I. PURPOSE

To review the status of the Budget Resolution and the Urgent Supplemental Appropriations bill and to preview the President's Economic Summit meeting in Versailles.

II. BACKGROUND

Since the last leadership meeting on April 20, the Senate has passed the Defense Authorization bill (the Administration's request was well satisfied) and last Friday adopted the First Concurrent Budget Resolution, 49-43. The Senate budget action reduces projected deficits by \$358 billion over three years. The Senate is currently debating the Urgent Supplemental Appropriations bill.

The House is in the process of considering 7 versions of the budget resolution and will likely vote on the Bipartisan Recovery Budget (which the Administration supports) on Wednesday.

The House passed on May 12 the Urgent Supplemental bill which includes a \$1 billion "bail out" for housing assistance.

At the end of this week, the Senate will recess until June 9, the House until June 2.

TALKING POINTS

Budget

- Want to take this opportunity to salute Howard Baker and Pete Domenici for a job well done---the Senate Budget Resolution reduces projected deficits \$358 billion over three years. It's a big step in the right direction.
- Point out that you recognize that there were many difficult amendments offered to restore funds for veterans, education, unemployment, but overall the Senate action demonstrates that our Republican majority is ready to take the kind of responsible action we need to restore our economic balance.
- Now the action shifts to the House with 7 budget alternatives. No compromise is perfect. I don't like increased taxes---even \$20 billion---or defense cuts any more than you all do. The Democratic leadership budget dubbed the "Panetta-Minetta vendetta" and the Jones resolution are fundamentally unacceptable. They reflect a commitment to higher taxes, a weaker defense and more spending.
- Budget,
The Bipartisan Recovery A similar to the Senate's, has three key advantages---it keeps taxes down, it makes savings on defense while preserving our security and it begins to hold down spending on the so-called "uncontrollables."
- I've been speaking to many Congressmen and I'm encouraged. The Bipartisan Recovery Budget has a fighting chance to win.

TALKING POINTS

Urgent Supplemental and "Bail-outs"

- I recognize that the House added a \$1 billion bail-out for housing assistance on the Urgent Supplemental and that the Senate version, which is being considered on the floor now, totals \$5 billion (including the out years).
- Let me make my position on bail-outs very clear: I am unequivocally opposed to them.
- They send the wrong signals to financial markets, raising fears of renewed inflation.
- A bail-out for any one sector is likely to lead to bail-outs for others. Taken together, these bail-outs could exceed our budget by tens of billions of dollars.
- However attractive they may seem, bail-outs must be resisted if we are to achieve sustained economic growth.

TALKING POINTS

European Trip

- On my trip to Europe next week, I will be seeking to strengthen common Western economic, political and military interests and institutions.
- At the summit in Versailles, we will examine together the difficult economic circumstances we face and agree to a series of steps to reinforce our individual measures for economic recovery.
- Specifically I intend to propose that our country's consult more closely to coordinate their medium term economic policies aimed at reducing inflation, maintain fiscal and monetary discipline and strengthening market forces. To achieve greater economic and monetary stability all of our countries must be moving in the same direction toward lower inflation and sustained real growth. These consultations will permit us to watch carefully the policies of other countries as they so carefully, and often, criticize our policies.
- To appeal for the maintenance and expansion of our free trading system in the Western World.

European Trip (continued)

-- I intend then to seek enhanced cooperation among the Summit countries on East-West trade and credit flows. At a time when our countries are making great sacrifices to strengthen Western defense, it is inappropriate to subsidize exports and credits to the Soviet Union. We hope to build on progress made since the Ottawa Summit on the control of strategic exports and to achieve greater consensus on limiting the flow and raising the cost of officially supported credits to the Soviet Union.

