THE SITUATION IN WASHINGTON TODAY—THE NEED FOR THE GOP VICTORY FUND

In the last election, the GOP stopped the Democrats from destroying a coalition of conservatives and electing a veto-proof liberal majority in the House of Representatives.

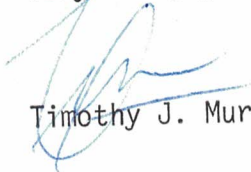

Dear Mike,

In my years in Washington I have observed many people who have come from other parts of the country.

You certainly are a good example of someone to admire and respect greatly. It is therefore distressing to me to find that I seem to have offended you by perhaps using words that seemed wrong to you. Nothing was further from my mind. You have always been kind to me and I feel a real bond to Carolyn because she loves Vienna so.

As you know these interviews are taped and their main thrust is to make them as conversational as possible. Sometimes to be certain that I understand correctly - especially when I am surprised as I was in this case - a question is repeated to clarify and make certain that I understood. Please keep in mind that the interview though planned much earlier happened by coincidence to take place at a moment when the whole town was talking about the reason for Bill's changing position. These were unavoidable questions at that time. It would have been an entirely different interview earlier on or now. In that sense it was as I said a coincidence which I regret. You perhaps noticed that Bill said that he himself had been insensitive in his relationships in the White House.

Mike, you know how difficult, often cruel, unkind and unfair this town can be and often has been to many of us myself included. I have never wanted to add to this on the contrary. It would be difficult, I think, to find anyone in Washington who would not confirm that.

Please find it possible to accept my sincere admiration and affection and to forgive anything unintended on my part.

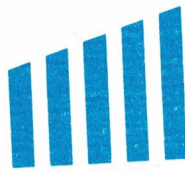

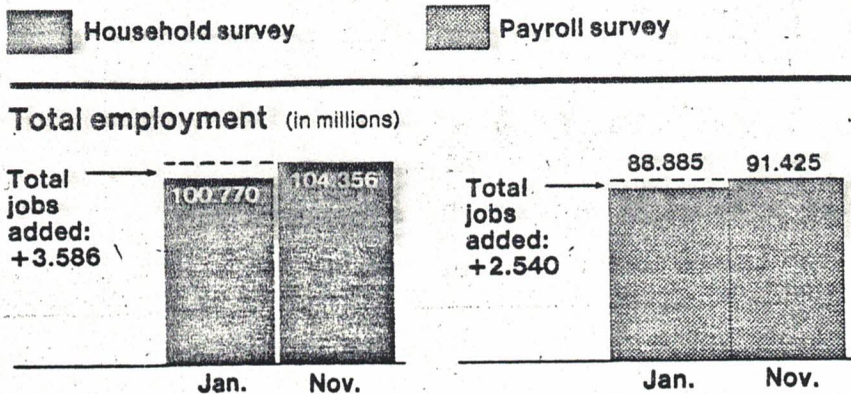

NOVEMBER EMPLOYMENT SITUATION

THE STRENGTH OF THE RECOVERY CONTINUES TO ASTONISH EVERYONE. LESS THAN A YEAR AGO, ALL THE ECONOMISTS WHO BELIEVED THAT THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WOULD DIP BELOW 10% BY THE END OF 1983 COULD HAVE FIT COMFORTABLY INTO ONE JAPANESE TWO-DOOR SEDAN. ALL THE ECONOMISTS WHO EXPECTED UNEMPLOYMENT TO BE ABOUT 8% WOULD HAVE FIT COMFORTABLY INTO A SINGLE STRAITJACKET.

AFTER OCTOBER'S BIG DROP, MANY THOUGHT THAT THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WOULD HOLD STEADY OR EVEN RISE IN NOVEMBER. INSTEAD, NOVEMBER PRODUCED AN EVEN BIGGER DROP THAN OCTOBER. THIS RECOVERY IS SO STRONG THAT IT IS MAKING OPTIMISTS LIKE ME LOOK LIKE PESSIMISTS. IT SURE BEATS THE OTHER WAY AROUND.

