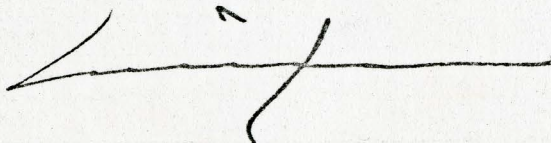
Sir:

I ask the Congress to consider proposed supplemental appropriations for fiscal year 1972 in the amount of \$179,165,000 in budget authority and \$655,000 in proposals not increasing budget authority. In addition, there are included proposals totaling \$91,246,000 in District of Columbia funds.

These requests were taken into consideration in the totals of the budget that I transmitted to the Congress on January 24, 1972. The effect of these proposals is to reduce the estimate of outlays in that budget by \$10,586,000 in fiscal year 1972 and \$240,000 in fiscal year 1973.

The details of these proposals are set forth in the enclosed letter from the Director of the Office of Management and Budget with whose comments I concur.

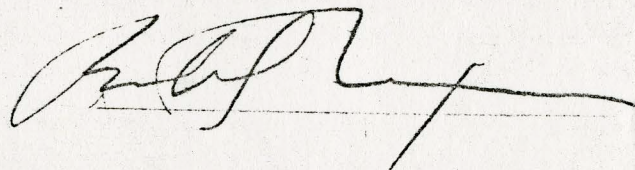
Sir:
