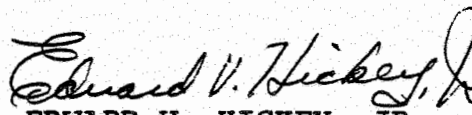

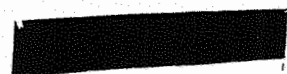

Lieutenant General (Dr.) Paul W. Myers is surgeon general, Headquarters U.S. Air Force, Washington, D.C.

General Myers was born in Schenectady, N.Y., on Jan. 15, 1923. He attended Union College and later Albany Medical College, Albany, N.Y., where he received his doctorate of medicine in 1946. He served his internship at Ellis Hospital in Schenectady from April 1946 to June 1947.

General Myers began his military career as an enlisted man in the U.S. Army in June 1943 and was released from active duty in 1945. He returned to active military duty as a commissioned officer in July 1949 and was assigned to the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, N.Y., where he served initially as medical officer to the corps of cadets and then as chief of the Outpatient Department until April 1951.

Upon completion of the primary course in aviation medicine at the U.S. Air Force School of Aviation Medicine, Randolph Air Force Base, Texas, in June 1951, he served as chief of the professional services, Eastern Air Defense Force, Stewart Field, N.Y., until June 1952.

General Myers completed his general surgery residency in June 1953 at the Ellis Hospital, Schenectady, N.Y. Upon completion of his neurosurgery residency at the Albany Medical Center, Albany, N.Y., in 1956, he was assigned to the 2349th U.S. Air Force Hospital, Parks Air Force Base, Calif., as chief of the Neurosurgery Service. In June 1958 General Myers became director of neurological surgery at Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center, Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

In April 1971 General Myers was appointed commander of Wilford Hall USAF Medical Center, a position he held until August 1978 when he became surgeon general.

He is a member of the Congress of Neurological Surgeons, Military Neurosurgical Society of America, Society of Air Force Clinical Surgeons, Southern Neurosurgical Society, American Medical Association, Pan American Medical Association, Association of Neurological Surgeons and the San Antonio Surgical Society. He is a fellow of the American College of Surgeons. General Myers is a diplomate of the American Board of Neurological Surgery.

General Myers was a member of the land-based medical recovery forces of Project Mercury and participated in the post-flight medical debriefing of the astronauts. He is the author and coauthor of numerous professional articles.

His alma mater, Albany Medical College, has honored him on two occasions. He became a member of Alpha Omega Alpha in 1966, and on May 5, 1973, he received the Alumni Honorary Award.

His military decorations and awards include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Air Force Commendation Medal, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award ribbon with one oak leaf cluster and the honor decoration for the Causa de la Fuerza de Chile.

He was promoted to the grade of lieutenant general effective Aug. 1, 1978, with date of rank July 31, 1978.

The Secretary of Defense has recommended that the President approve a two month extension of the mandatory retirement date for Air Force Lieutenant General Arnold Braswell. Under 10 U.S.C. § 636, General Braswell, who currently serves as Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Air Forces, must be retired on 1 August 1983. Pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 637(b)(2), however, "[a]n officer subject to retirement under section 635 or 636 of this title who is serving in a grade above major general or rear admiral may have his retirement deferred and be continued on active duty by the President." General Braswell, with the temporary rank of lieutenant general, is serving in a grade above major general.

The Secretary recommends deferral of General Braswell's mandatory retirement date to 1 October 1983, so that the General's successor may be named before the General departs. Legislation is pending to authorize an additional four-star general in the Air Force, and the selection of General Braswell's successor is linked to that legislation. It is hoped that the outcome of the legislative effort will be known by October 1.

Edward V. Hickey, Jr. recommends that the President approve the Secretary's recommendation, and I see no legal objections. An appropriate memorandum for Darman is attached for your review and signature.

