The following is an up-date of a rationale and schedule for the first trip proposal for this summer.

BASIC RATIONALE

1. Washington is an isolated place. Members of Congress continually visit their constituents to keep in touch -- listen and explain -- so should the President.
2. The President needs to know what's up in the country and the country needs to get his thinking.
3. An expansion of the President's theme of taking the Government to the people in a personal way.

THEMES

1. Transition from war time to peace; - The new American Revolution.
2. This is a great country.
 - Spirit of the country.
 - Draw the people together (Forward Together)
3. Main Issue Themes:
 - Economy
 - Jobs (Maybe tie to trade issues)
 - Crime
 - Drugs
 - Returning troops
 - Environment/Health

This is particularly important since they are the ones who will be working, and talking on the telephone with the advancement as the campaign develops.

It is assumed that Mrs. Nixon will not be accompanying the President on any of these trips.

SUMMER '71 TRAVEL

Problem: To develop a rationale for extensive domestic travel during the July/August period which will be acceptable to the public (and press).

Rationale:

1. To position the President as a man who is popular among the people; interested and knowledgeable regarding their regions and problems.
2. The President is communicating with the country -- all sections, all segments of the population and knows the nation's mood.
3. The President has decided to use several two to three day trips this summer to meet and talk with the people. This is part of his continued philosophy of Government to the People.

Trip(s) Structure:

1. The trips will be built around one or two set events a day leaving ample time for "off beat" (spontaneous) activities.
2. We will arrange for the President to have meetings (usually informal) with local or regional press on a frequent basis. This will help to solidify the theme we want to note.
3. Politics will be downplayed. There will be no public Republican events.

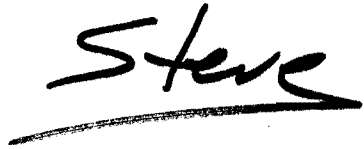
