I. PURPOSE

To brief the Bipartisan Leadership of Congress and the chairmen and ranking minority members of the key committees handling the economic package in the interest of gaining their support for the package and their cooperation in expediting its consideration.

II. BACKGROUND

When the economic package is submitted to Congress on February 18, 1981, the major portion of it will be handled by three committees in the Senate and four committees in the House. The support and cooperation of the Chairmen and ranking minority members of these committees, as well as the bipartisan leadership, is essential if Congress is to act favorably on the proposals. In this interest, they should be the first members of the Congress to learn about the final decisions of the President on the package and they should receive it on the President's terms.

The format of having the President meet briefly in the Oval Office with the six principal Congressional leaders followed by a brief appearance with the remainder of the leadership of key committees maximizes participation, but minimizes intrusions on the President's preparation for his address to Congress. It also protects the integrity of the President's address, since the briefing, which will be handled by the Secretary of Treasury and the OMB Director, will occur less than twelve hours before the President's address.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH BIPARTISAN
LEADERSHIP OF CONGRESS AND CHAIRMEN AND RANKING
MINORITY MEMBERS OF KEY COMMITTEES ON THE ECONOMIC
PACKAGE

- Thank the leadership and key chairmen and ranking members for coming to the White House.
- Mention that Regan and Stockman will unveil for them momentarily the details of your economic proposal.
- Point out that a major portion of the burden of reversing current economic trends rests with the people at this meeting.
- Urge them to act expeditiously.
- Point out that from your point of view, it is important to keep the package together and protect its integrity. Once exceptions are made, especially as it relates to spending cuts, it will be difficult to prevent a flood of exceptions.
- Tell them that you are in the process of finishing preparation for the speech and ask if they will excuse you so you can return your attention to the speech.
- Turn the meeting over to Regan and Stockman.
