The following is the detailed schedule of events for the information of all news media representatives. Times listed are local with corresponding Eastern Standard Time in brackets. This schedule is subject to change, however, attempt will be made to keep you informed of any changes made.

Movements of the President and official party are indicated in capital letters, while general press information and press corps movements are indicated in capital and lower case.

Press Notes:

The trip of President Nixon will include visits to six cities and five countries totaling 10,500 statute miles.

In the best interests of all, the following suggestions are made to facilitate coverage and movements by all news personnel:

1. Schedules. All time schedules will be strictly kept. Because of the logistics of the operation and distances to be covered, it will be impossible to wait for stragglers or to rearrange schedules which have been carefully worked out in advance.

2. Press airplanes. There will be two press charter airplanes. A Pan American Boeing 707 Jet and a Trans World Airlines Boeing 707 Jet. In order to permit news coverage of the arrival of the President in each country, the press planes will leave the preceding country approximately one hour in advance of the President. Every effort will be made by the Press Secretary and the press pool traveling on the President's plane, to keep the news personnel aboard press planes informed of departure statements made by the President after the press plane has departed.

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Such statements will be dictated from the President's plane by Ron Ziegler to each press aircraft via radio and distributed to all correspondents. If this cannot be done for any reason copies of such statements will be made available to all news media immediately after the landing of the President's plane.

3. Customs and Immigration. While custom and immigration regulations in general have been waived for the news media representatives accompanying the President, it will be necessary before each stop to collect passports of all passengers and crew on the planes.

There will be a State Department representative on the press planes to handle this procedure. Passports will be returned to each individual in the press office at the headquarters hotel. Should newsmen not wish to pick them up, they will be transported to the next city for similar processing by the State Department.

4. Photographic equipment. Registration of lenses and other equipment is desirable for the protection of that equipment -- particularly if photographers are carrying any equipment that is made overseas. A memorandum listing equipment and serial numbers should be given to Jiggs Fauver of the White House Transportation Office before departure of the press airplanes at Andrews Air Force Base.

5. Luggage. Luggage of all newsmen leaving Washington on the press planes is to be delivered to the corridor outside of Room 87 EOB (White House Transportation Office) between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Saturday, February 22nd. All luggage should be correctly tagged with the name and affiliation of the owner and should bear luggage tags distributed by the White House Transportation Office.

Each passenger is limited to one large piece of luggage and one small overnight bag plus working equipment -- (a total of approximately 45 pounds).

Camera crew, sound and film gear is limited to 350 pounds each. Each piece of equipment should be tagged with the name and affiliation of the owner along with the luggage tags supplied by the White House Transportation Office.

Film containers should be clearly marked "Film".

6. Rooms. The White House is automatically making hotel reservations for each overnight stop for all those who have signed up for the trip. If news personnel make the trip but do not use the reservation, they will be liable for the cost of the rooms unless the White House Transportation Office is notified in advance.

Every effort will be made to secure the finest accommodations available in each country -- however there are cases when doubling up will be necessary due to space limitations in some cities.

7. Headquarters hotels. In each city, a headquarters hotel will be established where the majority of newsmen will stay along with the White House Press Office staff and Transportation Office staff. In each case, filing facilities will be available within the headquarters hotel. The headquarters hotels are as follows:

Brussels	-	The Brussels Hilton Press room - Grand Salon Mezzanine
London	-	The Grosvenor House Press room - Restaurant on lobby level
Bonn	-	Hotel Dressen Press room - Main ballroom

Main press headquarters during Bonn visit will be the Bundes Press and Information Office in Bonn. The Dressen press facility will be used as an alternate to facilitate late night filing.

Rome	-	Excelsior Hotel Press room - Main ballroom, lobby level
Paris	-	George V Hotel Press room - Main ballroom

8. Hotel billing. It is advisable that all hotel bills be paid the evening prior to departure in order to facilitate the clearance of the news personnel party from the hotel and in order to get to the airport on time for departure the following morning. Arrangements have been made at all hotels for use of American Express credit cards or direct billing should newsmen prefer this method of payment.

9. Credit for filing. Although arrangements have been made with each country visited on the trip to ensure that credit will be extended to the White House press corps, news personnel should have international credit cards to facilitate the filing of copy, the use of international telephones and the shipment of film or any other product.

10. Press Credentials. White House press credentials for newsmen traveling on the press planes will be issued en route to Brussels. In each country visited the foreign government has generously consented to supply special credentials for the White House press corps and will be the only creditation necessary during the entire visit to that country. These credentials will be issued on the press airplanes upon departure to each country.

11. Press Pools. Pools will be drawn in advance of departure and pool members will be listed on detailed schedules. Special pool credentials will be issued by the press Secret Service Agent before each event. These credentials must be returned to the agent upon completion of pool assignment. Pool positions will be equally divided between local news representatives and Americans. American pooling responsibilities will be only to American side -- no cross pooling with foreign news representatives.

Newsmen joining the tour in a particular city must obtain local accreditation from the Foreign Ministry of that country in order to gain admittance in press areas. If they will be flying on the press planes to the next country, they will be automatically issued credentials aboard the aircraft.

12. Aircraft Reference Library. There will be a reference library on each of the press planes which will be available for vital statistics on each country the President will visit. This library will provide correspondents with biographical data on principal government officials as well as additional reference material pertaining to each country.

13. Clothing. It is strongly suggested that warm clothes, rain gear and boots be taken. Rain and snow are prevalent throughout Europe during this season. Black tie is not necessary for newsmen with few exceptions for a limited number of poolers. These people will be notified individually in advance.

PRESS NOTES ON BRUSSELS:

Headquarters for news media will be the Brussels Hilton Hotel. Messrs Ziegler, Warren, Elbourne, Woods, and Whelihan will be staying at the hotel and will be available to the press for information. Also staying at the Hilton Hotel will be members of the White House Transportation Office Staff.

A working press room has been established in the Ballroom (Salon Louise) on the mezzanine floor.

Members of the press will be staying at both the Brussels Hilton and Westbury Hotels. Room assignments available upon arrival.

Newsmen will be preregistered and may proceed directly to their rooms where keys will be in the doors.

Baggage will be delivered to the rooms.
