MEMORANDUM FOR CHUCK COLSON

SUBJECT: SUPPORT FROM GUN ENTHUSIASTS

You are aware that we are going through a process of attempting to get maximum support from gun enthusiasts and sportsmen around the country.

The results from your meetings with high officials in gun organizations are manifested in favorable editorials and articles such as the attached.

I want to alert you to some danger which I perceive on the horizon. In Treasury, Gordon Liddy, a strong Nixon advocate and loyalist, is being undermined by Gene Rossides and Martin Pollner. I don't know where this will lead, but it seems inadvisable to me, given the momentum we have built up, to risk losing Liddy's support and expertise.

I alert you to this, Chuck, because we may need help.
