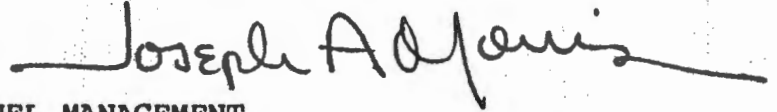

Adverse Actions and Performance-Based Actions...

MSPB Appeals v. NGP Arbitration

"Adverse actions" (5 U.S.C. chapter 75) and "performance-based actions" (5 U.S.C. chapter 43) may either be appealed to the Merit Systems Protection Board (MSPB) or grieved through an applicable negotiated grievance procedure (NGP), but not both. OPM has prepared the attached chart outlining some of the key similarities and differences between these two dispute resolution mechanisms.

Parties and representatives who appear before the MSPB presiding officials and/or NGP arbitrators may find this chart to be a useful summary of the features of both systems. The reader is cautioned, however, that this chart is intended to be used primarily for instructional and informational purposes,

and should not be cited before any reviewing body as authoritative. In this regard, some of the issues presented on the chart are still evolving or are subject to differing interpretations. The parties and their representatives should of course conduct appropriate research to determine their rights and responsibilities in connection with particular cases.

1. FILING TIME LIMITS	—Set by MSPB regulation (5 C.F.R. § 1201.22). —Appeal must be filed within 20 days after effective date of action. —Same time limit applies to all actions appealable to MSPB.	—Set by parties through negotiations. —Grievance typically must be filed within 15 days after effective date of action (although time limit varies from agreement to agreement). —Different time limits may apply to various actions grievable under NGP, depending on terms of agreement (although most agreements apply same time limit to all grievable actions).
2. PROCESSING THE ACTION	—Not applicable. Employee files directly with MSPB.	—Grievance typically is heard by management at one or more levels before arbitration is invoked. The grievance may be settled or withdrawn during this process.
3. INVOKING THE REVIEW PROCESS	—Employee's filing of timely appeal on matter within MSPB's jurisdiction will result in adjudication of matter by MSPB (including hearing if requested by employee).	—Only union may invoke arbitration. Employee has no right to do so. If union refuses to invoke arbitration, employee has no redress except to file unfair labor practice charge against union for failure to fairly represent him/her. There is a separate time limit, set by parties through negotiations, within which union must invoke arbitration.
4. SELECTION OF ARBITRATOR/ PRESIDING OFFICIAL	—MSPB Regional Director assigns case to regional presiding official, an attorney employed by MSPB, without any input from parties. Once assigned, presiding official will not be removed from case unless party is able to overcome presumption of honesty and integrity with substantial showing of personal bias.	—Parties jointly select arbitrator, usually from a list supplied by the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) or American Arbitration Association (AAA). Selection procedures (e.g., agreement or striking of names) are negotiated by parties. (Some agencies and unions have "permanent" panels of arbitrators that rotate, or from which parties may choose.) Parties usually study previous awards of various arbitrators to assess the quality and pattern of decision making.
5. QUALIFICATIONS OF ARBITRATOR/ PRESIDING OFFICIAL	—Presiding official (Federal employee) must be attorney. In case of removal appeal (whether under chapter 43 or chapter 75), 5 U.S.C. § 7701(b) requires that presiding official be "experienced in hearing appeals." In addition, MSPB's qualification requirements for presiding official position require legal experience.	—Arbitrator (non-Federal employee) need not be attorney nor meet any express qualifications. Must, however, meet requirements of 29 C.F.R. § 1404.5 to be listed with FMCS. This section generally requires arbitrator to have experience in resolving labor disputes or in collective bargaining, and to be capable of conducting orderly hearing, analyzing testimony, and preparing clear and concise findings and awards within reasonable time limits. AAA requirements are less rigid; arbitrators are selected for their experience, competence, and impartiality.

6. PRE HEARING PRACTICE	—MSPB regional office forwards appellant's petition for award to agency for reply. Agency's reply states whether or not it has appropriate documentary evidence to support its position and any affirmative defenses or other allegations appellant makes. —Parties may use MSPB's new discovery procedures to obtain information in form of deposition testimony and documents to help them prepare and present their cases at hearing. —Presiding official usually issues pre-hearing order that requires parties to submit information such as following by specified date prior to hearing: • Statements of factual and legal issues, and of their respective positions on those issues. • Proposed stipulations of fact. • Lists of proposed witnesses. • Potential hearing exhibits.	—The parties frequently advise the arbitrator of the type of issue or stipulate the issue prior to the hearing. They may stipulate some or all of the facts before the hearing or they may make all stipulations when the hearing begins. Because the grievance has been processed through one or more steps of the grievance procedure, the parties normally are fully aware of each other's case before hearing. However, the arbitrator's knowledge about the case prior to the hearing is usually slight or non-existent.
7. HEARING	In both MSPB and NGP forums, presiding official/arbitrator conducts hearing at which both parties may present opening and closing statements, submit documentary and other evidence, and examine and cross-examine witnesses. Formal rules of evidence that apply in judicial proceedings do not apply in either forum. (However, MSPB presiding officials view Federal Rules of Evidence as guidance in evidentiary matters.) Evidence is admitted if relevant, material, and not unduly repetitious. Post-hearing briefs may be permitted or required at discretion of presiding official/arbitrator. Differences between MSPB and NGP hearings: • MSPB hearing likely to be more formal than NGP hearing. • MSPB hearing tape recorded and transcript available upon payment of costs by requesting party; NGP hearing less frequently involves tape recording or transcript. (However, OPM encourages agencies to establish the requirement for transcripts in their negotiated agreements.) • Greater degree of consistency on part of MSPB presiding officials than on part of NGP arbitrators in format, style and manner in which they conduct hearings.
