As you are aware, in 1981, the housing industry had its worst year since 1946. The industry is severely depressed and bankruptcies among realtors have increased markedly.

The National Association of Realtors boasts a membership of about 700,000 and a staff of 370. The organization is extremely supportive of your spending cuts, moderately supportive of your tax plans, and its grassroots network has lobbied consistently on behalf of your programs.

There is intense political pressure on the Congress and the Administration to support various housing subsidy programs. NAR's position is that multi-billion dollar bail-outs for housing add pressure to the deficits and interest rates. NAR has supported modest programs for housing improvement and will welcome what you have to say in your speech. The NAR requested this meeting to share their views on how the lot of their industries can be improved.

I. PURPOSE

This is an opportunity for you to listen to issues of concern to the state attorneys general.

II. BACKGROUND

The state attorneys general are in Washington for their annual spring executive committee meeting to which all state attorneys general are invited. In addition to meeting with you, they will meet with Senators Thurmond, Stafford, and Gorton, and also Chief Justice Warren Burger.

Attorney General John Ashcroft (R-Missouri), Chairman of NAAG, has indicated three areas for comment.

1. Criminal Justice - They are on the same "wave length" as the Administration in the area of criminal justice. They agree that street crime is a local issue, and their position on habeus corpus reform and on the "exclusionary rule" is the same as the Department of Justice.
2. Medicaid Fraud - There are presently 29 states which have prosecutorial programs in the area of Medicaid fraud. They would like to describe some "classic examples" of fraud in this area.
3. Environment - NAAG prefers stronger versions of the Clean Air and Clean Water Acts than EPA is presently proposing.
