TALKING POINTS

- Max, I want to again thank you for your support for the Republican Party, its candidates and the support you have given my Administration.
- Al, thank you as well for your hard work and support for the Republican Party and for helping my Administration reach its goals. Both of you have given far more than could be expected.
- Max, in keeping with your stated wish to become an elder statesman and advisor to the National Republican Jewish Coalition, it was my suggestion that Al serve as Chairman of the Coalition and advisor regarding matters of concern to the Jewish community.

Nuclear Freeze

- I would appreciate any help you can give us in the House and Senate to defeat the nuclear freeze resolution. As presently worded, it is unclear in its meaning. Experience has shown that we must come to the table from a position of strength if we are to ever make progress with them. Can you help us?

I would be grateful if you would get together with Ken and Faith to work closely with them to use whatever help you think you might be able to give on specific aspects of our legislative program.

ADDITIONS TO TALKING POINTS

Middle East

- I have just concluded meetings with Foreign Minister Shamir and Foreign Minister Salem. We hope an agreement on withdrawal from Lebanon is near. We hope that Hussein will join the peace process.

- At that point, I will need all your help to persuade the American Jewish community that the only fair way to assure Israel's long-term security is on the basis of any Sept. 1st initiative.

Soviet Jewry

- On Soviet treatment of Jews, I've sent Jeanne Kirkpatrick to Jerusalem to present our position on this. She carried a letter from me to Begin which he will read today to the conference.

Arms Sales to Jordan

- As of this moment, no new requests. If we do, we will be very sympathetic. Jordan is an important friend of the U.S. and has genuine security needs. The Soviet missiles in Syria can reach Amman as well as Tel Aviv.

- Obviously, if Hussein joins the peace process, we'll find it easier to get acceptance on the Hill.