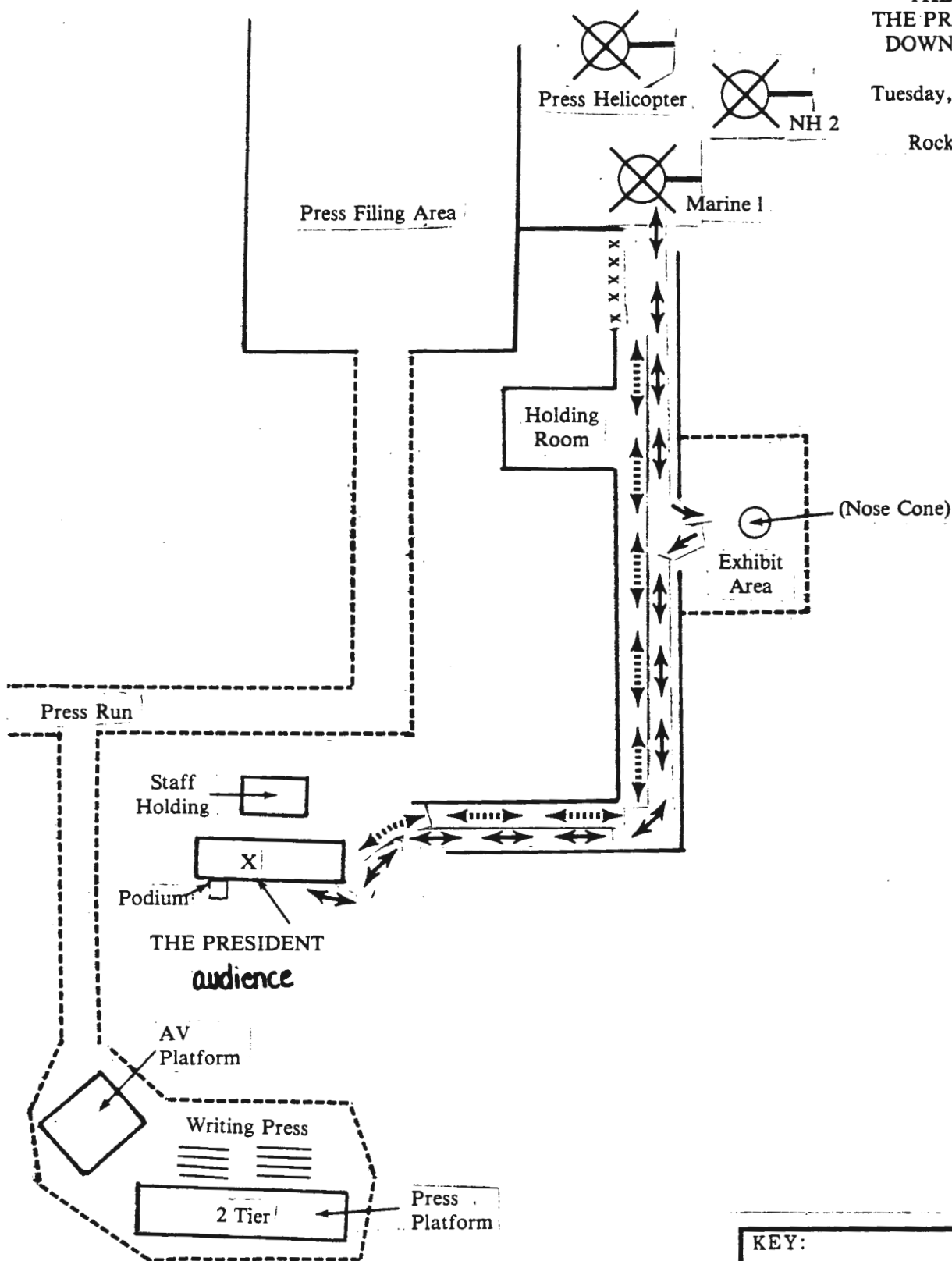

