SUBJECT: Intergovernmental Legislative Concerns

Lee Verstandig, Assistant to the President for Intergovernmental Affairs, has identified 20 key legislative issues which his office has an interest in or concern about. We have met and determined that it would be mutually beneficial for OPD and the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs to separately produce one-page papers on each of these 20 issues.

The Office of Policy Development papers would include three principal elements:

1. A description of what the Administration's policy is with respect to the issue;
2. A concise statement of the rationale behind our policy; and
3. The current legislative status of the issue.

The current Intergovernmental Affairs staff will prepare a one-page paper on each issue outlining the specific concerns and views expressed by state and local officials.

I would appreciate your preparing these one-page papers according to the following division of labor.

1. Revenue Sharing Program Reauthorization (Carleson)
2. Enterprise Zone Legislation (Carleson)
3. Hunger (Carleson)
4. Clean Air Act (Boggs)
5. Acid Rain (Boggs)
6. Immigration Reform (Uhlmann)
7. Western Water Policy and Cost Sharing (Boggs)
8. Unitary Tax (McAllister)

9. Product Liability (Gunn)
10. Cable Television Legislation (Uhlmann)
11. Health Insurance (Carleson)
12. More Mass Transit Funding (Gunn)
13. Antitrust Liability (Uhlmann)
14. Transportation of Hazardous Materials (S. 2800 and H.R. 2693)
(Boggs)
15. Oil Spill Pollution and Compensation (H.R. 3278)(Boggs)
16. More funding for math and science education (Carleson)
17. Outer Continental Shelf revenues (Boggs)
18. S. 915, which would allow state and local governments to sue
for price-fixing (Uhlmann)
19. Mortgage revenue bonds (McAllister)
20. Unisex legislation (insurance, pensions, etc.) (Uhlmann)
