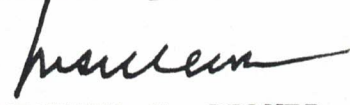

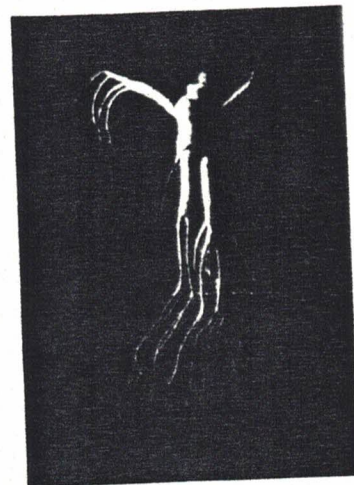

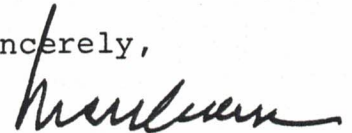
Dear Mr. Boykin:

Dear Mr. Deaver:

My purpose in this communication is to recommend a persuasive public action on the part of the President to indicate his concern for world hunger resolution plus his interest in energizing American export trade.

The flexible membrane grain storage system is to be marketed internationally by the Indianapolis based Agristore Company. We represent them in Washington. This facility is to undergo USDA tests to confirm previous experience shortly; it is the highest state of the art.

This deterioration-free and combustion-free system is so inexpensive it should revolutionize grain storage world-wide. We are convinced the introduction and use of this facility for storing rice, corn, wheat, etc. will have the most dramatic effect on world hunger of any development thus far this century.

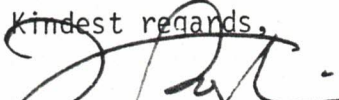

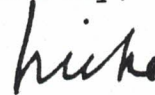

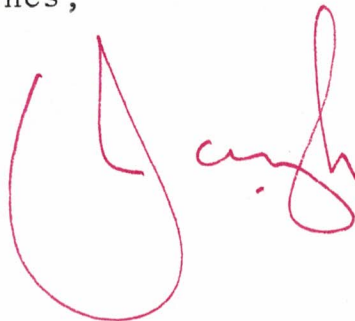

Dear Doug:

Thanks for your letter regarding the FSLIC application of Sterling Savings and Loan Association. The matter that accounted for the delay in processing Sterling's application somewhat accounts for my delay in getting back to you with conclusive information.

Sterling's application was one of several dozen that were put on hold while the Federal Home Loan Bank Board moved to address the broader issue of revised standards for de novo applications for savings institution charters. This matter was recently resolved by the Board's decision to go forward with the publication of a revised rule. I am informed that Sterling's application, along with others held in suspension, are to be given immediate notational consideration.

For your information, I have enclosed a final draft of the rule which is slated for publication by the end of the week. Also included is a statement from Chairman Gray on the background of the decision.

Dear Mike:

Since we moved to San Francisco, I have been involved in forming and advising financial institutions and dealing in the residential mortgage market with various financial institutions and mortgage banking firms.

Mike, I need your help in nudging Ed Gray's office off the dime, as his office of the Federal Home Loan Bank Board (FHLBB) is sitting on the application for Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation (FSLIC) conditional approval of Sterling Savings and Loan Association (in organization). This approval is the conditional final step needed from the FHLBB before opening.

Sterling Savings, Irvine, California, is one of my clients and will be wholly owned by my good friend, Robert Lintz, a long-time home builder of affordable homes in Southern California. Bob's construction company, Sterling Homes, has provided over 2,000 award winning new homes during the past five years, all in the greatly needed affordable range of \$35,000 to \$95,000.

It is my understanding that Sterling's application for FSLIC conditional approval has received staff recommendation for approval by notational voting by the Board without a hearing, and has been stalled at Mr. Gray's desk for a number of weeks without explanation. I understand that Mr. Gray is in Australia until October 11, but it seems that his co-board member Mr. Donald Hovde could surely process the approval after a telephone meeting with Mr. Gray and send notification of such approval to the FHLB of San Francisco.

A substantial investment of time and money by Sterling and Mr. Lintz is at stake here and their expertise, experience and knowledge of providing affordable housing financing in the Southern California area would certainly be a substantial contribution to solving the affordable housing crisis here in California.

Recent concern of various governmental agencies over use of savings and loan associations depositor's funds for other than home financing are certainly justified, however, Mr. Lintz and his company are star performers in providing both homes and home financing.

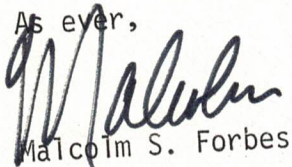