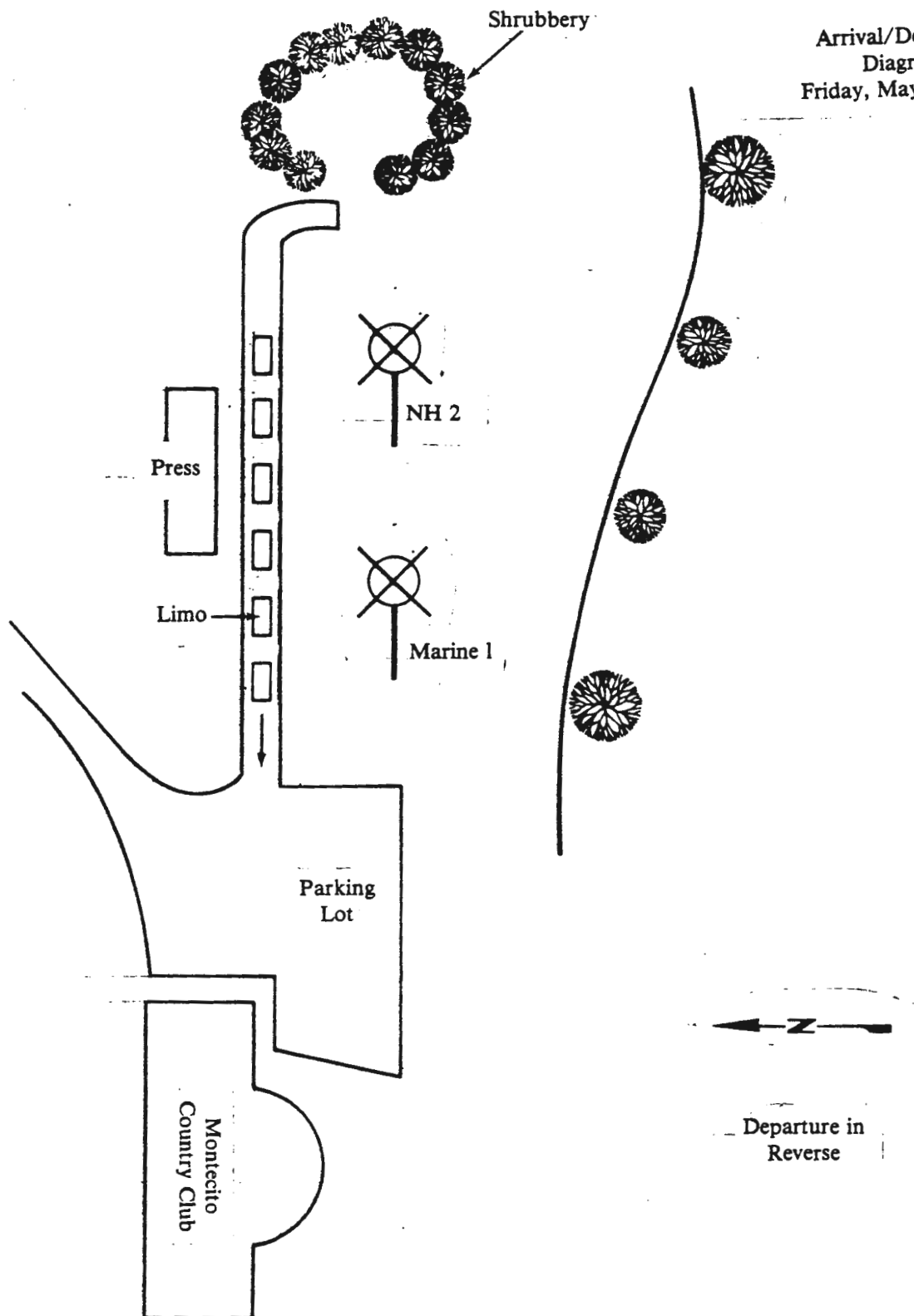

