-- The President met with Senators Ervin and Baker and agreed to have Senator Stennis listen to the subpoenaed tapes and authenticate a summary of the portions relating to Watergate and the alleged cover-up. This report will be made available to Judge Sirica and the Senate Select Committee.

-- The President made this concession to end an atmosphere of constitutional confrontation.

-- This procedure was proposed last Monday by the Attorney General to the Special Prosecutor and has been under discussion since that time.

-- This proposal was rejected by the Special Prosecutor today. The President, however, decided to put it into effect and offer it to the court and not appeal to the Supreme Court.

-- The Special Prosecutor has been directed not to take any further action contesting this decision on the part of the President.

MEETING WITH GOVERNOR NELSON ROCKEFELLER
AND GOVERNOR MALCOLM WILSON OF NEW YORK STATE

Wednesday, December 26, 1973

I. PURPOSE

Courtesy call for the new Governor Malcolm Wilson.

II. BACKGROUND, PARTICIPANTS AND PRESS PLAN

- A. Background: Governor Rockefeller resigned on December 18, 1973 to concentrate his efforts on the Commission on Critical Choices and the National Water Pollution Control Commission (he is the chairman of both). Malcolm Wilson, the Lt. Governor, replaced him. Governor Rockefeller asked for this meeting so that Governor Wilson could get better acquainted with you and your staff.
- B. Participants: Governor Rockefeller, Governor Wilson and Ken Cole.
- C. Press Plan: Press photo opportunity.

III. POSSIBLE TALKING POINTS

- A. General
 - 1. Congratulate Gov. Wilson and advise him that you look forward to the same good working relationship you had with Gov. Rockefeller.
 - 2. Advise him that he should talk with Ken Cole and Jim Falk on Federal-State relations.

B. Governors Rockefeller and Wilson may raise the following:

1. Mass Transit Operating Subsidies: They want to save the 35¢ fare on the New York City subways. Rockefeller has loaned the city \$100 million from state monies in hopes that he can get this much back, and more, from the Federal Government. They will ask you to support a mass transit operating subsidies program because of the energy crisis. Rockefeller recently met with Secretary Brinegar who told them he would look into the matter further, but that the Administration is opposed in principle.

RR. You are opposed in principle to mass transit operating subsidies. The people of Kansas City ought not to pay the subway fares for the people of New York. (New York, incidentally, just voted down a \$100 million bond issue to support mass transit.) Our experience with other operating subsidies has shown that they seldom contribute to higher levels of services--only higher costs for the same. The Federal Government should not operate the Nation's mass transit systems; this is a local job. We are looking at new ways to provide financial assistance to cities so that Governors and Mayors may make the decision as to whether the money ought to be used for capital expenditures or operating expenses.

2. Commission on Critical Choices: Gov. Rockefeller may mention that Congress turned down his request for \$1 million assistance, and that he will now have to go through the Federal grant process.

RR. Advise Gov. Rockefeller that we will help wherever we can, but he must ensure that all his applications are in good order so that we don't have an appearance problem.

3. Water Pollution Commission: Gov. Rockefeller will tell you that the Commission is off to an excellent start.

RR. You are very interested in the Commission's work. You understand the Governor has selected an excellent staff. Governor Rockefeller should keep you posted from time to time through Ken Cole (he has been doing this).

4. Social Services: Governor Rockefeller claims that the Federal Government owes the State of New York funds for Social Services payments. This issue is currently before the courts.

RR. Tell the Governor that you are sure he understands that the way the situation is handled in New York has an impact in other states and that since this is the case the court process is probably best.

5. Other issues: Recommend you refer Governors Rockefeller and Wilson to Ken Cole.
