MEMO FOR THE PRESS OFFICE:

The President today announced his intention to nominate Jack O. Horton, of Saddlestring, Wyoming, as a Member of the Joint Federal-State Land Use Planning Commission for Alaska.

This is a new position created by the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act approved by the President on December 18, 1971 (P.L. 92-203).

The Commission is to consist of 10 members appointed as follows:

- (1) The Governor of the State of Alaska (or his designate) and four members who shall be appointed by the Governor.
- (2) ONE member appointed by the President by and with the advice and consent of the Senate.
- (3) FOUR members appointed by the Secretary of the Interior.

The Governor of the State of Alaska and the member appointed by the President shall serve as cochairmen.

He shall serve at the pleasure of the President.

He shall be compensated as provided by the President at a rate not in excess of that provided for level V (\$36,000). (NOTE: His compensation has not yet been determined by the President)

The principal office of the Planning Commission shall be located in the State of Alaska.

On or before May 30, 1976, the Planning Commission shall submit its final report to the President, the Congress, and the Governor and Legislature of the State.

The Commission shall cease to exist effective December 31, 1976.
