8. <u>Historically Black Colleges:</u> Funds to convert an insurance building in Philadelphia for use by a Black college were not included in the supplemental. However, OMB has indicated that it will seek to fund the project from existing appropriations. Joe Wright and Craig Fuller will coordinate on this.	Wright Fuller
9. <u>Interior Appropriations Bill:</u> OMB is checking on the policy restrictions placed in this bill.	Wright
10. <u>Natural Gas:</u> A meeting will be held with outside groups today on this issue. A future meeting may be set up to hear views of the independent gas producers. This legislation will probably not reach the Senate floor for another two weeks. Guidance is that we support deregulation, and hope the Senate will act on the matter before it adjourns.