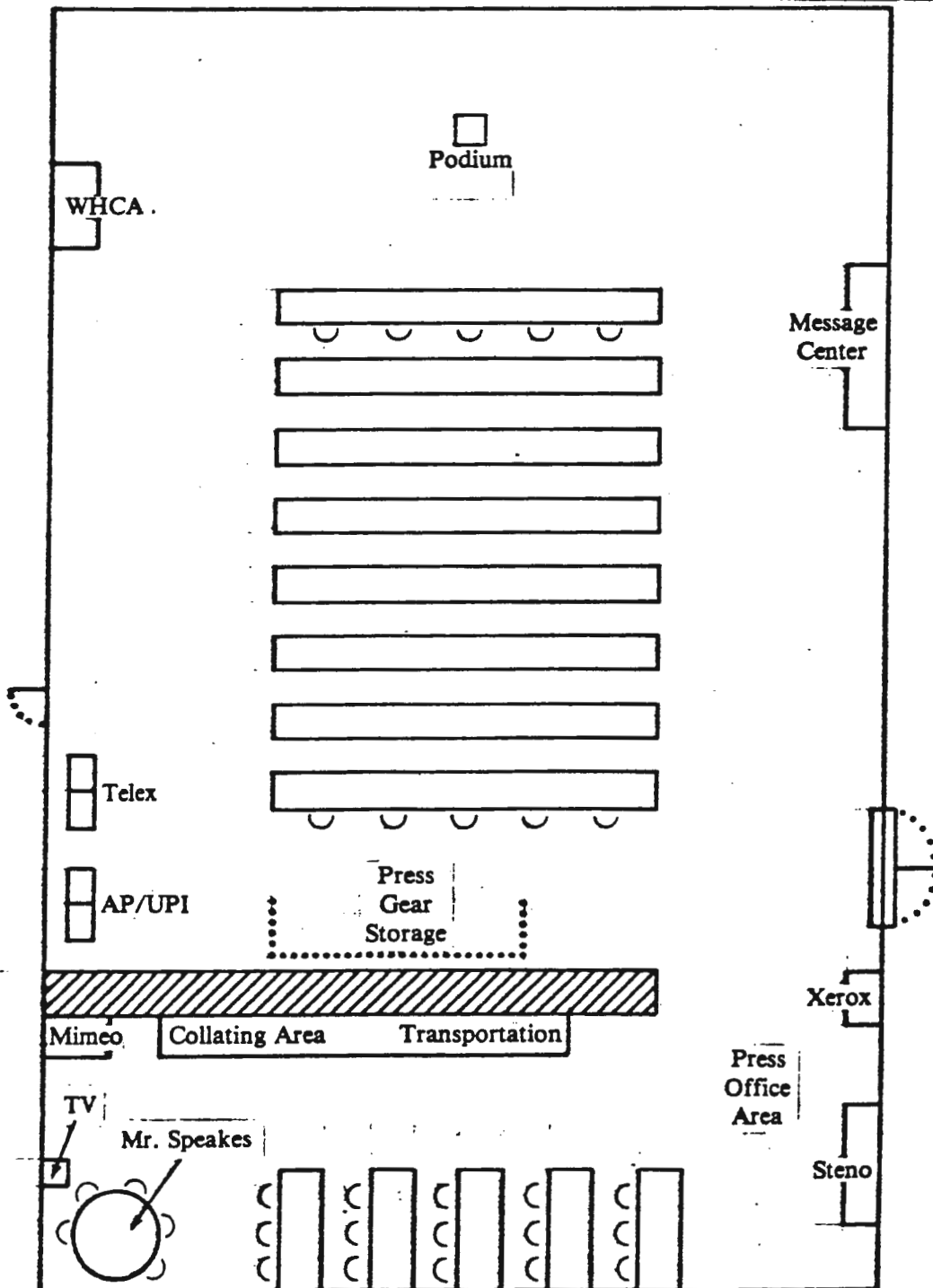
