico. Guests will gather at this entrance to see them off.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of the departure of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Cox.

Reception continues with dancing, food, and champagne.

NOTE: The Bill Harrington Orchestra will play for the reception.

4:00 p.m.

Dress: Business Suits for the men... Afternoon dresses for the ladies

Arrival of the Wedding Party:

2:00 p.m. The eight groomsmen, Ed, Howard, Mazie, Amy, and Beth will arrive through the Northwest Gate and will proceed to the North Portico.

Groomsmen, Ed, and Howard will proceed to the Ladies Mezzanine where they will dress for the wedding.

Bridesmaids will proceed to the 2nd floor (Lincoln Bedroom) where they will dress for the wedding.

3:00 p.m. Dr. Latch will arrive at the North Portico and will proceed to Rex Scouten's private office in the Residence.

3:00 p.m. Mr. and Mrs. Cox will arrive at the North Portico and will proceed to the Map Room.

When Ed and Howard are dressed, they will proceed to the Ushers Office.

Arrival of Guests:

3:15 p.m. Guests begin to arrive at the East Gate. Cars will be permitted to drive up the East Driveway to let guests out under the shelter. Guests will surrender their admit cards in the East Wing landing area. Pew cards will be given to those who are to receive them. Guests will be directed to the Family Theatre for coat checking.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of the arrival of guests. There will be no interviewing of guests.

Guests will wait in the Library, Vermeil and China Rooms before they are seated. The U. S. Air Force String Ensemble will be playing.

PRESS PLAN: There will be a small pool of reporters on the ground floor to observe the guests arriving.

3:30 p. m.

Guests will be seated in the East Room. Guests will enter at the south end of the room and all will be seated from the center aisle. Guests will present their pew cards for reserved seating to the social aides.

NOTE: Rows 1-9 will be reserved on the bride's side and rows 1-4 will be reserved on the groom's side. There will be an additional ten seats for the press.

PRESS PLAN: There will be TV, photo, and reporter pool coverage of the guests coming upstairs and being seated in the East Room.

The U. S. Army String Ensemble will be playing in the Grand Hall.

3:45 p. m.

Dr. Latch, Ed, and Howard are escorted to the Ushers Office.

Groomsmen assemble in the Yellow Oval Room, as do bridesmaids also.

Mr. and Mrs. Cox are escorted upstairs to the Yellow Oval Room.

Processional of the Bridal Party:

3:55 p. m.

Mr. and Mrs. Cox are escorted from the Yellow Oval Room to their seats in the East Room by a social aide.

3:56 p. m.

Mrs. Nixon is escorted to her seat in the East Room by a social aide.

As soon as Mrs. Nixon is seated, Dr. Latch, Ed, and Howard will proceed from the Ushers Office to the East Room, entering through the north door.

Groomsmen proceed in pairs down the Grand Staircase and into the East Room.

Bridesmaids proceed single file down the Grand Staircase and into the East Room.

Tricia and the President proceed down the Grand Staircase and into the East Room, entering through the south door.

PRESS PLAN: There will be TV, photo, and reporter pool coverage of the processional of the bridal party in the Main Foyer and in the East Room.

4:08 p.m. Ceremony begins in East Room with Dr. Latch officiating.

PRESS PLAN: There will be no press coverage of the ceremony except a small pool of reporters who will be seated among the guests.

4:20 p.m. Ceremony concludes.

Recessional of the Bridal Party:

4:21 p.m. Bridal Party will depart the East Room in the following order: Tricia and Ed, the 4 bridesmaids escorted by 4 groomsmen, remainder of the groomsmen, Dr. Latch, the President and Mrs. Nixon, Mr. and Mrs. Cox.

The bridal party will proceed through the green and blue rooms to the Red Room. Tricia and Ed will go to the 2nd floor for approximately 10 minutes. Bridesmaids will go to the 3rd floor.

PRESS PLAN: There will be pool photo coverage of the recessional in the East Room.

4:25 p.m. Immediately after the wedding party has departed the East Room, social aides will escort VIP guests from the East Room through the north door. They will be held in the Main Foyer and will be first through the receiving line.

Other guests will exit the East Room through the North door and will be directed downstairs to the ground floor, and through the center doors and will be directed to the Grand Hall. Champagne will be served in both locations. The US Air Force Strings will be playing in the Diplomatic Reception Room. The US Army Strings will quickly move from the Grand Hall to a position in front of the foot of the Grand Staircase in the Main Foyer. Chairs will be quickly cleared from the East Room, and the room will be set up for dancing.

Until it is ready, the receiving line will be routed through the Green Room and into the Blue Room. When the East Room is ready, the receiving line will be routed through the south door of the East Room through the Green Room and into the Blue Room.

4:30 p.m.

Official photograph session of the bridal party begins in the Blue Room. The Red Room will be used as a holding room for members of the bridal party not involved in the photo of the moment.

PRESS PLAN: There will be TV, photographer, and reporter pool coverage of the photo session.

Receiving Line:

5:15 p.m.

At the conclusion of the photo session, the receiving line will begin. The line will be formed in the south end of the Blue Room in the following order: The President and Mrs. Nixon, Tricia and Ed, Mr. and Mrs. Cox. There will be an introducing aide and two whispering aides.

PRESS PLAN: There will be photo and reporter pool coverage of the bridal dance.

Cake Cutting:

When Tricia and Ed decide to leave the reception, Tricia will go upstairs for a few minutes.

Tricia and Ed will then proceed to the Main Foyer where the wedding cake will be positioned in front of the mirror.

They will cut the cake.

Following the cake cutting, Tricia and Ed will proceed up the Grand Staircase half way. Tricia will throw her bouquet from this position out into the Main Foyer.

PRESS PLAN: There will be photo and reporter pool coverage of the cake cutting and throwing of the bouquet.

Departure of Tricia and Ed:

After throwing the bouquet, Tricia and Ed will return to the Main Foyer. They will depart the White House from the North Portico. Guests will gather at this entrance to see them off.

PRESS PLAN: There will be full press coverage of the departure of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Cox.

Reception continues with dancing, food, and champagne.

NOTE: The Bill Harrington Orchestra will play for the reception.