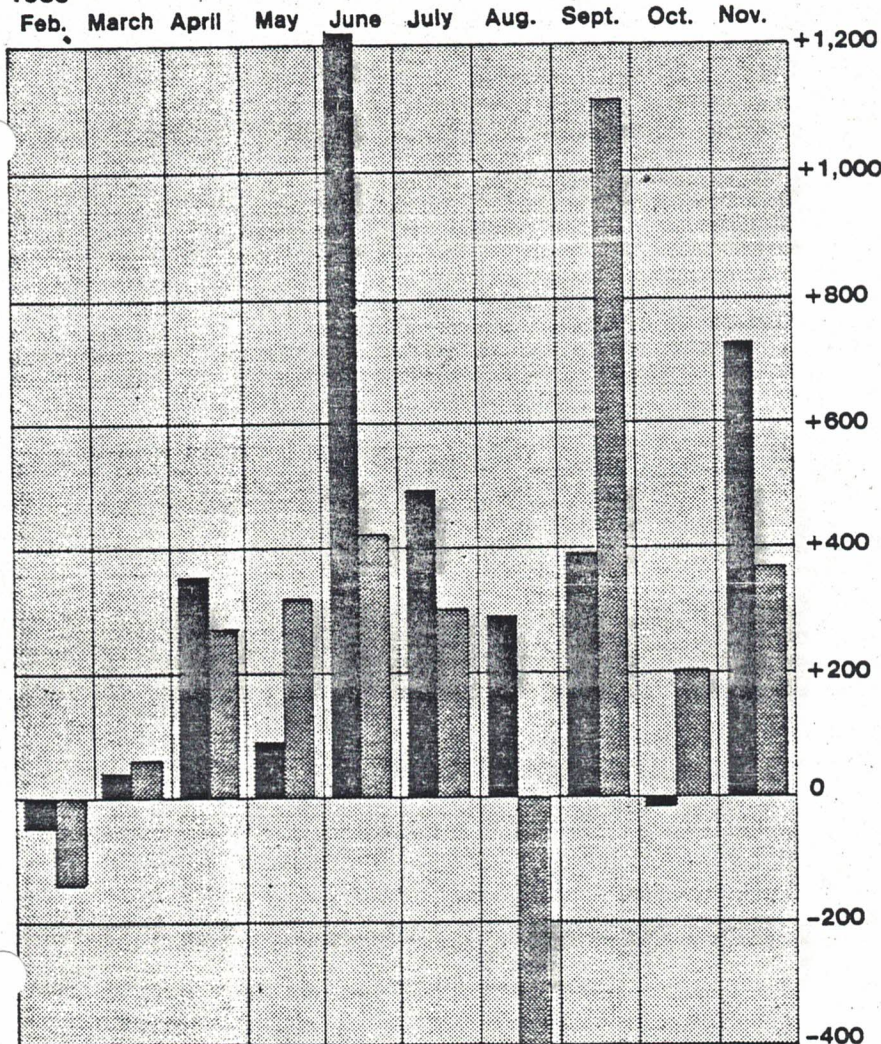
Total net and monthly change in civilians employed, Jan.-Nov. 1983, as shown by Government's two methods of counting jobs

Jobless Drop Calls for a Look At the Data

WASHINGTON — Last week's startlingly large drop in the nation's unemployment rate — to 8.2 percent from 8.7 percent — prompted economists once again to revise their views of the year-old recovery, whose strength many have consistently underestimated.

"All the economists who believed that the unemployment rate would dip below 10 percent by the end of 1983 could have fit comfortably into one Japanese two-door sedan," said John M. Albertine, president of the American Business Conference. Those who predicted about a year ago that unemployment would now be approaching 8 percent, he added, "would have fit comfortably into a single straitjacket."

But while the White House and others celebrated the latest labor market data, there were some who looked a bit more closely and suggested that things weren't adding up quite right. Could the improvement be overstated?

