RE: Relocation of Secret Service Agents
around Oval Office and EOB

This is pursuant to your conversation with Rose Woods, and my subsequent discussions with Bob Burke.

The presence, or absence, of Agents in the glass booth outside the Press Office, and the Agent at the top of the stairs at the EOB office, is a clear indication to members of the Press whether the President is occupying the Oval Office or the EOB office. Additionally, the door adjacent to the hallway leading into the Press Secretary's office complex, when left open, clearly reveals to anyone walking to or from Mr. Ziegler's office whether the President is or is not in the Oval Office. Accordingly, certain changes have been requested and are summarized herewith:

1. The Agent who occupies the glass booth outside of the Press Office will hereafter take a position on the colonnade in a position approximately between the Cabinet Room doors and the doors leading out from the President's reception room (Nell Yates' office).
2. The door outside the Cabinet room previously described will now be kept in a closed position, thus obscuring the view of the Oval Office door from passersby going to and from Mr. Ziegler's office.
3. The Agent who has been standing post at the top of the steps outside of the EOB office will be moved inside the anteroom. Only the uniformed EPS Guard will stand outside.

TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING

WITH DICK KAISER

1. Activities and personal conduct of the Agents in PPD have a direct reflection on the Presidency. e.g. Bob Coates did USS^S advance for Mrs. Timberlake's funeral. Funeral Director made special mention to White House and media of the fine people surrounding the President. This reflected positively on the institution of the Presidency.
2. The President is concerned with unnecessary visible presence of security. The connotation of an inordinate number of Agents surrounding him suggests crisis and impending disaster. A reasonable security presence connotes well-being. This is particularly important as we make the transition from the turmoil of the late sixties to the relative social stability of the seventies.
3. The spirit of cooperation and teamwork between the staff and USS has been good and it must continue to improve.
4. John Dean is charged with responsibility for liaison with PPD. On trips Bull will have this task. However, you should not hesitate to bring problems of extreme importance to my direct attention when the conditions warrant.

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
