Dear Mike,

As members of the Network Pool we are writing to strongly urge the White House to reconsider its position that the actual swearing-in of President Reagan to a second term will be completely private, excluding any television coverage.

Despite the national interest in the Inaugural Celebration ceremonies on the following day, the historical moment comes when the President utters the Constitutionally mandated words and is reinvested as President for another four years. That is a moment of great significance for all Americans, and it is a moment we would like to ask you to share with all Americans.

We acknowledge your interest in keeping the Monday events the centerpiece of the Inaugural activities but strongly believe that those activities are quite separate from the over-riding historical importance of the actual swearing-in. We believe the American public would particularly like to participate in that one, short ceremony -- the one ceremony of the weekend that is a keystone to our democracy.



The under-signed believe that television coverage of the actual swearing-in would not diminish coverage of Monday's celebration.

We look forward to hearing from you and would be willing to work with you on whatever technical arrangements would be appropriate.