The biggest mystery involved the number of people who do have jobs. By one measure, the sampling of 60,000 households on which the unemployment rate is calculated, the number of job holders has risen by 3.5 million this year. By the other, a sampling of 189,000 employers, the gain is only 2.5 million.

What accounts for the discrepancy and what does it mean? Some economists suggest the "missing" jobs may represent nothing more than an increased number of self-employed people who don't show up on payrolls. Such workers often continue to be self-employed long after recovery begins, said David Ernst, an economist at Evans Economics, a consulting firm.

Some of the discrepancy can be attributed to the creation of new companies that are not immediately caught in the statistical nets from which the payroll figures are compiled, according to Howard V. Hayghe, an economist at the Bureau of Labor Statistics. Others venture that the explanation may lie partly in the mechanism of adjusting the data for seasonal variation. Then there is the normal margin of statistical error and the double-counting of people with more than one job.

The November figures reported Friday show employment measured by the household survey — the one used to calculate the highly publicized rate of unemployment — rose 733,000 while the payroll survey showed an increase only half as big, 370,000. Although economists are still sifting the numbers for possible danger signals, the general inclination is to regard the November data as confirming a year-long improvement in the labor market.

"I'd go along with the household survey," said Rose McElhattan, an economist at the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. She noted that the gains it showed were only moderately higher than in previous recoveries.

Several times, to the dismay of the Labor Department, the two employment measures have moved in opposite directions, a phenomenon that raises obvious doubts about the data. Now, however, "at least you have the two series going in the same direction," Mr. Albertine said.

WHEREAS, On July fourth, seventeen hundred seventy-six that immortal document, the Declaration of Independence, was signed, published and declared by the delegates of the thirteen original States at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, This clarion call for freedom announced with specificity the injuries and usurpations of the absolute tyranny of George III, King of Great Britian to all the world and courageously declared, among many other things: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness" (Emphasis supplied); and

WHEREAS, This documentary jewel of the Western World has inspired oppressed people everywhere to rise up and revolt against tyrannical governments in order to throw off the yoke of enslavement; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that there ought to be an International Unalienable Rights Day proclaimed by the Free Nations of the World to serve as an exemplar of hope for all people who cherish Freedom and prefer it over death in the spirit of the immortal words of that great American revolutionary, Patrick Henry "Give me Liberty or give me Death"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body respectfully memorializes the Honorable Hugh L. Carey, Governor of this great Empire State to proclaim May first, nineteen hundred eighty as "International Unalienable Rights Day" in the State of New York and to urge its observance by all people, municipalities, school districts and institutions of higher learning in this State by appropriate exercises and ceremonies; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted to the Honorable Hugh L. Carey, Governor.

LET US HONOR MAY 1st WITH APPROPRIATE EXERCISES AND CEREMONIES!

On the reverse side of this letter is a copy of the declaration made by the Legislature of New York (the Empire) State to proclaim May 1st, 1980 as "INTERNATIONAL UNALIENABLE RIGHTS DAY", and urging its observance by all people, municipalities, school districts and institutions of higher learning by appropriate exercises and ceremonies.

Let us use this opportunity to plan and produce appropriate exercises and ceremonies to show to our friends and neighbors locally, states nationally, and nations internationally that in our Empire State people of all religions, nations, classes and races live in peace and prosperity, and are united in our determination to be united now and forever on the basis of recognizing and respecting each other's (God-given) Unalienable Rights. New York State is called the Empire State because in it people of all religions, nations, classes, cultures and races live as friends and neighbors in peace, prosperity and security.

Unalienable Rights (spelled with U) are not the same as inalienable rights (spelled with i). Unalienable Rights are defined by our Declaration of Independence as God-given rights. These are rights with which we are endowed by our Creator. There is no concept of God in inalienable rights. In the proclamation made by the Legislature of New York State, it is spelled with U.

