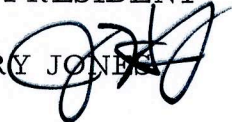

MEMO FOR THE PRESS OFFICE:

The President today announced his intention to nominate James E. Smith, of McLean, Virginia, to be Comptroller of the Currency.

He will serve a term of five years.

His annual compensation will be that of a Level III (\$40,000)

He succeeds William B. Camp who resigned and which was accepted 3/20/73, effective 3/23/73. (Ron announced this acceptance on 3/20/73)

Mr. Smith is presently Deputy Under Secretary of the Treasury a position for which he was nominated on 8/9/72, confirmed 8/18/72 and appointed 8/22/72. He presently receives \$38,000 per year in this capacity.

A successor for him in this post has not yet been determined.
