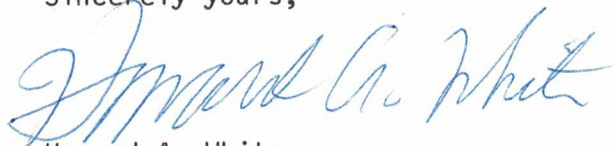
At the suggestion of our mutual friend, Mrs. Margaret Martin Brock, I am writing to express the interest of Pepperdine University in establishing the Reagan Library on or near the Pepperdine University campus in Malibu. We believe the location is ideal, and we are prepared to be flexible in following the President's wishes concerning the library and the institute that will be connected with it.

The Los Angeles Times has said that our campus may be the most beautiful in the world. Its location near the President's former home in Pacific Palisades provides a natural association with his career. On a number of occasions he has been most helpful in supporting the work of this University. In a speech when he was governor, he launched our successful drive to establish this campus and later dedicated it. At a time when turmoil and radical ideas were rampant on many college campuses, Pepperdine University signified its agreement with President Reagan's philosophy by conferring upon him the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. We have since had the privilege of awarding the same degree to Mrs. Reagan.

During the past decade, Pepperdine University has achieved an increasingly fine reputation as an institution of higher learning. The U.S. News & World Report of November 28, 1983, gave the results of a poll of college presidents who ranked Pepperdine University among the institutions of highest quality in the nation. We enjoy enthusiastic support from many of the most influential leaders in the Los Angeles business and professional community.

In the near future we expect to submit a somewhat detailed proposal, and the University would be most grateful if you would give it serious consideration.

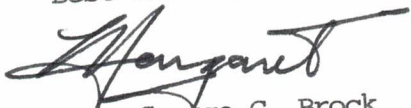