Unalienable Rights are America's contribution to the international contest for the ideological support of the people of all religions, nations, classes and races. The United States enjoys peace and prosperity by recognizing and respecting the Unalienable Rights of our citizens. Unalienable Rights are the foundation of our Declaration of Independence and Americanism.

By proclaiming May 1st, "INTERNATIONAL UNALIENABLE RIGHTS DAY", we give our people an opportunity to organize local, national and international activities to promote understanding and unity, and give our friends internationally an opportunity to unite with us for the purpose of working for international peace and prosperity. Let us call on our newspapers to publicize our activities in support of UNALIENABLE RIGHTS.

Once a year on May 1st we are all united in special exercises and ceremonies to honor International Unalienable Rights. We call for the Supernatural Power of God to unite all people on the basis of recognizing and respecting each other's Unalienable Rights. Unlike other rights, we believe Unalienable Rights are enforced by God through his Supernatural Powers!

UNALIENABLE RIGHTS (spelled with U) are not the same as human rights or inalienable rights (spelled with i). UNALIENABLE RIGHTS are defined by our Declaration of Independence as God-given rights. These are rights with which we are endowed by our Creator. There is no concept of God in human rights or inalienable rights. In the resolutions adopted by the Legislature of New York State for May 1st, 1979 and May 1st, 1980, and in the joint resolution of Congress 285 for May 1st 1979, introduced by a New York State Congressman, Unalienable is spelled with U. Unalienable Rights are America's contribution for the ideological unity and support of people of all nations, religions, classes and races. Unalienable Rights are the foundation of our Declaration of Independence and Americanism.

UNALIENABLE RIGHTS have been the basis of our American foreign policy for over two hundred years! Oppressed people everywhere have been inspired to rise up and revolt against tyrannical governments in order to throw off the yoke of enslavement.

We are requesting the President of the United States to issue a proclamation for May 1st, designating it "INTERNATIONAL UNALIENABLE RIGHTS DAY" and calling upon the people of the United States and the World to observe such day with appropriate ceremonies and activities. On the reverse side is a copy of a resolution introduced in Congress calling all people of the world to unite on one day, May 1st, to honor INTERNATIONAL UNALIENABLE RIGHTS.

Many Christians and Jews will visit the Holy Land during the Holiday Seasons because the Israelis are protecting the Unalienable Rights of all people. When the Holy Land was occupied by anti-Christian and anti-Jewish forces (before it was liberated in four wars), Christians and Jews were barred from visiting the Holy Land.

Our message to all Americans and to all the people of the World is: If you want the same peace, security, prosperity and standard of living as Americans, then honor the Unalienable Rights of each other as we do in the United States!

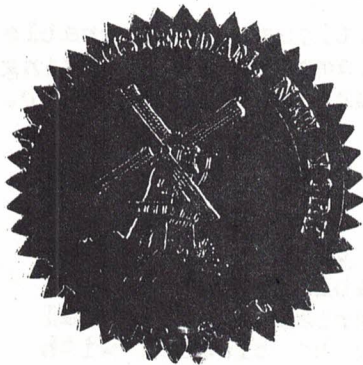

AMERICANISM

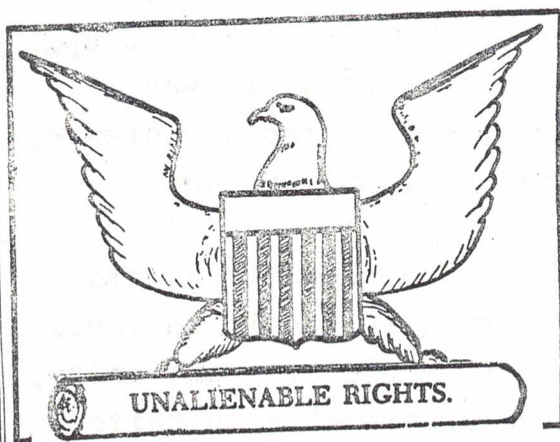
Americanism is Democracy expressed through a Republican Form of government, as established by the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. People who believe in Americanism believe it is the perfect government and that it contains within itself the perfect application of the laws of God.

