THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN descend the elevator and proceed to the Arrival Ceremony on the South Lawn via the Diplomatic Reception Room. They greet the Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and Mrs. Kohl as they arrive.

11:20 a.m.

Following the Arrival Ceremony, THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN and the Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and Mrs. Kohl proceed through the Diplomatic Reception Room and up the elevator to the State Floor. They then take their places for the receiving line in front of the Blue Room in the Cross Hall. The order from west to east is THE PRESIDENT, Chancellor Kohl, MRS. REAGAN, Mrs. Kohl. Ambassador Roosevelt will introduce the guests to THE PRESIDENT from his left.

NOTE: Also, following the Arrival Ceremony, a member of the Press Office will escort style editors up the Grand Staircase and directly into the East Room via the door at the top of the stairs for tea.

The remaining invited guests will wait until the PRINCIPALS have had time to take their places; they then will proceed up the west staircase outside of the White House leading into the Red Room, going in front of the Blue Room past the PRINCIPALS, proceeding into the Green Room, then into the Blue Room for refreshments. (Juice, coffee, and pastries.)

11:30 a.m.

At the end of the receiving line, Ambassador Roosevelt will escort THE PRESIDENT and Chancellor Kohl to the Oval Office.

MRS. REAGAN and Mrs. Kohl will proceed into the Blue Room to mingle briefly with the guests.

11:35 a.m. MRS. REAGAN escorts Mrs. Kohl, Mrs. Hermes, Mrs. Genscher (wife of the Foreign Minister), Mrs. Arthur Burns, Mrs. Diether Stolze (wife of the Chief of the Federal Press and Information Office), and Mrs. Damm into the Green Room for tea.

The remaining guests will exit the Blue Room and depart the Residence via the North Portico and the Diplomatic Reception Room.

11:55 a.m. MRS. REAGAN escorts Mrs. Kohl to the North Portico for departure. All remaining guests depart the North Portico as well.

After all guests have departed, MRS. REAGAN will proceed to the East Room where she will meet with the style editors.

A tour guide will meet the style editors in the East Room, describe the Color Rooms to them, then escort them quietly through the Color Rooms and down the Grand Staircase for a tour of the Ground Floor.

DATE: November 15, 1982

LOCATION: The Oval Office

TIME: 2:30 p.m. (30 minutes)

FROM: KENNETH M. DUBERSTEIN *KMD*I. PURPOSE

To consult with Senator John Tower on your decision with regard to the MX missile and to see the Senator's assistance and leadership on the MX issue in the Senate.

II. BACKGROUND

The President must report to the Congress by December 1, 1982, his decision on a basing mode for the MX missile. A basing site decision also is anticipated. Congress will then have the option of overturning this decision within 30 legislative days after the announcement is made. In this timeframe, during the lame duck session, we anticipate that the Congress will also be considering the FY83 defense appropriation bill, which will serve as a vehicle for debate on the MX issue, since it contains R&D and production funds.

As Chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, Senator Tower has always been a strong and consistent supporter of the Administration's defense program, and he would be the appropriate person to lead the MX battle for us in the Senate. Because of Senator Tower's leadership position in the defense area generally it is appropriate for you to consult with him on your MX decision before the final announcement is made. In addition, assuming the Senate is receptive to your choice of a basing mode, you should ask Tower to be your "point man" in the MX debate. Tower may also bring up the subject of defense spending levels, and you should anticipate some discussion of defense issues generally.

We understand Senator Tower will continue to oppose basing MX in existing Minuteman silos. He may advocate more capsules (for deception) to make the Closely Spaced Basing (CSB) system more like MPS, which you earlier rejected. He reportedly views congressional opposition to augmenting CSB with an anti-ballistic missile system as most severe.

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7:35 p.m. The Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany and Mrs. Kohl arrive the North Portico and are greeted by the Military Aide and escorted into the Grand Foyer. There they are greeted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN at the foot of the Grand Staircase.

THE PRINCIPALS remain at the base of the Grand Staircase with a military guard of honor on either side for a press photo. Once the photo is concluded, THE PRINCIPALS will proceed to the Yellow Oval Room via the Grand Staircase (or via the elevator if necessary for Mrs. Kohl.)

7:40 p.m. Any additional guests arriving the Diplomatic Reception Room may be escorted up the elevator as soon as THE PRINCIPALS are in the Yellow Oval Room.

8:15 p.m. Guests are led out of the Yellow Oval Room and into the Dining Room to be seated for dinner.

Dinner is served.

As soon as the guests are seated for dinner, the equipment for Mr. Peter Nero's performance is installed in the Yellow Oval Room and the chairs and sofas are set up auditorium style exactly as they were at the Prince Charles dinner.
