I am writing a book about News, for Doubleday, to be published, God willing, in fall 1985. I write books for a living. You may have run into some: The Bankers or The Lawyers or The Schools or, years ago, Madison Avenue, USA. Most recently, a sequel to The Bankers called The Money Bazaars, a large study called The Diplomats, and the centennial history of the Metropolitan Opera. Sometimes I don't make a living, too, as when I served on the President's Commission on Housing in the first year of your Administration. . .

As part of the News book, I am doing a set-piece on the coverage of the elections. 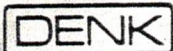

As you know, Youth for Understanding is a private, international student exchange organization which provides opportunities for teenagers from 25 countries to experience life as a member of a host family abroad. In the past 33 years, Youth for Understanding has enabled over 100,000 young people and the families that welcomed them to bridge cultural differences and language barriers in order to form lasting relationships. These life-transforming experiences came about largely through the efforts of volunteers dedicated to the ideal of world peace through international understanding. Everyone in the worldwide YFU community was deeply gratified when President Reagan announced formation of the President's International Youth Exchange Initiative. Thanks to the Initiative, much-needed attention has been focused on the great good routinely accomplished through youth exchange. 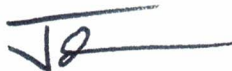

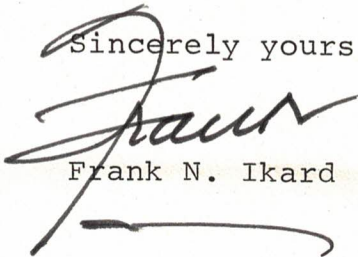

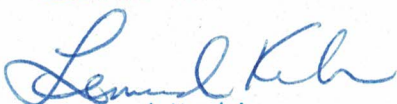
As a fabricator for building frames and bridges, I ask for your favorable consideration of the U.S. fabricated structural steel industry as you assist the President in making the critical decisions on import relief for the domestic steel industry. The fabricated structural steel industry is a separate industry from basic steel, but our interests are closely linked since we consume some 5,000,000 tons of basic steel per year and basic steel constitutes over half the cost of our products.

We support the need for relief for the basic steel industry but serious deficiencies exist in the relief recommendations by the U.S. International Trade Commission (ITC). The ITC remedy aggregated fabricated structural steel with basic steel structurals and proposed a minimum quantity of 2.1 million tons, a quota of 28.9% for 1-3 years and 31.8% for years 4-5. This relief would virtually destroy our industry. Import penetration of fabricated structural steel has averaged about 3% in recent years. Therefore, to guard against the almost certain destruction of our industry we ask for a separate quota for fabricated structural steel of 3% of domestic consumption of fabricated structural steel. And, our fabricated structural steel industry must be included in its entirety. By oversight the petitioners and the ITC have left out a critical tariff item (Item number 653.00). 653.00 must be included or any intended relief for us will be no relief at all.

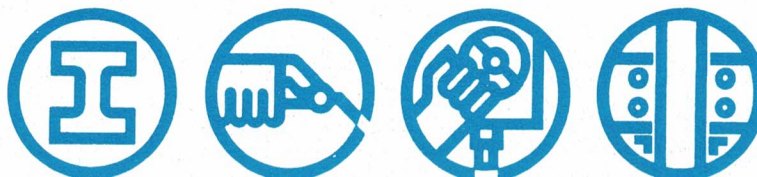
Please do your best for us. An improperly formulated relief quota could well be a disaster for the fabricated structural steel industry.
