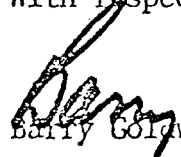
Dear Ronnie:

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH
SENATOR ROBERT STAFFORD

- Mention that you had been wanting to visit with Senator Stafford because of his important role as Chairman of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee; that you are aware of the many important issues his committee will be considering this year (Clean Air Act & Clean Water Act, for example) and that you look forward to working with him here.
- Ask for his support with your nominations. It is crucial to the effectiveness of your Administration that you have your own team in place; remind him also of your determination to work with Congress.
- Senator Stafford's committee is in the process of developing its recommendations for the Budget Committee. Use this as a reminder of the importance of spending restraint as a part of your overall economic recovery program.
- Ask for his observations in reaction to your economic proposals, and seek his continued support here. Reaffirm your intention to have an ongoing dialogue with Congress on this crucial issue and seek his continued input.

I. PURPOSE

To satisfy Representative Roberts' request to present the President with a western hat and plaque in behalf of the President's western friends across South Dakota.

II. BACKGROUND

Clint Roberts is a Freshman Republican in the House of Representatives from the Second District of South Dakota. The Second District comprises forty-six counties in the western and central regions of South Dakota, including the State Capitol in Pierre. Clint filled the vacancy created when James Abdnor successfully ran against George McGovern for a seat in the United States Senate.

Clint is a wheat and cattle rancher who owns the homestead that originally was settled by his great grandparents in the 1880's. In South Dakota, he served three terms as a State Senator (including President Pro Tempore), and served as State Director of Agriculture. Clint is a former director of the Cowboy Hall of Fame and has done numerous western theme commercials.

In the House of Representatives, Clint serves on the Agriculture Committee. He initiated a letter to the President in early February, which was co-signed by seventeen of his House colleagues, strongly urging that the Soviet grain embargo be lifted. Clint did not, however, attend the February 17th meeting with the President on this issue.

The hat Clint is presenting to the President was manufactured by Boyd's Hat Company in St. Lawrence, South Dakota. St. Lawrence is a small community in the Second District in which the hat factory is the principal industry.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING
WITH REPRESENTATIVE CLINT ROBERTS
(REPUBLICAN, SOUTH DAKOTA)

- Congratulate Clint on his election victory last Fall.
- Mention that Clint (a former rancher, Agriculture Director and State Senator in South Dakota) brings to Washington a heritage of common sense and hard work that is so desperately needed in our national leaders.
- State that Clint's experience in South Dakota will make him especially valuable as a Member of the House Agriculture Committee
- Add that you also will be counting on Clint's leadership and assistance on the economic package and other matters of vital importance to the nation.
- In thanking Clint for the hat and plaque, note that his affiliation with the Cowboy Hall of Fame adds special meaning.

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SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH
SENATOR JAKE GARN (R-Utah)

- Compliment the Chairman on the fine manner in which he handled the Murray Weidenbaum confirmation process. The Banking Committee was highly complimentary to Weidenbaum and it was the Chairman who arranged to have the Committee consider and Report the nomination expeditiously.
- Thank him for the great help he provided in convincing Freshman Senators that they vote overwhelmingly to support your bill to increase the debt limit. The vote was an early symbol that Senate Republicans are determined to work together to correct the economic problems.
- Ask him if he thinks that unity can be maintained. If not, where will the problems come and how best can they be avoided?
- The Banking Committee is going to have to consider some very important and fundamental reforms in the Housing policies of the Federal Government. The most important are:
 1. Revise entitlements for subsidized housing rent payments.
 2. Reduce the number of new subsidized housing units.
 3. Stretch out Public Housing modernization program.
 4. Restructure Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Urban Development Action Grant (UDAG) programs.
 5. Abolish the Solar Energy and Conservation Bank.
- Ask him which of those will be the most difficult to get through the Senate and his Committee and what you can do to help.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH
GOVERNORS

- I appreciate this opportunity for a dialogue with nearly the entire membership of the National Governors' Association.
- I would like to confirm my desire to work with you on a new approach to solving our economic problems.
- I intend to establish a coordinating task force on Federalism. I would like your suggestions on how we organize it.
- I will be working closely with Rich Williamson on the initial planning stages of this task force.
- As you know, restoring a balance between the Federal government and other levels of government is a priority of this administration. The White House Intergovernmental Affairs Office will be playing a key role as liaison to you and your State governments.

- One issue that I know you are concerned about is revenue sharing. We have not made a final decision regarding the future of revenue sharing, and I would like your remarks on it in light of other budget proposals we have already made.

- I will call on Governor Busbee now for comments from the Chairmen of your standing committees.