LIEUTENANT GENERAL ARNOLD W. BRASWELL

Lieutenant General Arnold W. Braswell is commander in chief, Pacific Air Forces, with headquarters at Hickam Air Force Base, Hawaii. His command comprises more than 34,000 Air Force operational and support personnel stationed at eight major bases and more than 87 facilities principally located in Japan, South Korea, the Philippines, and Hawaii.



General Braswell was born Oct. 3, 1925, in Minden, La., and graduated from Minden High School. He attended Louisiana State University for two years and in 1944 entered the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, N.Y. While at the academy, he was first captain of the corps of cadets and graduated in 1948 with honors and a commission as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force. He earned a master's degree in business administration from The George Washington University, Washington, D.C., in 1967. The general completed Air Command and Staff College at Maxwell Air Force Base, Ala., in 1962 and the National War College, Fort Lesley J. McNair, Washington, D.C., in 1967.

After completing flying training at Randolph Air Force Base, Texas, and Williams Air Force Base, Ariz., in September 1949, he became a member of the 33rd Fighter Wing at Otis Air Force Base, Mass., where he flew F-86 Sabrejets.

In 1952, during the Korean War, General Braswell flew 155 combat missions in jet fighters as a member of the 49th Fighter Wing, Taegu Air Base, South Korea, and the 4th Tactical Fighter Wing, Kimpo Air Base, South Korea.

From September 1952 to September 1955, he was a flight instructor and operations officer in the 3600th Combat Crew Training Group at Luke Air Force Base, Ariz. When the U.S. Air Force Academy opened at Lowry Air Force Base, Colo., in 1955, General Braswell was assigned as commander of one of the original four cadet squadrons and served in that capacity for three years.

In October 1958 he was again assigned to the 49th Fighter Wing, which had been relocated to Etain Air Base, France, where for a time he supervised training of French and Turkish pilots in F-100s and then commanded the 7th Tactical Fighter Squadron at Spangdahlem Air Base, Germany.

The general returned to the United States in August 1961 to attend the Air Command and Staff College. He transferred to Washington, D.C., in July 1962 and was assigned to Headquarters U.S. Air Force in the Directorate of Plans, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff,

Plans and Operations. In August 1966 General Braswell entered the National War College and concurrently completed his master's degree in business administration at The George Washington University in 1967.

He began a tour of duty in the Republic of Vietnam in July 1967 as director of plans, Headquarters 7th Air Force, in Saigon. Though a staff officer, he flew 40 combat missions, most of them in F-4 Phantoms.

Following his return from Southeast Asia in August 1968, General Braswell became the director of operations for the 4th Tactical Fighter Wing at Seymour Johnson Air Force Base, N.C. He was again assigned to Air Force headquarters in August 1969 in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Plans and Operations, where he served initially as an Air Staff planning representative in Joint Staff planning conferences. In April 1970 he became deputy director for force development in the Directorate of Plans, and in February 1972 he became deputy director of plans. In February 1973 General Braswell assumed command of The United States Logistics Group in Ankara, Turkey.

General Braswell was assigned to Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe, Belgium, as assistant chief of staff for operations from September 1974 to June 1977. In July 1977 he returned to the United States as director for plans and policy (J-5), Organization of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Washington, D.C. He became commander of Tactical Air Command's 9th Air Force with headquarters at Shaw Air Force Base, S.C., in June 1978. While there he also served as commander of the Air Force elements assigned to the Rapid Deployment Joint Task Force. He assumed his present command in June 1981.

The general is a command pilot and has logged more than 4,500 flying hours, most of these in jet fighters. His military decorations and awards include the Distinguished Service Medal with one oak leaf cluster, Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit with one oak leaf cluster, Distinguished Flying Cross and Air Medal with four oak leaf clusters.

He was promoted to lieutenant general July 1, 1977, with date of rank June 28, 1977.

General Braswell is married to the former Ione Davis, also of Minden, La. They have a son, Jeff, and a daughter, Sally.