These principles of the Laws of God are described as follows in the Declaration of Independence: "When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth the separate and equal station to which the laws of nature and of nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

"We hold these truths to be self-evident: That all men are created equal; that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights; that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; that, to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed."

True and pure Democracy is a system of government where the people gather together and vote personally on the laws which shall govern themselves. This is practical where the people are few in number, and can gather in one place. In small villages where they have town meetings, local laws are passed in this manner. But in larger cities and states this form of government is impractical because no hall can hold 8 to 16 million people. No hall can hold all the people of the United States.

For this reason, a Republican Form of government is necessary. In a Republican Form of government, the people do not vote personally on the laws that will govern them, but they vote personally for the men or women who will vote on the laws, and enforce the laws. For this reason the Constitution guarantees to each state a Republican Form of Government. Article IV Section 4.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22 — The invitation read: "Carolyn Deaver, Fred J. Hayman and Marvin S. Traub invite you . . ."

In Washington, the names of Mr. Hayman and Mr. Traub would normally draw little attention. They are the presidents of high-priced emporiums — Giorgio's of Rodeo Drive in Beverly Hills and Bloomingdale's — but they are not everyday names in this town of name-droppers.

On the other hand, the name Deaver is another matter. Just ask Carolyn Deaver, the wife of Michael K. Deaver, the deputy chief of staff at the White House.

"It's a plus," she conceded with a smile as she discussed plans for a luncheon and fashion show she was organizing to introduce "Giorgio," a perfume to be carried by Bloomingdale's here.

"But," she added, wise to Washington ways, "I have a feeling that when you are out of power, it can fade just as quickly."

Mrs. Deaver is a consultant with Mary Pettus & Associates, a public relations company that specializes in organizing events such as the perfume luncheon. How does she go about her work?

"Fred Hayman is a friend who has done some very nice things for us in the past," said Mrs. Deaver. "He telephoned and said he'd like it very much if I could help him out in introducing his new fragrance line in

Washington. Since we also represent the Hay Adams Hotel we thought we'd have the luncheon at the hotel and show the Washington ladies what was going on there in terms of renovation as well."

Freesia and Salmon

The Washington ladies turned out in force. Ambassadorial and Congressional wives, as well as Administration figures and well known faces from the social scene, gathered at yellow and white tables decorated with freesia to dine on salmon as the scent of Giorgio wafted across the room.

While name recognition and access is often half the battle on both the so-

cial and business fronts in Washington, Mrs. Pettus says her firm does not "use" Mrs. Deaver's White House connection. "I have been very careful not to put her on the spot," Mrs. Pettus said. "She was hired because she has something to offer on her own."

Mrs. Deaver says that the question of conflict of interest was a primary consideration when she decided to take the job. "That is always something that is always in the back of your mind," she said, "whether it's your personal life or a professional decision. I keep in touch with Mike about things that are pending at work in case there is a potential conflict."

Mrs. Deaver has a number of accounts that have nothing to do with hotels or perfume. Notable among them is the Eagles, an organization of Republicans who each year contribute \$10,000 apiece to their party. For the group's last Washington meeting, Mrs. Deaver arranged, among other things, for a private tour of the Corcoran Gallery on a day it was closed.

Mrs. Deaver also deals with the American Medical Association, which has its own art collection here. She is training docents and developing a catalogue.

The Washington work experience has proved instructive, Mrs. Deaver reports. "It's been a fascinating opportunity to see Washington from another point of view," she said. "I liken it to an onion. You keep discovering layer after layer, each with a different coloration."

Washington has not always charmed Mrs. Deaver. "I arrived here quite reluctantly," she said. "At one point I felt that the one way to get through the first six months was to think of Washington as a foreign city where the only thing we had in common was the English language."

But as the family's stay here lengthened and her two children began to feel more at home, she began to think about finding work of her own. "It became apparent that we weren't going home after two years as we had planned," she said.

When then?

"That's the \$64 question," she replied.
