Dear Joe:

I finally tracked down your note concerning the barriers around the White House. I share your deep concern about the appearance of the White House and want you to know what we are trying to do. Our need to increase security has not made us oblivious to aesthetics, but it has caused us to employ some less-than-ideal temporary measures.

When the Secret Service first informed us of the need for immediate additional security measures, many different alternatives were explored. Some were turned down because they would have detracted too much from the beauty and character of the White House. Others were turned down because they didn't satisfy the security requirements. The idea of the concrete tubs falls in the latter category. Apparently, these tubs shatter very easily and are not as effective as the Jersey barriers.

Although we have reluctantly agreed that the heightened level of security is a permanent necessity, we have not conceded that the Jersey barriers are our only alternative. We are still reviewing other options before installing more permanent security devices. We are determined to come up with a solution which will preserve the character and dignity of the White House.

Again, I apologize for the screw-up.

Whether Newsweek is accurate about your role, I have no idea. But I write you all the same, because anyone even remotely concerned with the White House, let alone anyone concerned with the stagecraft of the White House, ought to be deeply distressed by the appearance the White House now presents because of the new fortifications. I find myself ashamed, as a citizen, every time I pass this house that I have known and loved for going on sixty years.

I don't dispute the need for the fortifications, far from it. But there also is no reason on earth for them to take the hideous form they now take--- heavy concrete highway-dividers pressed into service where they ought not to be. I have given a good deal of thought to what can be substituted for the highway-dividers without any diminution of security.

The answer, surely, lies in the large concrete tubs the Park Service uses as planters. You can see some on the approaches to the Memorial Bridge if you drive around the Lincoln Memorial. When filled with earth, heavy concrete tubs like these will stop any truck; in fact, a row of them ought to stop a tank. They need not even be placed touching each other to produce maximum security results. They will still stop trucks or tanks if the rims are 5 or 6 inches apart, and this will have a more pleasing, less fortress-like effect.

I speak of a "pleasing effect" because my idea is to use these concrete tubs filled with earth for the double purpose of (a) security, above all, and (b) additional ornament. They can be seasonally planted by the Park Service, in fact, with flowers in the spring, summer and autumn, and with young evergreens in the winter.

If it is desired to arrange for this kind of heavy security on a permanent basis-- which is, alas, probably desirable-- then it will be cheaper to provide some sort of invisible irrigation for the tubs before they are installed, in order to reduce the cost of maintenance. But the Park Service must tell you about this. Meanwhile, any fool can tell you the White House will gain and its occupant will gain if flower tubs replace the present hideous and obvious fortifications-- by which both the President and his house lose heavily.

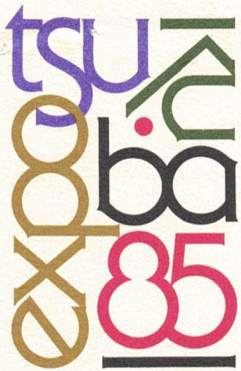
